June 24, 2004

At NBA Draft 2004, the Bulls drafted Ben Gordon in the first round (3rd overall) and used second round picks to select Jackson Vroman (31st overall) and Chris Duhon (38th overall). The Bulls then traded the rights to Vroman, a future first-round pick and cash to the Phoenix Suns for the 7th overall pick, Luol Deng.

Aug. 8, 2004

Re-signed Jamal Crawford and traded him and Jerome Williams to New York in exchange for Othella Harrington, Dikembe Mutombo, Cezary Trybanski and Frank Williams.

Aug. 11, 2004

Signed free agent forward Andrés Nocioni.

Sept. 8, 2004

Acquired Adrian Griffin, Eric Piatkowski and Mike Wilks from Houston in exchange for Dikembe Mutombo.

Sept. 30, 2004

Signed undrafted rookie free agent center Jared Reiner.

Oct. 5, 2004

Scottie Pippen retired.

Nov. 5, 2004 – NEW JERSEY NETS 111, Bulls 106 2 OT

Chicago fell behind big early but responded with a strong second half to force two overtimes in its season opener, only to fall 111-106. Chicago's Kirk Hinrich sparked the rally, scoring 17 of his career-high 34 points in the third. Andrés Nocioni started and scored 17 points and grabbed a team-high 14 rebounds in 42 minutes, while Luol Deng came off the bench to collect 18 points and 10 boards in 38 minutes, marking the first time in NBA history that rookie teammates recorded double-doubles in their first career game. The Bulls were without center Eddy Curry and forward Antonio Davis, both of whom served the first of two-game suspensions stemming from an altercation in a preseason game against Washington on Oct. 25. Chicago attempted a franchise record 34 three-pointers, also setting a new United Center record.

Nov. 22, 2004 – PHOENIX SUNS 100, Bulls 82

The Bulls dropped their ninth straight decision to begin the season, this time a 100-82 setback at Phoenix, tying the 1967-68 Bulls for the worst start in franchise history (0-9).

Nov. 24, 2004 – BULLS 101, Utah Jazz 99

Head Coach Scott Skiles shuffled the starting lineup and it worked, propelling the Bulls to their first victory of the season – a 101-99 triumph over the Utah Jazz. Skiles shook things up when he started veteran Antonio Davis and rookies Luol Deng and Chris Duhon for the first time of the season. Ben Gordon and Eddy Curry came off the bench and combined 22 and 21 points, respectively, to help Chicago's cause.

Dec. 11, 2004 – BULLS 99, Minn. Timberwolves 88

Ben Gordon scored 16 of his then-season-high 31 points in the fourth quarter as the Bulls held off the Timberwolves, 99-88, to snap a 10-game skid in the series. Kirk Hinrich collected 19 points, 12 assists and eight rebounds for the Bulls.

Dec. 22, 2004 – BULLS 89, Detroit Pistons 82

With an 89-82 triumph at The Palace, Chicago won its fifth straight decision and snapped a nine-game losing streak to the Pistons which dated back to an April 10, 2002 win at Detroit (102-101). Ben Gordon, one of six Bulls players to score in double figures, led the way with 19 points off the bench, including 10 points in the final quarter. The Bulls' bench provided another big game, outscoring the Pistons' reserves 53-8. Chicago also held its opponent to under 90 points for the fifth straight game.

Jan. 12, 2005 – BULLS 110, Philadelphia 76ers 78

Ben Gordon collected a then-season-high-tying 31 points as the Bulls rolled to their fifth straight win, a 110-78 trouncing of the 76ers. Gordon scored 19 points in the fourth quarter, including three 3-pointers in a 15-2 run that opened the period and gave Chicago an 89-63 lead.

Jan. 15, 2005 – BULLS 86, New York Knicks 84

Eddy Curry scored the game-winning layup with 2.4 seconds remaining and Tyson Chandler blocked a potential tying shot as the Bulls rallied for their sixth straight victory, an 86-84 triumph over the visiting New York Knicks. With the game tied at 84-84 and seven seconds remaining, Andrés Nocioni blocked a jumper by Trevor Ariza. Chandler saved the ball under his own basket with a flip pass to Kirk Hinrich. Hinrich then launched it down-court to Nocioni, who fed Curry for the go-ahead basket. After a timeout, the 7-1 Chandler blocked a shot by Nazr Mohammed in the right low post as time expired. Curry finished with 17 points and Hinrich added 15, with 11 assists, as the Bulls won for the 14th time in their last 19 games.

Jan. 17, 2005 – BULLS 88, New York Knicks 86

Ben Gordon buried a driving floater with one tick left, giving the Chicago Bulls an 88-86 victory over the New York Knicks and ran their then-season-high winning streak to seven games. Chicago got a tying 3-pointer by rookie Andrés Nocioni with 56 seconds left. Nocioni grabbed three rebounds over the next 45 seconds, setting the stage for Gordon's heroics. Thirteen of Gordon's 17 points came in the final 12 minutes, the last basket coming on a slicing drive through the key before he lofted the shot over the outstretched arm of center Michael Sweetney. The Bulls outrebounded the Knicks 56-38 in the contest, with four Bulls each hauling in 10+ rebounds (Chandler 13, Hinrich 13, Nocioni 11 and Deng 10). It marked the first time since Feb. 3, 1992 (at Utah) that four Bulls grabbed double digit boards in a game.

Jan. 22, 2005 - BULLS 100, Detroit Pistons 89

Kirk Hinrich scored 16 of his 24 points in the second half as the Bulls reached the .500 mark for the first time of the season with a 100-89 triumph over the Pistons. The Bulls opened the second half with a 7-0 run to grab a 51-47 lead. A jumper by Richard Hamilton with 10:04 remaining put Detroit ahead, 74-72, but Hinrich scored 10 points in an ensuing 26-11 burst that sealed the win. With the win, Chicago swept the Pistons at Detroit this season - the first time since 1995-96, when they set an NBA record with a 72-10 mark.

Jan. 25, 2005 - BULLS 111, Denver Nuggets 107

Eddy Curry scored 14 of his 16 points in the fourth quarter as the surging Bulls ran their home winning streak to six games with a 111-107 win over the Nuggets. Ben Gordon also chipped in late, burying a key 3-pointer with 31 seconds to go to finish with 18. Chicago took a 79-78 edge into the final quarter before a Curry layup with 10:29 to go pushed the Bulls' lead to 83-80 and ignited a 13-6 burst. Denver's 107 points snapped Chicago's franchise record of 26 straight games of holding opponents under 100 points. The Bulls also won their fourth game in five nights for the first time since the 1995-96 season.

Jan. 27, 2005 - BULLS 101, Charlotte Bobcats 93

Jannero Pargo scored all 14 of his points in the fourth quarter to lead a dominant performance by the Bulls' bench in a 101-93 victory over the Charlotte Bobcats. Pargo's effort led Chicago to its fifth straight win and 12th in 13 games. Chicago held a 63-22 advantage in bench points. The game marked the first-ever meeting between the two franchises and the first ever meeting between Chicago's Ben Gordon and Charlotte's Emeka Okafor (college teammates and roommates at Connecticut).

Feb. 1, 2005

The NBA named Ben Gordon Eastern Conference got milk? Rookie of the Month for the month of January 2005 after posting averages of 14.3 ppg, 2.2 rpg, 2.1 apg and 20.7 mpg in 16 games. The NBA also named head coach Scott Skiles Eastern Conference Coach of the Month for January 2005 after directing the Bulls to an NBA-best 13-3 record, including a seven-game winning streak during the month.

Feb. 8, 2005 - BULLS 107, Dallas Mavericks 100

Luol Deng had season highs of 30 points and 11 rebounds, and Eddy Curry scored 11 of his 23 points in the fourth quarter, as the Bulls snapped a 13-game losing streak to the Mavericks with a 107-100 victory at Dallas.

Feb. 15, 2005 - BULLS 107, Sacramento Kings 102

Eddy Curry collected 25 points and 12 rebounds, and Ben Gordon added 24 points as the Bulls snapped an 11-game skid against the Kings with a 107-102 triumph at the United Center.

Feb. 16, 2005 - BULLS 121, Toronto Raptors 115

Ben Gordon scored 15 of his 17 points in the fourth quarter, and Kirk Hinrich hit a career-high-tying six 3-pointers, as the Chicago Bulls

posted a 121-115 victory over the Raptors, their seventh straight win over Toronto. Chris Duhon also shot 4-of-5 from downtown. Chicago shot 58 percent (44-of-76) from the floor and set season highs for points in the first quarter (37), first half (62) and game.

Feb. 22, 2005 - BULLS 105, Miami Heat 101 OT

Ben Gordon scored 29 points and helped rally the Chicago Bulls to their fourth-straight win, a 105-101 victory over the visiting Heat. Miami All-Star center Shaquille O'Neal hobbled off the court less than two minutes into the contest and did not return. Miami led 86-77 with just over five minutes left in regulation before Gordon took over and led his team to victory, scoring 20 of his game-high 29 points in a heroic effort.

March 1, 2005

The NBA announced Ben Gordon as the Eastern Conference got milk? Rookie of the Month for February 2005. Gordon also earned the award for the month of January, making him the first Chicago rookie since Elton Brand (January and February 2000) to earn the award in consecutive months. In 11 February games, Gordon averaged a rookie-best 19.1 ppg, 3.6 rpg and 2.3 apg in 26.5 mpg; he shot .438 from the field, .519 from downtown and .837 from the free throw line.

March 28, 2005 - BULLS 94, Memphis Grizzlies 86

Eddy Curry led the Bulls in scoring for the fifth-consecutive game, this time pouring in 25 points and Tyson Chandler added 13 points and 14 boards, which gave Chicago its sixth-straight win with a 94-86 decision over Memphis at the United Center. Luol Deng did not return in the second half after suffering a sprained right wrist.

March 30, 2005 - BULLS 102, Charlotte Bobcats 99

The Bulls captured their seventh win in a row after Ben Gordon scored 22 of his NBA rookie season-high 35 points in the fourth quarter en route to Chicago's 102-99 win at Charlotte. Gordon scored the final 16 points for the Bulls and Chicago's bench outscored Charlotte's, 65-25.

April 1, 2005

The NBA announced today that Chicago Bulls rookie guard Ben Gordon was selected the Eastern Conference Rookie of the Month for March. Gordon has claimed the honor three consecutive months, and joins Elton Brand (January, February, and April 2000) and Michael Jordan (November 1984, January and March 1985) as the only Chicago rookies to earn the honor three times in a season. Gordon appeared in 18 games in March and averaged a rookie-best 17.6 ppg, 2.9 rpg and 2.2 apg in 27.8 mpg; he shot .395 from the floor, .365 from behind the arc and .862 from the free throw line.

April 2, 2005 - BULLS 112, Charlotte Bobcats 97

Veterans Othella Harrington and Eric Piatkowski scored 22 and 19 points, respectively, to pace Chicago in a 112-97 decision over the visiting Bobcats. The win was Chicago's ninth-consecutive, marking the longest streak since the club won 13 in a row in the 1997-

98 season and guaranteed the Bulls nothing short of a .500 winning percentage on the year.

April 9, 2005 – BULLS 110, Toronto Raptors 97

The Bulls clinched their first playoff berth since the 1997-98 season with a 110-97 wire-to-wire victory over the visiting Toronto Raptors. Kirk Hinrich led all scorers with 25 points and Tyson Chandler contributed 18 and 21 rebounds.

April 14, 2005

Bulls announced Eddy Curry would miss the remainder of the 2004-05 regular season and playoffs due to an irregular heartbeat.

April 15, 2005 – BULLS 117, Orlando Magic 77

Chicago got double-digit scoring efforts from seven players and passed a season-high 36 assists en route to a 117-77 drubbing of the visiting Orlando Magic. Rookies Chris Duhon, Ben Gordon and Andrés Nocioni scored 17 points apiece to lead the Bulls' attack. The 40-point victory was Chicago's largest of the season.

April 16, 2005 – BULLS 114, Atlanta Hawks 105

Chicago started slow but caught fire in the second half behind Chris Duhon's sharpshooting and left Atlanta with a 114-105 win. The Bulls trailed by 15 at the half before Duhon hit five threes in the second half and led Chicago to a season-high 66 second-half points. Duhon finished with 24 points on 8-of-9 shooting from downtown. With the win, Chicago swept the four-game season series with Atlanta for the first time since the 1995-96 season.

April 18, 2005

Bulls signed free agent forward Lawrence Funderburke.

April 19, 2005 – BULLS 92, New York Knicks 91

Ben Gordon nailed a go-ahead jumper with 5.8 seconds left and former Bull Jamal Crawford missed a jumper at the buzzer as Chicago held on for a 92-91 triumph over visiting New York to clinch home-court advantage in the first round of the Eastern Conference playoffs. Kirk Hinrich scored a career-high-tying 34 points to lead the Bulls. With the win, Chicago's record inflated to a season-high 13 games over .500 at 47-34 and also the most wins in a season in seven years.

April 24, 2005 – BULLS 103, Washington Wizards 94

Ben Gordon scored 12 of his 30 points in the fourth quarter, as the Chicago Bulls rallied for a 103-94 victory over the Washington Wizards in the opener of their Eastern Conference series. Andrés Nocioni combined season-highs of 25 points and 18 boards to help the Chicago cause. The Bulls held Washington's All-Star guard Gilbert Arenas to just nine points on 3-of-19 shooting.

April 27, 2005 – BULLS 113, Washington Wizards 103

Kirk Hinrich matched his career-high of 34 points to lead the Bulls to a 113-103 victory over the Washington Wizards at the United Center. The fourth-seeded Bulls stormed back from an

early 13-point deficit to open a 20-point lead thanks to 21 fourth-quarter points from Hinrich, before holding off the fifth-seeded Wizards and took a 2-0 lead in the series.

April 30, 2005 – WASHINGTON WIZARDS 117, Bulls 99

Six Bulls scored in double figures, including two with double-double performances, but four Wizards scored 20+ points apiece leading Washington to a 117-99 win over the Bulls in Game 3 at the MCI Center. Chicago's struggles were in large part due to foul trouble that haunted Tyson Chandler, Antonio Davis and Kirk Hinrich and led to 49 Washington free throw attempts.

May 2, 2005 – WASHINGTON WIZARDS 106, Bulls 99

Washington's Juan Dixon came off the bench and scored a career-high 35 points to help the Wizards even the series at 2-2 with a 106-99 win over the Bulls. Kirk Hinrich and Jannero Pargo each totaled 18 points to lead Chicago.

May 3, 2005

Rookie guard Ben Gordon is named NBA's Sixth Man of the Year, becoming the first rookie in NBA history to claim the award since its inception following the 1982-83 campaign.

May 4, 2005 – WASHINGTON WIZARDS 112, Bulls 110

Gilbert Arenas' 16-footer at the buzzer in Game 5 gave the Wizards a 112-110 win and a 3-2 series advantage in front of a stunned capacity crowd at the United Center. Chicago rallied from a 22-point third quarter deficit with the help of several missed free throws down the stretch by the Wizards. Arenas finished with 16 points and Larry Hughes scored a game-high 33. Ben Gordon's 27 points led the Bulls.

May 5, 2005

The NBA announced that the League's head coaches selected Chicago rookies Luol Deng and Ben Gordon to the 2004-05 got milk? NBA All-Rookie First Team. It was the first time in franchise history that the Bulls had two players selected to the First Team and the 12th time in NBA history that two players from the same team were elected to the First Team.

May 6, 2005 – WASHINGTON WIZARDS 94, Bulls 91

Just like they had all year, the Bulls fought hard until the final buzzer of a 94-91 Game 6 eliminating loss at the MCI Center. Jared Jeffries stole a Chicago inbounds pass at half court and took it the distance for a dunk with 35 seconds remaining to break a 91-91 tie. The Wizards added a late free throw and hung on for the three-point win to clinch the series 4-2.

June 16, 2005

Bulls and head coach Scott Skiles agree to contract extension.

NOTE: The Bulls finished 2nd in the NBA in attendance (averaged 20,204) and hosted 19 sellouts at the United Center, including 11 consecutive sellouts to close the regular season.
