

NBA DRAFT 2006 NOTES/BULLS DRAFT HISTORY

ESPN COVERAGE OF NBA DRAFT 2006

Once again, the NBA Draft will be broadcast live by ESPN from The Theatre at Madison Square Garden. ESPN's coverage begins at 6:00 p.m. CT with a Pre-Draft Show. Live Draft coverage will begin at 6:30 PM CT with the Toronto Raptors on the clock with the first selection. The Bulls will follow Toronto with the second overall selection.

NBA DRAFT PROCEDURE

NBA Draft 2006 consists of 60 selections divided evenly into two rounds. The Draft will begin at 6:30 p.m. CT with opening remarks from NBA Commissioner David Stern. With the first pick, the Raptors will be on the clock at approximately 6:30 p.m. CT. The time limit is five minutes between picks in the first round and two minutes between picks in the second round. Each team will be in contact with NBA officials in New York via conference call.

STAY IN SCHOOL

With the new collective bargaining agreement in place, a domestic player must be at least 19 years of age during the calendar year in which the Draft is held, and at least one NBA season has elapsed since the player's graduation from high school, for him to be Draft eligible. All U.S. players are automatically eligible upon the end of their college eligibility. International players must be at least 19 years of age during the calendar year of the Draft. As of June 19, 2006, there were 37 collegiate and 10 international prospects that entered the Draft early. Forty-seven of the 94 players who applied for early entry withdrew their names.

PLAYOFFS + LOTTERY = BULLS

Of the 14 teams in the 2006 Lottery, Chicago is the only team in the group that made the 2006 Playoffs. The Bulls' Lottery ticket was punched courtesy of the New York Knicks, after New York went 23-59 last year. Following the Bulls/Knicks five-player trade on October 4, 2005, Chicago acquired New York's 2005 first-round pick, which translated into the second overall selection at the NBA Draft Lottery on May 23. The Bulls had a 19.90% chance to land the No. 1 pick and an 18.78% chance to claim the No. 2 selection. As part of the trade with the Knicks, New York also conveys to Chicago the right to switch first round draft picks in 2007, provided that New York's first round selection does not go to Utah (is not number 25-30), as well as New York's regular second round draft choice in 2007 and 2009.

NBA DRAFT 2005: NO BULL

2005 marked the first time in team history that the Bulls did not own a single Draft pick. In a Draft-night deal with Phoenix in 2004, the Bulls acquired the rights to Luol Deng (7th overall by Phoenix) and conveyed the rights to Jackson Vroman (31st overall by Chicago) and a future conditional first round selection (21st pick NBA Draft 2005: Nate Robinson). The Bulls' second round pick in NBA Draft 2005 (51st overall) was originally dealt to Houston on Sept. 28, 2000, in exchange for the rights to then-Rockets guard Bryce Drew*. Houston then traded the draft pick and Glen Rice to Utah for John Amaechi on Sept. 30, 2003.

* Houston also owns the rights to Chicago's 2006 second-round pick as part of the same trade.

PAXSON'S PICKS

Tonight marks the fourth NBA Draft under John Paxson's direction since he was named Bulls Executive Vice President of Basketball Operations on April 14, 2003. Through the Draft and free agency, he has rebuilt the Bulls and the team has two straight trips to the playoffs to show for it, after failing to make the postseason for six straight years. Below is a breakdown of Bulls' Draft picks under John Paxson:

NO DRAFT PICKS

DOUBLING UP

With the No. 2 selection, and its own first-round pick coming in at No. 16, Chicago is one of six NBA teams (Portland No. 4 & No. 30, New Orleans/Oklahoma City No. 12 & No. 15, New York No. 20 & No. 29, Phoenix No. 21 & No. 27 and New Jersey No. 22 & No. 23) that own multiple first-round picks. This is also the sixth time in team history that Chicago has owned multiple first-round selections:

TWO TO TANGO

This marks the fourth occasion that the Bulls have held the No. 2 pick. Past No. 2 selections in Bulls' history include: Scott May (1976), David Greenwood (1979) and most recently, Jay Williams (2002).

DRAFT NIGHT DEALS

In each of his first two drafts (2003 & 2004), Chicago Bulls Executive Vice President of Basketball Operations John Paxson pulled the trigger on a draft night trade. In 2003, Paxson's first draft as Chicago's GM, he chose Florida's Matt Bonner in the second round (45th overall) before dealing him to Toronto for a future second-round choice (38th overall in NBA Draft 2004). Then in NBA Draft 2004, Paxson drafted Iowa State's Jackson Vroman in the second round (31st overall) and immediately sent him to Phoenix for Duke product Luol Deng (7th overall by Phoenix) and a future conditional first round selection (21st overall in NBA Draft 2005: Nate Robinson).
