**CONNECTIONS:** Toronto's All-Star forward Chris Bosh hails from Dallas and played at Lincoln High School...Mavericks forward Shawn Marion played for the Raptors in 2009...Mavericks forward Kris Humphries played for the Raptors from 2006-2009...Mavericks guard Matt Carroll and Raptors forward Rasho Nesterovic played together in Charlotte from 2003-2004...Raptors forward Hedo Turkoglu was the final piece of the four-team trade that brought Shawn Marion to Dallas from Toronto.

**FYI:**

- Rodrigue Beaubois made the first start of his NBA career at NO (11/4)...the rookie scored Dallas' first 9 points and played 14 total minutes while adding 1 assist
- Dirk Nowitzki fouled out with 2:38 to play in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter at NO (11/4)...the game marked the 21<sup>st</sup> disqualification of his career (Mavs are 6-15 in those games)
- Dallas produced the following season-highs in the OT loss at NO (11/4): 107 points, 45.9% FG, 39 FGM and 11 3FGM
- Dallas leads the league with 38 total blocks and ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> at 7.6 blocks per game (IND: 7.8 bpg)
- Erick Dampier blocked a season-high 6 shots vs. UTA (11/3)...it was his 13<sup>th</sup> career game with 6+ blocks (most recently: 7 vs. CHI, 2/25/08)
- Dirk Nowitzki blocked a season-high 5 shots vs. UTA (11/3)...it was his 10<sup>th</sup> career game with 5+ blocks (most recently: 5 vs. LAL, 3/18/08)...the Mavs are 7-3 when he has 5 blocks
- Jason Kidd recorded 2 steals vs. UTA (11/3) and has multiple steals in 3 of 4 games

**30<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY:** The Dallas Mavericks celebrate their 30<sup>th</sup> season this year. In 29 seasons, the Mavericks have enjoyed 11 50-win seasons, 15 playoff appearances (nine consecutive), three Western Conference Finals berths and one trip to the NBA Finals.

**MAKING HISTORY:** Dirk Nowitzki made franchise history vs. UTA (11/3). He finished the game with 40 points (12-22 FGs, 1-3 3FGs, 15-16 FTs) for his 13<sup>th</sup> career 40-point outing (10-3 record). What was most impressive about Nowitzki's evening was that 29 of his 40 points came in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter. Entering the final period with 11 points, Nowitzki went on to rack up a franchise record for points in a quarter with 7-8 FGs, 1-2 3FGs and 14-14 FTs. The previous record stood for over 24 years. Mark Aguirre had 24 points in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter vs. DEN on 3/24/84. As a point of reference, the top four performances in a quarter are: 33 by George Gervin (2Q, SA @ NO, 4/9/78) and Carmelo Anthony (3Q, DEN vs. MIN, 12/10/08); 32 by David Thompson (1Q, DEN @ DET, 4/9/78); 31 by Wilt Chamberlin (4Q, PHI vs. NY, 3/2/62).

**CRASHING THE BOARDS:** Erick Dampier ranks T-10<sup>th</sup> (10.4 rpg) in rebounds and 1<sup>st</sup> (2.8 bpg) in blocks among NBA leaders. He has come down with at least 10 rebounds in 4 straight games. At NO (11/4), Dampier grabbed a season-high 14 rebounds (season-high 7 OR). The game was his 28<sup>th</sup> 14-rebound performance since joining the Mavs in 2004-05. Dallas is 19-9 when he has 14+ rebounds. Dampier had 6 games with 14+ a season ago.

**JET TAKING OFF:** Jason Terry's shooting woes through the first 4 games became a thing of the past at NO (11/4). In the NO game, Terry exploded for a team-high 35 points (12-18 FGs, 4-8 3FGs, 7-10 FTs) while outscoring the entire NO bench 35-31 and recording his first 20+ point game off the bench. Through the first 4 games, Terry had averaged just 13.5 points on 34.0% (18-53 FGs, 5-18 3FGs) shooting from the field. Terry, the NBA's reigning Sixth Man, averaged 19.6 points and single-handedly outscored the opposing bench 26 times (18-8 record) in 2008-09. In addition, last year, Terry came off the bench to score 20+ points an NBA-best 33 times (in 63 games as a sub).

**MOVING UP THE RANKS:** Jason Terry now has 6,519 points as a Maverick and has moved into 8<sup>th</sup> place all-time among Mavs. If JET sustains his 17.8 points per game pass, look for him to overtake Sam Perkins (6,766) for 7<sup>th</sup> place by early December.

**FT SAVVY:** Dirk Nowitzki made his final 15 free throw attempts of the game vs. UTA (11/3) from the 8:32 mark of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter to the end of the game. His 14-14 performance in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter marked three franchise records:

14: Most FTM in a period (was 12 by Mark Aguirre vs. GS, 2Q, 12-12, 2/21/87)

14: Most FTA in a period (was 13, twice)

1.000 FT% - Most made without a miss (was 12-12, 2 times, recently by Howard 3Q vs. LAC, 3/25/08)

Vince Carter holds the record for most FTM in a quarter (16-16, NJ @ MIA, 12/23/05).

**SNAP THAT STREAK:** Dallas came up with a win over UTA (11/3) despite shooting 39.5% (34-86 FGs) from the floor. Into the game, Dallas had lost 22 straight games when shooting 39.9% FG or less (0-2 to end 2006-07, 0-9 in 2007-08, 0-10 in 2008-09, 0-1 in 2009-10). The Mavs previously won on 38.5% (30-78 FGs) from the floor vs. NY (3/30/07).

**FT DOMINANCE:** In 5 games, Dallas is averaging 27.2 free throw attempts per game (.816, 111-136 FTs) while allowing their opponents just 18.6 attempts per game...Dallas has outscored the opposition 111-70 at the line (+8.2 FTM per game)

**TOE THE LINE:** The Mavericks, perennially one of the NBA's best free throw shooting clubs, is shooting 83.0% (93-112 FTs) from the line. Since the 2000-01 season (first of 9 consecutive 50-win seasons), the Mavericks have shot an NBA-best 80.3% from the line, have led the league in FT shooting in 4 of those seasons (2001-02, 2002-03, 2003-04, 2007-08) and have finished in at least the top 6 each year. In that span, Dirk Nowitzki has shot 87.7% FT (7<sup>th</sup> in NBA) and has hit 4,403 FTs (4<sup>th</sup>).

**IRON ERICK:** Erick Dampier recorded his second double-double of the season with 16 points and 14 rebounds in 34 minutes at NO (11/4). When Damp scores 10+ points, odds usually favor the Mavs. Since his arrival in Dallas (2004-05 season), Dampier has recorded 45 double-doubles (34-11 record, .756). When the center scores 10+ points, Dallas is 69-19 (.784). Over the past 4 seasons, Dampier has missed 8 regular season games.

**20 IN A ROW:** Dirk Nowitzki scored at least 20 points in each of the last 29 games between vs. OKC (2/27/09) and vs. UTA (11/3/09). He began the 2009-10 campaign with 4 20+ point games before scoring 12 at NO (11/4). The 29-game streak with 20 points was the second-longest of his career. Below is a list of Nowitzki's other career hot streaks.

**CLOSING IN ON SECOND:** Jason Kidd now ranks 3<sup>rd</sup> all-time among the NBA's career assist leaders (10,242 assists). With 20 assists vs. PHO (4/5/09), he passed Magic Johnson (10,141) for 3<sup>rd</sup> position. Kidd now trails John Stockton (15,806) and Mark Jackson (10,334). If Kidd continues to average around 8.6 assists, he will move into 2<sup>nd</sup> place around Thanksgiving.

**STOLE THE SHOW:** With 2,206 steals, Jason Kidd now ranks 7<sup>th</sup> on the NBA's all-time steals list. With 4 steals vs. OKC (2/27/09), he moved into 7<sup>th</sup> place, surpassing Hakeem Olajuwon (2,162). Kidd needs 2 steals to take 6<sup>th</sup> place from Clyde Drexler (2,207).

**TOP 10 LIST:** Jason Kidd hit 3 3-pointers vs. SA (12/9/08) to move into 9<sup>th</sup> place all-time on the NBA's 3-point field goals made list with 1,391 (surpassing Antoine Walker, 1,386 3FGs). For his career, he has 1,495 3-pointers. He can be found on several other NBA Top 10 lists (3<sup>rd</sup> at 10,242 career assists, 6<sup>th</sup> at 9.2 apg; 3<sup>rd</sup> with 103 triple-doubles; 7<sup>th</sup> with 2,206 steals).

**18 KARAT:** Dirk Nowitzki leading the Mavericks in scoring and ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in rebounding to start the 2009-10 season. With his 39 points vs. UTA (1/17/09), Dirk Nowitzki crossed the 18,000-point threshold for his career (19,191 total points). He joins 55 other players to reach the mark and now ranks 43<sup>rd</sup> all-time among NBA scorers. Nowitzki ranks 7<sup>th</sup> among active players in all-time scoring behind Shaquille O'Neal, Allen Iverson, Kobe Bryant, Kevin Garnett, Ray Allen and Tim Duncan. Paul Pierce also crossed the 18,000 point mark last season.

**BACK-TO-BACK IT UP:** Dallas finished the second of 20 back-to-backs at NO (11/4)). The Mavericks have 4 more back-to-backs than a season ago. Seven begin on the road and conclude at home, seven are on the road and six are home-away. Twelve of Dallas' back-to-backs occur in the first half of the season. Dallas is 2-0 in the first game of a back-to-back and 1-1 in the second game.

**HOW THE MAVS WERE BUILT:** Of the 15 players currently on the roster, 11 are former first round draft picks (Erick Dampier, Drew Gooden, Josh Howard, Kris Humphries, Jason Kidd, Shawn Marion, Dirk Nowitzki, Jason Terry, Tim Thomas, Shawne Williams, Rodrigue Beaubois). Seven were top 10 picks (Dampier, Gooden, Kidd, Marion, Nowitzki, Terry, Thomas). Kidd holds the honor of being the highest drafted Maverick (second overall by Dallas in 1994). Four Mavericks were undrafted (J.J. Barea, Matt Carroll, Quinton Ross, James Singleton).

**EVERYTHING IS BIGGER IN TEXAS:** On 10/30/08, Dallas was awarded the 2010 NBA All-Star Game (Feb. 14, 2010). In a joint venture between Mavericks owner Mark Cuban and Dallas Cowboys owner Jerry Jones, and following the mantra that "everything is bigger in Texas," the All-Star Game will be played at the new Dallas Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, which will have a seating capacity of over 80,000 fans. This collaboration between the NBA, and the ownership groups of the Mavericks and Cowboys, will afford Mavericks season ticket holders a chance to partake in the NBA All-Star Game. The T-Mobile Rookie Challenge and NBA All-Star Saturday Night will take place at American Airlines Center. Dallas last hosted All-Star festivities in 1986.

**ELITE COMPANY:** The Mavericks are just the fourth franchise (five times total) since the NBA went to an 82-game schedule in 1967 to have at least nine consecutive 50-win seasons. Here is a run down of the teams to accomplish this feat:

1. Los Angeles Lakers 12 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1990-91)
2. Boston Celtics 10 consecutive seasons (from 1958-59 to 1967-68)  
San Antonio Spurs 10 consecutive seasons (from 1999-00 to 2008-09)
3. Boston Celtics 9 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1987-88)  
Dallas Mavericks 8 consecutive seasons (from 2000-01 to 2008-09)

**JUST THE TWO OF US:** The Mavericks and Spurs are the only two teams to have won 50+ games in each of the past nine seasons. Here's a look at the records of the Mavericks and Spurs over the past nine seasons:

**20,000 MANIAACS:** The Mavericks have sold out 318 consecutive home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The listed capacity for AAC is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. The streak started on 12/15/01. Dallas has sold out an additional 44 playoff games during that same stretch. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a home mark of 263-63 (.807). Dallas has sold out all 41 games in each of the past seven seasons.

## HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

**Regular Season Coaching Record: 334-244 (.578); Playoff Coaching Record: 35-37 (.486)**

Rick Carlisle became the ninth coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Most recently, Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season.

In seven seasons as a head coach, Carlisle has led his team to the postseason on six occasions.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61.0% of their games (100-64) to go with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in franchise history and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons. Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
