Senior (2006-07): Played in just nine games during his final season at Indiana ... averaged 1.7 points, 1.3 rebounds in 11.3 minutes per contest.

Junior (2007-08): Played in 30 games and started 12 times ... averaged 9.3 points and 2.3 rebounds ... shot 40.7% from three-point range ... had 43 assists, 12 blocked shots and 25 steals ... scored 18 points on a career-high six 3-pointers against Penn State (3/3/07) ... tallied 10 points at Michigan State (2/24/07) ... scored 15 points and matched his season high with five rebounds at Iowa (2/3/07) ... came off the bench to lead all scorers with 20 points, including 18 in the second half, against Wisconsin (1/31/07) ... posted second straight double-digit scoring effort with 14 points at Penn State (1/13/07) ... returned after missing two games with a wrist injury to score 16 points, including a perfect shooting night from the field (6-6) vs. Purdue (1/10/07) ... tallied 13 points, including nine in the first half, and added three steals vs. Western Michigan (12/20/06) ... led the Hoosiers with 14 points against Southern Illinois (12/17/06) ... scored in double figures for the second straight game, tallying 13 points vs. Western Illinois (12/6/06) ... tied career highs with four 3-pointers and three steals, scoring a season-high 18 points against Charlotte (12/2/06).

Sophomore (2006-07): Played in 28 contests, starting on 13 occasions ... averaged 3.5 points, 1.9 rebounds and 16.9 minutes per contest ... saw first action of the season against No. 1/1 Duke (11/30/05) after missing the opening three games with an injured right thumb ... made first start of the season against Kentucky (12/10/05) and notched a career-high with 21 second-half points in the IU victory ... came off the bench and scored all 11 of his points in the first half at Penn State (2/15/06), including a season-high three three-point field goals ... started at guard against Michigan (3/4/06) and had five points to go along with a career-high tying three assists ... pulled down a season-high seven rebounds and equaled a season-best with two blocks to go along with five points against Penn State (2/22/06) ... had a solid game off the bench against Connecticut (2/4/06) with five points and three rebounds in 16 minutes.

Freshman (2005-06): Stepped in immediately, competing in 26 contests, starting 14 times ... led team in three-point field goal percentage, hitting 24-of-55 shots from behind the arc for a team-best .436 percentage ... had he averaged one three-pointer made per game, his percentage would have placed him second among the Big Ten three-point shooting leaders ... finished the year with an average of 5.8 points, 2.8 rebounds and 21.3 minutes per contest ... stepped up overall game in league play, averaging 7.5 points and 3.4 boards, while shooting .526 from the floor and .477 from three-point range ... had first career double-double, accounting for 16 points and 10 rebounds in 33 minutes of action at Northwestern (1/5/05) ... accounted for 15 points, four rebounds and a career-high three steals in victory over Minnesota (2/12/05) ... had seven points, six boards and a career-high four blocks in the double-overtime win at Purdue (1/15/05) ... with his four blocks against Purdue, he became the first IU guard to have at least four blocks in a game since Greg Graham achieved the feat with four swats against Texas A&M on Dec. 28, 1989 ... collected 15 points in 20 minutes of action vs. Purdue (2/22/05) ... had 13 points, three rebounds, three assists and two steals in 29 minutes of action against Penn State (2/2/05) ... received first career start against Ball State (12/28/04) and contributed four points and two blocks.
