Media Information

As the Chicago Bulls enter their 40th season in the NBA and 12th year at the United Center, the team appreciates the coverage and support from the media and we look forward to assisting you again this season. In an effort to provide a professional working environment, the Bulls have established the following guidelines for the 2005-06 season:

Credentials:

We will honor all reasonable requests for credentials from recognized newspapers, magazines, radio and television outlets. The only season passes that will be honored at the United Center are Bulls season credentials and NBA season credentials. Each of those credentials will admit the bearer to the United Center, the upstairs press box, press row, the press work room and both locker rooms. However, **IN ORDER TO RESERVE SEATING, MEDIA MEMBERS HOLDING SEASON PASSES SHOULD NOTIFY THE BULLS PR DEPARTMENT IF PLANNING TO COVER A GAME.** Please make seating requests by 5:00 p.m. the day prior to the game. Individual single-game press and photo credentials can be secured for accredited media members by calling the Bulls Public and Media Relations Department no later than 5:00 p.m. the day before a game (by 5:00 p.m. Friday for a weekend or Monday game). Single-game passes can be picked up at Gate 3 1/2 on the northeast corner of the United Center.

Credentials must be visibly worn in the United Center to assure proper access to designated areas. In all cases, season and single-game passes are non-transferable. Any unauthorized use will subject the bearer to ejection from the United Center and the forfeiture of the credential.

Press Work Room:

The press work room is located on the service level in the northwest corner of the United Center. Working media with valid credentials will be allowed into the press work room. The work area is equipped with photography rooms, electrical outlets and phones.

Services:

A pre-game meal will be available in the press work room at a charge of \$6.00. Prior to the game, the media will be provided with game notes and programs. All statistical services including play-by-play, quarter statistics, halftime and final box scores and post-game quotes will be distributed at press row and in the upstairs press box. Fax service is also provided before, during and after the game.

Locker Room:

In accordance with NBA policy, the Bulls' and visitor's locker rooms will be open to the media up to 45 minutes before the game and 10 minutes after the end of the game. Only working media with a valid credential will be admitted into the locker rooms. Still photography is not allowed in the locker rooms at any time. Media members are also prohibited from using cell phones inside the locker room. The Bulls' locker room is located on the north end of the service level, while the visitor's locker room is located adjacent to the press work room.

Photographers:

A single-game credential will be issued to accredited photographers from large-circulation Chicagoland daily newspapers. Photographers from other newspapers or magazines wishing to work specific games must request single-game passes. Freelance photographers needing credentials must submit a letter indicating a specific assignment from a publication.

Post-game Interviews:

Please be sure to list THREE choices for radio and television post-game interviews. This will ensure an interviewee in case the first choice is unavailable.

Autographs/Personal Cameras:

No autographs of players or coaches are allowed. Personal cameras and camera phones are prohibited.

**Neil Funk** *Radio Play-By-Play Announcer*

Neil Funk returns for his 15th season as play by play announcer for all games broadcast on ESPN Radio 1000 ... prior to his Bulls assignment, he served as the announcer for Philadelphia 76ers games on WPHL-TV for four seasons ... was the recipient of an Emmy award for his broadcasting in 1989 ... he began his career in 1971 announcing University of Illinois basketball and football and Danville Warrior games (Milwaukee Brewers farm club) on WITY Radio ... his first NBA stint was in 1976-77, when he broadcast the Sixers on WIBG Radio ... he then moved to Kansas City, where he announced Kings games ... while serving as the Kings' broadcaster, he was named Missouri's best sports broadcaster three times ... he returned to Philadelphia and broadcast Sixers games on WPHL-TV and WFIL Radio from 1982 to 1985 ... the following three seasons he handled play-by-play for the New Jersey Nets on WNBC and WNEW ... Neil and his wife, Renee, reside in Chicago and have one son, William.

**Bill Wennington** *Radio Analyst*

Bill Wennington begins his third season as radio color commentator for all games broadcast on ESPN Radio 1000 ... served as a mentor and Coordinator of the Bulls' player relations program for three years (2001-2004) ... was sideline reporter for FOX SportsNet Chicago during the 2002-03 season ... a 13-year veteran of the NBA, spent six seasons with the Bulls (1993-94 through 1998-99) including three World Championships ... a native of Montreal, Canada, Bill was also a member of the 1984 and 1992 Canadian Olympic Teams ... recently inducted into the Quebec Basketball Hall of Fame and the Canadian Basketball Hall of Fame ... played his college basketball at St. John's University and was inducted into the school's Basketball Hall of Fame in 2002 ... Bill and his wife, Anne, reside in Lake Forest, Ill., with their son, Robbie.

**Tom Dore** *Television Play-By-Play Announcer*

Tom Dore is a 24-year television and radio sports announcing veteran who, for the 15th year, will serve as the Bulls play-by-play announcer for all games telecast on Comcast SportsNet ... the 7 foot-2-inch Dore is a native of Northlake, Ill. ... voted 1994 "Sportscaster of the Year" for the state of Illinois ... All-State and All-America prep basketball player at East Leyden High School in Franklin Park ... played center for the University of Missouri from 1976-1980 ... appeared in two NCAA tournaments with the Tigers and still holds their single-game and career tournament block shot record ... played professionally for one year in France, and two years in New Zealand, where he got his start in broadcasting doing play-by-play for the country's professional basketball league ... upon returning to the U.S. in 1984, Tom began a five year association with the University of Texas as sports director for KLBJ Radio in Austin ... he worked for Host Communications Radio Network, did color work for the Texas A&M, SMU and Arkansas Radio Network and announced for both the Liberty and Cotton Bowls ... from 1989-1991, Tom served as sports director at KCMO Radio in Kansas City, Mo., handling play-by-play duties for the University of Missouri Basketball Radio Network, the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament regional games, the NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four and the College World Series ... additionally, Dore was the color analyst for the Missouri Football Network, hosted statewide coaches weekly call-in shows, anchored morning drive sportscasts and co-hosted an afternoon sports talk show with former NFL star Conrad Dobler ... along with his Bulls play-by-play duties, he also serves as play-by-play radio announcer for the Chicago Rush Arena Football team ... Tom and his wife, Cheryl, reside in Des Plaines, Ill., with their children, Alison, Annie and Tommy.

Johnny "Red" Kerr *Television Analyst*

Johnny "Red" Kerr enters his 32nd season as a Bulls broadcaster ... he has been part of both Bulls' television and radio broadcast teams ... Johnny's name is synonymous with professional basketball in Chicago ... "Big Red" was the first coach of the Chicago Bulls in 1966 and earned NBA Coach of the Year honors for the 1966-67 season, when he directed the first year expansion Bulls to a playoff appearance ... a native Chicagoan, John starred as a prep at Tilden Tech, collegiately at the University of Illinois and in the pro ranks with Syracuse, Philadelphia and Baltimore ... his NBA record for most consecutive games played (844) was broken during the 1982-83 season by Randy Smith ... he is one of the select NBA players who totaled more than 10,000 points and 10,000 rebounds during his career ... coached the Phoenix Suns and also held several administrative positions in both the NBA and ABA ... he is an insurance investment consultant and holds the title of President of Kerr Financial Services ... his book "Bull Session" was released in October 1989 ... John resides in Riverside, Ill., and has five children, Ed, Matt, Jim, Bill and Essie, and 10 grandchildren.


Wayne Larrivee *Television Play-By-Play Announcer*

Wayne Larrivee will return as play by play announcer for his 14th season on WGN-TV and for the sixth season on WCIU-TV ... also serves as the Green Bay Packers radio play-by-play announcer ... has won the 1997, 1998, 2000, and 2004 Midwest Emmy for Bulls play-by-play broadcasting on WGN-TV ... 2004 Edward R. Murrow Award for Green Bay Packers football play-by-play ... three-time winner of AIRY Award for top play-by-play announcer in Wisconsin for work on Green Bay Packers football broadcasts ... Wayne began his broadcasting career in 1975 at KGRO Radio in Pampa, Texas ... from there, he moved to Davenport, Iowa, and KSTT Radio, where he announced University of Iowa football, minor league baseball and high school basketball games ... in 1978, he headed to Kansas City, Mo., where he provided daily sportscasts, as well as Kansas City Kings play by play for KCMO Radio ... was soon known as the "Voice of the Kansas City Chiefs" ... he joined WGN Radio in 1985, where he began his broadcasting duties as play-by-play announcer for the Chicago Bears Radio Network ... in 1998 awarded the Illinois Sportscaster of the Year award by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association ... 1997 winner of the Midwest Emmy for Bulls play-by-play announcing ... he has been a four-time recipient of the Illinois Broadcasting Association's "Silver Dome Award" in the category of "Best Radio Play-By-Play Broadcast" for his work as the Bears announcer ... Wayne has also announced Big Ten football and basketball on ESPN and RAYCOM ... Wayne and his wife, Julie, reside in Grafton, Wis., with their two children.

Steve Scott is in his fourth season as the Bulls PA announcer ... Scott is currently the morning news anchor on WLS-AM's Don Wade and Roma show, a position he has held since 1993 ... in 1997, he was also named the station's News Director and therefore coordinates the station's news coverage while serving as a field reporter for ABC Radio News ... 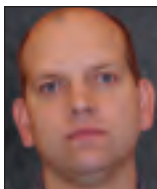

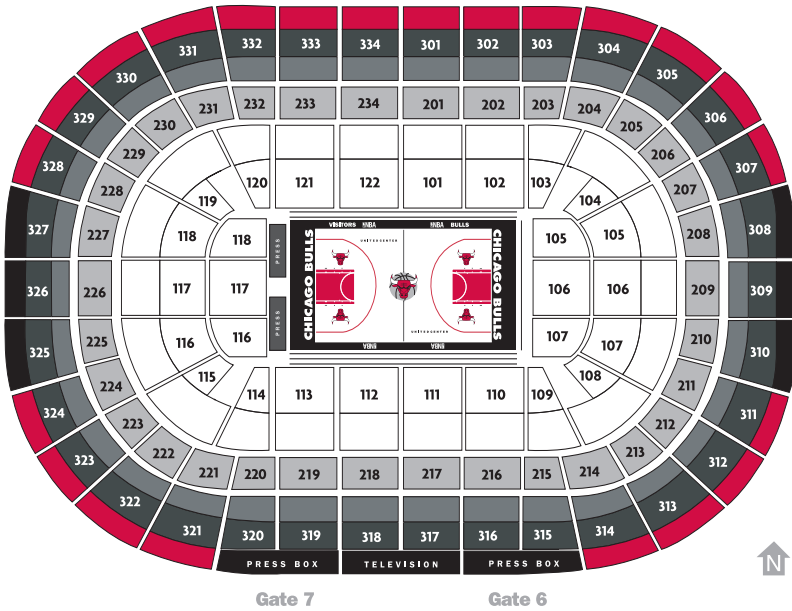

United Center Building Information

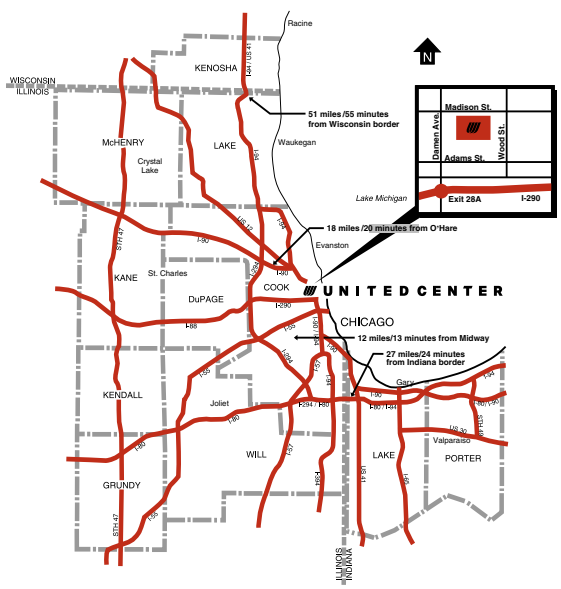
Completed in 1994, the United Center cost \$175 million and is 960,000 square feet in size. 3,500 tons of steel were used in the building - enough to build 28 life-sized replicas of the Statue of Liberty. 41,000 cubic yards of concrete were used in the building - enough to equal a five-foot wide sidewalk from the United Center to the Berto Center in Deerfield, Ill. The scoreboard is as tall as a two-story building (20 feet), weighs nearly as much as 26 cars, and displays 175,000 different lights. The first public event at the United Center was World Wrestling Federation SummerSlam, held on 08/29/94. The building has 1,850 doors, 6,500 parking spaces, eight escalators, nine elevators and 50 public restrooms. The United Center has hosted thousands of events and millions of guests in 12 years.

FROM O'HARE:

Take 90 East to the Madison Street exit. Turn right on Madison Street (heading west). The United Center is on the left side of the street at 1901 West Madison Street.

FROM MIDWAY:

Take 55 North to 90 West. Exit at Madison Street. Turn left on Madison Street (heading west). The United Center is located on the left at 1901 West Madison Street.

FROM DOWNTOWN:

Take Grand Avenue west to Ogden Avenue. Turn left (south). Head south on Ogden Avenue to Madison Street. Turn right (west). The United Center is on the left side of the street.

FROM O'HARE:

Take 294 North. Exit at Lake-Cook Road. Turn right on Lake-Cook (heading east). Turn left onto Waukegan Road (heading north). Turn left onto Kates Road (only left turn allowed). Head west 500 feet and the Berto Center is on the left side at 550 Lake-Cook Road.

FROM MIDWAY:

Take 55 North to 90/94 West. At the 90 West (O'Hare)/94 (Milwaukee) split, take 94 West. Exit at Dundee Road West. Turn right onto Waukegan Road (heading north). Turn left at Kates Road (only left turn allowed). Head west 500 feet and the Berto Center is on the left at 550 Lake-Cook Road.

FROM DOWNTOWN:

Take 94 West. At the O'Hare/Milwaukee split, stay on 94 West/Edens Expressway. Exit at Dundee Road West. Turn right onto Waukegan Road. Turn left onto Kates Road and then an immediate left at the first light. The Berto Center is on the left side at 550 Lake-Cook Road.

FROM 294/TRI-STATE:

Take 294 North to Lake-Cook Road. Exit at Lake-Cook Road and head east (right). Turn left onto Pfingsten Road. Turn right at the first light. The Berto Center is on the right side of the street at 550 Lake-Cook Road.

Ticket Prices: \$105, \$70, \$50, \$40, \$36 and \$10

(Season ticket holders receive a \$5 to \$20 savings per ticket from individual game prices.)

Prices for Dec. 3, 9, 13, 17 and 22; Jan. 14 and 20; Feb. 2; Mar. 2 and 18; April 1, 8 and 14 are \$115, \$80, \$56, \$46, \$40 and \$10.

Call **1-800-4NBA-TIX** to use a major credit card. Orders are accepted up to one hour before game time. If time does not permit mailing, tickets will be held for pickup at the United Center's Gate 4 Will Call within 90 minutes of the game.

Visit any Chicagoland Ticketmaster location, located in most Carson Pirie Scott, Bergner's and Coconuts stores and Tower Records.

5) By Mail

Complete the order form found on all Bulls pocket schedules (or at www.bulls.com), and mail with payment to: Chicago Bulls Tickets, 1901 W. Madison Street, Chicago, IL 60612-2459. Orders must be received at least two weeks in advance of the first game ordered, and all tickets are subject to availability. Miami Heat and Los Angeles Lakers games are not available by mail.
