SERIES NOTES: The Clippers snapped a 10-game losing streak against the Mavericks in the regular season with a 91-89 win in Los Angeles on 1/18/12...It was their first victory over the Mavericks since 11/9/08...After Jason Terry put the Mavericks ahead 89-88 with a 3-pointer with 5 seconds to go in the game, the Clippers' Chauncey Billups hit a 3 with 1.0 second remaining that proved to be the game winner...Dirk Nowitzki (17), Delonte West (17), Ian Mahinmi (13), Shawn Marion (12) and Jason Terry (12) all scored 12-plus points for the Mavericks in the loss...Jason Kidd dished out a game-high 10 assists and Marion pulled down a team-high 10 boards to go along with his 12 points...Despite the loss, Dallas has still won 16 of the last 18 regular-season meetings with Los Angeles...The Mavericks have won 27 of the last 32 matchups with the Clippers at home, including the last nine...The Clippers have not defeated the Mavericks in Dallas since 4/19/06...Mavericks Head Coach Rick Carlisle is 17-7 (.708) all-time against the Clippers in the regular season...Dirk Nowitzki averaged 20.0 ppg, 6.5 rpg, 2.8 apg and 33.8 mpg in four meetings with the Clippers last season...Jason Terry averaged 12.3 ppg, 4.0 apg, 1.3 spg and 27.3 mpg against the Clippers in 2010-11...Shawn Marion averaged 11.3 ppg, 7.8 rpg, 2.3 apg and 28.8 mpg in four games against Los Angeles last year...Jason Kidd averaged 6.3 ppg, 3.7 rpg, 8.0 apg, 1.7 spg and 31.3 mpg in three games against the Clippers last season.

CONNECTIONS: Mavericks forward Lamar Odom was drafted by the Clippers in the first round (fourth overall pick) of the 1999 NBA Draft and played four seasons for the Clippers from 1999-2003...Odom and Clippers forward Caron Butler were teammates in Miami in 2003-04 and were traded together (along with Brian Grant, a first-round draft choice and a second-round draft pick) to the Lakers for Shaquille O'Neal on 7/14/04...Butler was traded by Washington along with Brendan Haywood, DeShawn Stevenson and cash considerations to Dallas in exchange for Josh Howard, Drew Gooden, Quinton Ross and James Singleton on 2/13/10...He averaged 15.1 points in 56 games (56 starts) for the Mavericks, before signing with the Clippers this past offseason...Clippers forward Kenyon Martin hails from Dallas and makes his offseason home in Arlington, Texas...Martin and Mavericks guard point guard Jason Kidd were teammates in New Jersey from 2001-04 and advanced to the NBA Finals together in 2002 and 2003...Mavericks guard Delonte West and Clippers guard Mo Williams played two seasons together in Cleveland from 2008-10...Mavericks assistant coach Tony Brown came to Dallas after serving as an assistant coach with the Clippers in 2010-11...Clippers assistant coach Robert Pack played four seasons for Dallas from 1996-2000...Clippers player development coach Howard Easley also played for the Mavericks during the 2000-01 season.

PLAYER NOTES: Dirk Nowitzki and Delonte West led the way for Dallas with 17 points apiece. West scored all 17 of his points in the opening half. Shawn Marion posted his first double-double of the season with 12 points (6-12 FGs) and a team-high 10 rebounds. Ian Mahinmi (13) and Jason Terry (12) both scored in double figures off the Mavericks' bench. Mo Williams (game-high 26) and Chauncey Billups (21) both notched 20-plus points for the Clippers in the win. Blake Griffin registered a double-double with 14 points (6-15 FGs, 2-8 FTs), a game-high 17 rebounds and a team-high seven assists for Los Angeles.

NOTABLES: The Clippers shot 20-of-41 (.488) from the floor in the first half, while the Mavericks went 20-of-48 (.417)...Los Angeles led, 52-51, at intermission...Dallas trailed by nine (66-57) in the third, but used a 10-2 spurt (from the 5:15 mark of the third period through the 1:36 mark of the quarter) to cut the deficit to one (68-67)...The score was tied at 71 after three...The Mavericks were down by five (88-83) with less than 1:30 to go in the game, but scored the next six points to go up by one (89-88)...Jason Terry put the Mavericks ahead (89-88) with a 3-pointer at the 5-second mark of the fourth quarter (it was the second straight game that Terry either gave Dallas the lead or tied the game with a shot in the final 10 seconds of regulation)...But on the ensuing possession, the Clippers' Chauncey Billups hit a 3-pointer with 1.0 second remaining that proved to be the game winner...The game saw 10 ties and 16 lead changes.

SERIES NOTES: The Mavericks snapped a four-game losing streak against the Nuggets with a 105-95 win in Denver on 2/8/12... The Nuggets had won seven of the previous 10 meetings at home... Despite the loss on 2/8/12, Denver has still taken 12 of the last 17 regular-season meetings with Dallas... The Mavericks have gone 22-8 in the last 30 matchups with the Nuggets at home, but Denver has taken six of the last eight at American Airlines Center (including a 115-93 decision at AAC on 12/26/11)... Dirk Nowitzki has averaged team-highs in points (22.5), rebounds (6.5) and minutes (30.5) against Denver this season... Vince Carter has averaged 14.0 ppg, 3.0 rpg, 5.5 apg, 1.5 spg, 1.0 bpg and 24.5 mpg in two games (one start) against the Nuggets in 2011-12... Rodrigue Beaubois has averaged 11.5 ppg and 17.0 mpg versus Denver this season... The Nuggets have gotten to the line 61 times in the two games against the Mavericks this season (47-61, .770), while Dallas has attempted just 36 free throws (29-36, .806)... Both teams have had at least five players in double figures in each of the first two meetings in 2011-12... The Nuggets took a 20-18 lead in the first quarter in the first meeting in Dallas on 12/26/11 and never trailed again in the game, winning by a final score of 115-93... Dallas evened the series with a 105-95 win in Denver on 2/8/12... The Mavericks took a 7-5 advantage in the first period and led for the duration of the game... After losing the first meeting at home last season on 11/3/10, the Nuggets won three straight to take the 2010-11 season series, 3-1... The Mavericks' bench outscored the Nuggets' bench, 72-12, in the 121-120 loss to Denver on 2/10/11... The 72 bench points were the most by Dallas since 4/13/95 (70 at Seattle)... It was also the most points recorded by any team's bench in the NBA in 2010-11 (Denver scored 70 points off the bench vs. Phoenix on 11/28/10).

CONNECTIONS: Nuggets forward Corey Brewer played in 13 regular-season games for Dallas last season and was a member of the Mavericks' 2011 Championship Team... Brewer and Nuggets guard Rudy Fernandez were traded by Dallas to Denver for a 2016 second-round draft pick on 12/13/11... Fernandez was actually acquired by Dallas (along with the rights to guard Petteri Koponen) in a three-team deal involving Denver and Portland on 7/23/11... The Nuggets received guard Andre Miller from Portland and the draft rights to forward Jordan Hamilton (26th overall pick) from Dallas... Portland received guard Raymond Felton from Denver and the draft rights to forward Tanguy Ngombo (57th overall selection) from Dallas... Nuggets guard Ty Lawson and Mavericks forward Brandon Wright were freshmen on North Carolina's 2006-07 ACC Championship Team... Mavericks assistant coach Terry Stotts got his coaching start under George Karl as an assistant with the Albany Patroons of the CBA in 1990-91... He went on to be an assistant under Karl in both Seattle and Milwaukee... Nuggets forward Chris Andersen (Blinn Junior College), forward Jordan Hamilton (University of Texas) and guard Julyan Stone (Texas El-Paso) all played their college ball in the state of Texas... Nuggets team physician Dr. Steve Traina and Mavericks Head Athletic Trainer Casey Smith worked on the same medical staff for the 2010 USA Basketball Men's World Championship Team.

PLAYER NOTES: Shawn Marion posted his fourth double-double of the season with 14 points and a game-high-tying 12 rebounds for Dallas in the win. Dirk Nowitzki scored a team-high 20 points to go along with nine boards. Jason Terry (19), Delonte West (10) and Lamar Odom (10) all scored in double-digits off the Mavericks' bench.

LaMarcus Aldridge (game-high 33 points and a game-high-tying 12 rebounds) and Gerald Wallace (10 points and 10 rebounds) both registered double-doubles for Portland in the loss.

NOTABLES: The Mavericks broke open an 18-point lead (34-16) with less than 3 minutes gone by in the second period... The Mavericks were up by 13 (59-46) with 4:27 to play in the third period, but the Blazers closed the quarter on a 9-2 run and cut the deficit to six (61-55) going into the fourth... Portland used a 12-3 spurt (from the 7:31 mark of the fourth quarter through the 4:57 mark of the fourth) to tie the game at 71... Dallas led by two (81-79) late in the fourth, but LaMarcus Aldridge forced overtime with a turnaround fadeaway jumper with 12.0 seconds remaining... Dirk Nowitzki missed a fadeaway at the buzzer that could have won the game for Dallas in regulation... Aldridge also forced double-overtime with a jump hook with 23.9 seconds remaining in the first overtime period... Nowitzki had an opportunity to win the game for Dallas in overtime as well, but could not connect on a baseline jumper... Nowitzki put the Mavericks ahead by four (97-93) in double-overtime however, with a 15-foot fadeaway with 16.9 seconds left on the clock... The Blazers took their first lead (83-81) 36 seconds into the start of the first overtime period... The Mavericks committed 23 turnovers (for 23 points) in the win... The Blazers recorded 15 giveaways (for 13 points).

PLAYER NOTES: Dirk Nowitzki scored a game-high 33 points (11-19 FGs, 4-7 3FGs, 7-10 FTs) to go along with four rebounds, three assists and three blocks in 35 minutes. Jason Terry contributed 16 points in 33 minutes off the Mavericks' bench. Jason Kidd returned to the starting lineup after missing six games with a strained right calf.

He tallied eight points, five rebounds, a game-high 10 assists and two steals in 27 minutes, but did commit a game-high eight turnovers. Kevin Love posted a team-high 32 points (9-18 FGs, 14-14 FTs) and a game-high 12 rebounds for Minnesota in the loss.

NOTABLES: Nikola Pekovic recorded a dunk on Minnesota's first possession, but the 2-0 advantage would mark the Timberwolves' only lead of the night... The Mavericks began the game on a 20-6 run and led by 13 (29-16) after one... Dallas outshot Minnesota 47.7 percent (21-of-44) to 38.5 percent (15-of-39) from the field in the first half and led, 56-45, at the break... The Mavericks were up by 17 (73-56), but the Timberwolves used a 19-5 run (from the 3:10 mark of the third quarter through the 10:35 mark of the fourth period) to cut the deficit to just three (78-75)... But Dallas responded with a 14-4 spurt to push its lead back up to 13 (92-79) and went on to win by a final score of 104-97... The Timberwolves turned it over 28 times for 30 Dallas points, while the Mavericks committed 18 turnovers for only 10 Minnesota points... Minnesota outshot Dallas 27-of-31 (.871) to 17-of-23 (.739) at the line and outrebounded the Mavericks, 47-38.

- The Blazers took their first lead (83-81) 36 seconds into the start of the first overtime period in the game against the Mavericks on 2/11. Portland went up by four, 85-81 (largest lead), 1:18 into overtime. It marked the largest deficit the Mavericks have faced in their last three games (Minnesota's largest lead was 2 in the game on 2/10 and Denver's biggest lead was 1 in the game on 2/8). Portland led a total of 3:16 before falling to Dallas, 97-94, in double-overtime. The Mavericks trailed a total of 2:01 in their previous two games at Minnesota (trailed 2-0 for 50 seconds) and at Denver (trailed 3-2 for 21 seconds).
- Dallas won a 97-94 decision in double-overtime against Portland on 2/11. The Mavericks improved to 2-0 in overtime games this season (defeated San Antonio 101-100 in overtime on 1/29) and have now played in eight games decided by three points or less this season (4-4 record), which is the most by any team in the NBA. Dallas played in its first double-overtime game since 12/9/08 (lost to San Antonio 133-126). Prior to the game against Portland on 2/11, the last time the Mavericks won a double-overtime game was 11/1/05 (won at Phoenix 111-108).
- The Mavericks swept their fourth back-to-back this season with victories at Minnesota (2/10) and vs. Portland (2/11). Dallas improved to 7-3 in games on the second night of back-to-back with the win over the Blazers.
- After closing out the month of January with three consecutive wins, Dallas dropped three straight to begin the month of February. But the Mavericks have won three in a row since ending the three-game losing skid. Dallas seeks its fourth consecutive victory with a win over the L.A. Clippers on 2/13. The Mavericks have won four consecutive games just one time this season (won five straight from 1/7 vs. New Orleans to 1/14 vs. Sacramento).
- Dirk Nowitzki (20), Jason Terry (19), Shawn Marion (14), Delonte West (10) and Lamar Odom (10) all scored in double figures for Dallas in the win over Portland on 2/11. The Mavericks are now 10-3 when they have at least five players in double digits.
- Dallas shot 46.4 percent (39-of-84) in the double-overtime win over Portland on 2/11. The Mavericks are now 9-1 when they shoot at least 45 percent from the field in a game this season.
- The Mavericks handed out 25 assists at Minnesota on 2/10, after they recorded 30 the previous game at Denver (2/8). It marked the first time this season that Dallas has recorded 25-plus assists in back-to-back games. The Mavericks are 6-1 when they record at least 25 assists in a game this year.
- Dallas recorded a season-high 16 steals at Minnesota on 2/10. It marked just the 11th time since 1986-87 that the Mavericks have tallied at least 16 steals in a game, and the first time they have done so since 4/8/09 (16 vs. Utah).
- Dallas scored a season-high 33 first-quarter points at Denver on 2/8 (was 32) and improved to 6-0 when scoring 30-plus points in the first period. The Mavericks had 64 points at the half, marking their second-highest scoring half of the season (high is 66 in first half at Phoenix 1/30).
- Eight different players have led Dallas in scoring this season. Eight Mavericks have also scored 19-plus points in a game this year.

INDIVIDUAL STATS

- **Shawn Marion** posted his fourth double-double of the season (396th career) with 14 points (6-15 FGs) and a season-high-tying 12 rebounds in 40 minutes vs. Portland on 2/11. The Mavericks are 11-1 when Marion scores 13-plus points in a game this season.
- **Brendan Haywood** pulled down 10 rebounds to go along with seven points and two blocks in a season-high 38 minutes vs. Portland (2/11). The Mavericks improved to 5-1 this season when Haywood grabs 10-plus rebounds.
- **Lamar Odom** registered his seventh double-figure scoring game of the season with 10 points (4-5 FGs, 2-2 3FGs) and five rebounds vs. Portland (2/11). Dallas is 6-1 when he scores in double figures.
- **Dirk Nowitzki** netted a season-high 33 points (11-19 FGs, 4-7 3FGs, 7-10 FTs) in 35 minutes at Minnesota on 2/10. It was the second time this season (217th time in his career) and the second time in the last four games that Nowitzki scored 30-plus points in a game (30 vs. Indiana on 2/3).
- **Jason Kidd** dished out a game-high 10 assists in the win over Minnesota on 2/10. It was the third time this season that he's dropped at least 10 dimes in a game (2-1 record) and the 566th time he's done so in his NBA career.
- **Brandan Wright** recorded 10 points (5-8 FGs) in 16 minutes off the bench at Denver on 2/8. It marked his third double-figure scoring effort in his last four games (11 points at Cleveland 2/4; season-high 12 points vs. Oklahoma City 2/1), after he went his first 11 games of the season without a double-digit scoring game.
- **Vince Carter** tallied 17 points (7-12 FGs, 3-7 3FGs) to go along with five rebounds, a season-high eight assists, two steals and one block in 29 minutes at Denver on 2/8. The Mavericks are 11-2 when Carter scores in double figures and 5-0 when he scores 16-plus points in a game.
- **Jason Terry** appeared in his 583rd game in a Dallas uniform at Minnesota (2/10), which moved him past Shawn Bradley (582) and into sixth place on the Mavericks' all-time list for games played. Terry enters the game against the Clippers (2/13) having played in 987 regular-season games and needs 13 to reach 1,000 for his career. He passed "Pistol Pete" Maravich (15,948) for 93rd place on the NBA's all-time scoring list vs. Portland (2/11) and now has 15,956 career points. He needs 25 points to pass Kiki Vandeweghe (15,980) and 51 points to pass former Maverick Derek Harper (16,006).
- **Delonte West** scored a season-high 25 points (9-12 FGs, 5-6 3FGs, 2-2 FTs) in 28 minutes at Phoenix on 1/30 (previous high 17 at L.A. Clippers 1/18). He added six assists and two steals in 28 minutes off the bench. West tied a career high with five 3-pointers in the game (made five 3s on three other occasions). It was the first time he's made five treys in a game since 2/22/09 (Cleveland vs. Detroit). He made his first five 3-point attempts against the Suns and finished 5-of-6 from deep in the game. West scored 25 in a game for the eighth time in his NBA career and the first time since 3/6/10 (27, Cleveland at Milwaukee).
- **Vince Carter** moved past George "The Iceman" Gervin (20,708) and into 34th place on the NBA's all-time scoring list with his first made basket against Oklahoma City on 2/1. Carter currently has 20,769 career points and needs 22 points to pass "The Admiral" David Robinson (20,790) for 33rd place on the all-time list.
- **Jason Terry** recorded a season-high 34 points (14-23 FGs, 1-3 3FGs, 5-5 FTs) against the Spurs on 1/29 (previous high 23 vs. Miami on 12/25). He hit a jumper with 0.5 seconds remaining that tied the game at 91 and forced overtime. Terry also scored Dallas' final four points in overtime to lift the Mavericks to a 101-100 victory. Deron Williams is the only other player to score the final points of regulation and the game-winner in the final minute of overtime this season (New Jersey at Philadelphia 1/25/12).
- **Rodrigue Beaubois** made his first start of the season (43rd career) vs. Utah on 1/27. He scored a season-high 22 points (9-15 FGs, 3-5 3FGs, 1-1 FTs) (previous high 17 at Utah on 1/19/12) to go along with a season-high-tying six rebounds, a career-high seven assists and a career-high four blocks in 36 minutes. Beaubois became one of only two guards (also Dwyane Wade vs. Boston 12/27/11) to record four blocks in a game this season. Since 1986-87, Michael Finley (vs. Portland 2/28/04), Jason Kidd (at Phoenix 4/6/08) and Derek Harper (vs. Utah 4/17/90) are the only other Maverick guards to block four shots in a game.
- **Shawn Marion** dropped a season-high 29 points (11-21 FGs, 4-6 3FGs, 3-5 FTs) against Phoenix on 1/23 (previous high 22 at Utah 1/19). It tied his Maverick-high (29 at Minnesota 3/8/10). Marion, who made a total of eight 3-pointers (8-52 3FGs) his first two seasons with Dallas (2009-11), went 4-of-6 from beyond the arc against the Suns. It was the first time he's made four triples in a game since 1/18/08. His career high for 3-pointers made in a game is five (on six occasions).
- **Ian Mahinmi** recorded 17 points and nine rebounds in 29 minutes vs. Phoenix on 1/23. He tied his second-highest career scoring output (also had 17 at Memphis 1/15/11). Dallas is 5-1 when Mahinmi scores 10-plus points in a game this season. He had four double-figure scoring efforts all of last year.

NOWITZKI CLOSING IN ON 1,000 CLUB: Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki currently has 998 career blocks and needs two to reach 1,000 for his career. Nowitzki, who has made 1,213 three-pointers in his career, will become one of only three players in NBA history with at least 1,000 three-pointers and 1,000 blocks, joining Clifford Robinson (1,253 threes and 1,390 blocks) and Rasheed Wallace (1,064 threes and 1,445 blocks). Nowitzki became the only player in NBA history to record at least 150 three-pointers and 100 blocks in a single season in 2000-01 (151 threes, 101 blocks). He was also just the second player in NBA history to record 100-plus threes and 100-plus blocks in one season (Robert Horry had 143 threes and 109 blocks with Houston in 1995-96). Nowitzki ranks second on Dallas' all-time blocks list behind Shawn Bradley (1,250). He will look to become the 80th player in NBA history with 1,000 career rejections. His teammate, Brendan Haywood, recorded his 1,000th career block at Minnesota on 1/1/12.

BENCH PRODUCTION: The Mavericks are averaging a league-best 43.9 bench points per game this season, slightly below what their starters are averaging (50.8 ppg). Jason Terry has led the Mavericks in scoring eight times as a reserve (including ties). Dallas led the NBA in bench scoring in 2010-11 with 40.4 points per game off the pine.

DIRK TO MAKE 11TH CONSECUTIVE ALL-STAR APPEARANCE: For the 11th consecutive season, Dirk Nowitzki will represent the Western Conference at the 2012 All-Star Game held in Orlando, Fla. His 11 All-Star appearances are the most by any player in franchise history. Nowitzki, who will appear as a Western Conference reserve, holds averages of 10.1 points, 4.1 rebounds and 18.8 minutes in 10 career All-Star games (two starts). He posted a career-high 22 points (8-15 FGs, 6-6 FTs) in the 2010 All-Star Game held in Dallas. The 2012 NBA All-Star Game will be played at Amway Center in Orlando on Sunday, Feb. 26, 2012. It will air live at 7 p.m. ET on TNT and ESPN Radio and will reach fans in more than 200 countries and territories in more than 40 languages.

DIRK REACHES 23K, CLOSING IN ON 20TH ALL-TIME: Dirk Nowitzki scored his 23,000th career point against Milwaukee on 1/13/12 with his first free throw at the 7:17 mark of the second quarter. He became the 23rd player in NBA history (third active player) to achieve the milestone. He moved past Elgin Baylor (23,149) and into 22nd place on the NBA's all-time scoring list at Cleveland (2/4/12) with a 17-foot fadeaway at the 7:37 mark of the fourth quarter. In his next game at Denver on 2/8/12, he scored a game-high 25 points and passed Adrian Dantley (23,177) for 21st place on the NBA's all-time scoring list with a jumper at the 1:36 mark of the 4th quarter. Nowitzki currently has 23,232 career points and needs 103 to pass Robert Parish (23,334) for 20th place on the NBA's all-time scoring list. Nowitzki passed Hal Greer (21,586), Larry Bird (21,791), Gary Payton (21,813) and Clyde Drexler (22,195) on the all-time scoring list in 2010-11. He ranks third among active players in career scoring, trailing only Kobe Bryant and Kevin Garnett. Only three other players born outside of the United States have more career points than the 7-footer from Germany: Hakeem Olajuwon (26,946, born in Nigeria), Dominique Wilkins (26,668, born in France) and Patrick Ewing (24,815, born in Jamaica). Nowitzki reached the 20,000-point mark during the 2009-10 season, becoming the first European-born player to achieve the milestone.

GETTING IT TOGETHER: Since opening the season 1-4, Dallas has locked down on the defensive end. The Mavericks are shooting the ball better as well. Despite losing to the Lakers (1/16) and the Clippers (1/18) on 3-pointers in the final seconds, the Mavericks are still 16-7 over their last 23 games. The Mavericks are 10-1 this season when they hold the opposition to under 90 points. Below is a look at how the Mavericks' stats from their first five games of the season compare to their stats from their most recent 23 games:

KIDD PULLING CLOSER TO MJ ON STEALS LIST: At 38 years old, Mavericks point guard Jason Kidd is still averaging 1.6 steals per game this season. He recorded a season-high six steals in his return to the starting lineup against Sacramento (1/14/12), after missing four games with a sore lower back (1/7/12-1/13/12). Kidd, who has been named to the NBA All-Defensive First Team four times (1999, 2001, 2002, 2006) and NBA All-Defensive Second Team five times (2000, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2007), recorded two steals at the L.A. Lakers on 1/16/12, giving him 2,500 for his career. He currently has 2,505 career steals and needs just 10 more to pass Michael Jordan (2,514) for second place on the NBA's all-time steals list. John Stockton is the NBA's all-time steals leader with 3,265 career thefts.

GROUP EFFORT: With the departure of Tyson Chandler for New York this past offseason, the Mavericks' big men have all stepped into larger roles for Dallas this season. Brendan Haywood, Ian Mahinmi and Brandan Wright have all split time at the center position for Dallas and are forming a three-headed monster in the middle. Haywood has started all 27 games in which he has appeared this year (after he started just eight games for Dallas last season) and is averaging 6.7 rpg and 1.2 bpg. He has posted three double-figure scoring games and six double-digit rebounding efforts this season. Mahinmi is averaging career highs in points (7.0), rebounds (5.0) and minutes (19.4) as a backup center. He has scored in double figures six times this year, after he did so four times all of last season. The high flyer Brandan Wright, who was signed as a free agent by Dallas in the offseason, has made the most of his minutes at backup center. He is averaging 5.5 points, 2.3 rebounds and 1.1 blocks in just 11.0 minutes per game this season. Wright has scored in double figures three times in 17 appearances this year.

15 STRAIGHT GAMES HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 100: The Mavericks held their opponents to under 100 points for 15 straight games from 12/30/11-1/23/12, which set a franchise record for consecutive games holding teams under the century mark (was 13, 1/14/06-2/9/06). Opponents averaged just 84.3 points per game on 39.8 percent shooting against the Mavericks in those 15 games, and Dallas went 11-4 in that span. The Mavericks held their opponents to under 80 points in three straight games during that stretch from 1/13-1/16/12. The Timberwolves ended the Mavericks' run when they defeated Dallas, 105-90, at American Airlines Center on 1/25/12. Minnesota was also the only team to score over 93 points against the Mavericks during their 15-game run (defeated Dallas, 99-82, at Minnesota on 1/1/12).

DOMINANT DEFENSIVE PERFORMANCE: Dallas' defense shut down the Kings in the game at American Airlines Center on 1/14/12. The Mavericks held the Kings to just 60 points on 22-of-86 (.256) shooting, setting new franchise opponent lows for points (was 65 at Minnesota 2/27/07), field goals made (was 23 at Indiana, 23-67, 12/6/05) and field goal percentage (was .296, 24-81, at Minnesota 2/27/07). The Mavericks held the Kings to just 23 points in the first half (Dallas led, 52-23, at the break). It marked an all-time low for points in a half by a Dallas opponent. The previous franchise opponent low for points in a half was 24 by Vancouver (at Dallas 3/13/99, in the first half). The 23 points recorded by the Kings in the opening 24 minutes also represented an all-time Sacramento franchise low for points in a half (was 25 vs. Boston 2/26/57).

HOW SWEEP IT IS! When the Mavericks faced the Kings at home on 1/14/12, it marked the 111th time in franchise history that Dallas played four games in five nights. With wins at Detroit (1/10), at Boston (1/11), vs. Milwaukee (1/13) and vs. Sacramento (1/14), the Mavericks completed a four-game sweep in five nights for just the fourth time in team history (also 2/19/85-2/23/85, 11/17/06-11/21/06 and 11/23/10-11/27/10). The Mavericks recorded the sweep last season with wins against Detroit (11/23/10), at Oklahoma City (11/24/10), at San Antonio (11/26/10) and against Miami (11/27/10).

JET SEVENTH PLACE ALL-TIME ON TRIPLES LIST: Jason Terry went 2-for-4 from beyond the arc against Sacramento on 1/14. He took sole possession of seventh place on the all-time 3-point field goals made list with his first three of the game (1,681st career) at the 1:26 mark of the second quarter. Terry, who passed Washington's Rashard Lewis for seventh place all-time, is closing in on former Maverick Dale Ellis (1,719) for sixth place on the all-time list. Terry currently has **1,708** career 3-pointers and needs **12** to pass Ellis.

ANOTHER SHOOTING CLINIC FOR NOWITZKI: Dirk Nowitzki went 9-of-10 (.900) from the field at Detroit on 1/10/12, finishing with a team-high 18 points and seven rebounds in 28 minutes of action. The 90 percent field goal percentage was the highest field goal percentage he has recorded in any game in his career (minimum 10 field goal attempts). The Mavericks are 12-0 all-time in the regular season when Nowitzki shoots at least 80 percent from the floor (minimum 10 field goal attempts). He has averaged 27.0 points per game in those 12 contests. Nowitzki, who shot a career-high 51.7 percent (610-1,179 FGs) from the field during the 2010-11 regular season, had five such games last season. Nowitzki has shot 80-plus percent from the floor (while attempting at least 10 shots) in two postseason games in his career, and Dallas is 2-0 in those games. He went 12-of-15 (.800) from the field (24-of-24 from the line) en route to a playoff-high 48 points in Game 1 of the 2011 Western Conference Finals against Oklahoma City on 5/17/11. The 48 points were the most by any player in a playoff game who shot at least 80 percent from the field. Nowitzki also went 12-of-14 (.857) from the floor in the playoffs against the Spurs on 4/18/10, finishing with 36 points in 40 minutes.

DIRK'S 1,000TH GAME: Dirk Nowitzki played in his 1,000th career regular-season game (975th start) against Phoenix on 1/4/12, becoming the 98th player in NBA history (11th active player) to accomplish the feat. With the win over the Suns, Dallas won its 661st game with Nowitzki in the lineup (went 661-339 in his first 1,000 games). Nowitzki, whose first season in Dallas was in 1998-99, is the third-longest tenured player with his original team (L.A. Lakers' Kobe Bryant 1996-97; San Antonio's Tim Duncan 1997-98). He passed Brad Davis (883) for the most games played in franchise history at Phoenix on 1/28/10. Nowitzki has appeared in an additional 124 playoff games (all starts) over the course of his NBA career.

DIRK RECORDS 8,000TH CAREER FIELD GOAL: With a 10-foot step-back jumper (at the 7:40 mark of the second quarter) against Oklahoma City on 1/2/12, Dirk Nowitzki recorded his 8,000th career regular-season made field goal. He became the 31st player in NBA history to accomplish the feat and he currently ranks fourth among active players in field goals made (behind Kobe Bryant, Kevin Garnett and Tim Duncan).

A KIDD AT HEART: Jason Kidd ranks first among active players and 14th all-time with **1,285** games played. The 17-year veteran has started 1,270 of the 1,285 games he has appeared in over the course of his NBA career. He needs **two** games to pass former Maverick Sam Perkins (1,286) for 13th place on the NBA's all-time list.

THREE STREAK: The game vs. Memphis on 3/6/11 marked Dallas' 1,000th straight game with at least one 3-point basket. Since 2/27/99, the Mavericks have gone 1,048 consecutive regular-season games with a 3-pointer made – the longest streak in NBA history. They've made only one trey in a game 15 times in that span. The Raptors went 986 consecutive games with at least one 3-pointer made, but had their streak (which began on 2/26/99) come to an end vs. Memphis on 1/24/11.

BACK-TO-BACKS: The Mavericks have 22 back-to-backs in 2011-12, which includes one back-to-back-to-back set from March 8-10. In total, six of them begin at home and end on the road, six are road-home, eight are on the road and two are at home. Dallas played 20 back-to-backs in 2010-11, finishing 13-7 in the front half and 14-6 in the second half of those sets.

CHAMPIONS AT LAST: After 31 years of waiting, the Mavericks finally brought an NBA Championship home to the city of Dallas in 2011. The Mavericks avenged the 2006 loss to the Heat by defeating Miami in the 2011 NBA Finals. After losing Game 3 and falling behind 2-1, Dallas responded with three straight victories and closed out Miami in six games. Of the previous 11 occasions a Finals series had been tied at 1-1 (since the NBA Finals went to the 2-3-2 format beginning in 1985), the winner of Game 3 had gone on to win the championship all 11 times. The Mavericks rewrote history in 2011 and captured their first NBA title in the process.

TITLE DEFENSE: Ten of the last 25 NBA champions have "repeated" beginning with the Lakers in 1987 and 1988. Since the NBA's inaugural season in 1946-47, 21 of the 65 title winners have followed their championship seasons by winning the NBA Finals the next year. Among the other 44 teams, nine lost in the NBA Finals, 17 lost in the Conference Finals, 11 lost in the Conference Semifinals, five lost in the First Round and two failed to make the playoffs.

MOST WINS IN A FIVE-YEAR SPAN: Dallas went 280-130 (.683) over the last five regular seasons (from 2006-07 to 2010-11), which was the highest winning percentage in the league in that span (see right). What's more, Dallas won the most games in the 2010 calendar year. The Mavericks, who entered the year 2011 with a record of 24-7 (held a record of 24-7 going into the game at Milwaukee on 1/1/11), finished the 2010 calendar year with a record of 57-24 (.704). The Spurs (.702, 59-25) finished with the second-highest winning percentage in 2010. Dallas recorded the highest winning percentage in a calendar year on two other occasions: 2007 (.768, 63-19) and 2002 (.744, 61-21, tied with Sacramento).

LONG STREAK OF SUCCESS: With a victory over the Timberwolves on 3/24/11, the Mavericks improved to 50-21 in 2010-11 and recorded their 11th straight 50-win season (13th in franchise history). Dallas became just the third team in NBA history to record 11 straight 50-win seasons (2000-2011). Only four franchises have had at least 10 consecutive 50-win seasons since the NBA went to an 82-game schedule in 1967. The Spurs (12 seasons, 1999-2011) and the Lakers (12 seasons, 1979-1991) are the only two teams with longer streaks than the Mavericks (see below). Dallas ended the 2010-11 regular season with a record of 57-25 (.695), which was tied for the fifth-best mark in franchise history (also finished 57-25 in 2001-02). The Mavericks have tallied at least 55 wins seven times in the last 11 seasons. They have finished with a winning percentage of at least .695 six times in that span, including a franchise-high .817 (67-15) in 2006-07. Since 2000-01, the lowest winning percentage the Mavericks have recorded for a season is .610, when they won exactly 50 games in 2008-09. A 50-win season with an 82-game schedule equates to about 40.2 wins with a 66-game schedule. Therefore, the Mavericks will have to win 41-or-more games in 2011-12 to match the 61.0 percent-plus winning percentage they have recorded in each of the past 11 seasons (40 wins will give them a winning percentage of .606, while 41 wins will give them a winning percentage of .621).

SPRINGTIME TRADITION: Dallas has made 11 consecutive trips to the postseason (17 overall). It's the longest streak in franchise history and currently the second-longest streak in the NBA. San Antonio (14 consecutive playoff appearances) is the only team with a longer active streak (see right). The Mavericks have made three Western Conference Finals appearances in that span (four in franchise history: 1988, 2003, 2006, 2011) and advanced to the NBA Finals twice (2006 and 2011). They captured their first NBA Championship in 2011.

STILL SEEING DOUBLE: Of the active players in the NBA who have tallied the most double-doubles in their careers, the Mavericks have three players that rank in the top 10. **Jason Kidd's 485** career double-doubles rank third among active players, **Shawn Marion's 396** rank sixth and **Dirk Nowitzki's 360** rank eighth. Kidd ranks first among active players and third all-time (behind Oscar Robertson, 181, and Magic Johnson, 138) with **107** career triple-doubles.

LO-TS OF MOVEMENT: Dallas made at least one roster move every day in a span from 12/9-12/15/11, beginning with the signing of free agent forward Brandan Wright on 12/9. The most notable move came on 12/11, when Dallas traded for the reigning Sixth Man of the Year, Lamar Odom. The Mavericks shipped a protected first-round draft pick to the Lakers in exchange for Odom, a 2012 second-round draft pick and other second-round considerations in 2013. Odom averaged 14.4 points, 8.7 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 32.2 minutes in 82 games (32 starts) for the Lakers last season. He joins a Mavericks roster that features the player who finished as the runner-up for the Sixth Man of the Year award in 2010-11 (and who won the award in 2008-09), Jason Terry. On 12/12, the Mavericks signed eight-time All-Star Vince Carter and re-signed forward Brian Cardinal. The next day (12/13), Dallas signed free agent guard Delonte West. The Mavericks dealt two players (Rudy Fernandez, who was acquired in a three-team trade with Denver and Portland on 7/23, and Corey Brewer) to Denver for a future second-round draft pick on 12/13. Free agents Tyson Chandler (New York), Caron Butler (L.A. Clippers), Jose Juan Barea (Minnesota) and DeShawn Stevenson (New Jersey) all signed with different clubs this past offseason, and Peja Stojakovic announced his retirement on 12/19. Cardinal was the only Dallas free agent that re-signed with the club. Free agent big man Sean Williams signed with Dallas on 12/21. The Mavericks' most recent signing came on 1/6, when they signed free agent forward Yi Jianlian. The roster currently stands at 15 players.

FIRST-ROUND SELECTIONS: Fourteen of the 15 players currently on the Mavericks' roster are former first-round draft picks (Brian Cardinal is the only Maverick who was drafted in the second round). Seven were top-10 picks: Jason Kidd (second overall in 1994), Vince Carter (fifth overall in 1998), Dirk Nowitzki (ninth overall in 1998), Lamar Odom (fourth overall in 1999), Shawn Marion (ninth overall in 1999), Jason Terry (10th overall in 1999), Yi Jianlian (sixth overall in 2007) and Brandan Wright (eighth overall in 2007). Kidd holds the honor of being the highest drafted Maverick (second overall by Dallas in 1994).

CENTURY MARK SUCCESS: The Mavericks have reached the century mark in scoring nine times thus far in 2011-12 (8-1 record). The Mavericks were 43-4 (.915) when they scored 100-plus points in 2010-11, including 13-1 (.929) when they recorded 110-plus points in a game. They were 35-7 (.833) when they scored at least 100 points in a game in 2009-10, and 34-11 (.756) when they did so in 2008-09.

20,000 MANIAACS: The season-opener versus Miami on 12/25/11 marked the Mavericks' 400th consecutive sellout. Since 12/15/01, Dallas has sold out **414** regular-season home games, which is an NBA-best-sellout streak. Dallas has also sold out an additional 58 playoff games during that same stretch. The listed capacity for American Airlines Center is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a record of **331-94 (.779)** at home. Dallas has sold out all 41 games in each of the past nine seasons.

HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

Rick Carlisle led the Mavericks to their first NBA Championship in 2010-11. He became one of only 11 men to win an NBA championship as both a player and as a coach (won a title as a player with Boston in 1986).

Carlisle became the ninth Dallas coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season before coming to Dallas. He began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61 percent (100-64) of their games to go along with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in team history (.744) and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons.

Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as a head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
