Pro Career Highlights: Played with the Nigerian National Team in the 2006 FIBA World Championships, averaging 4.3 points and 4.5 rebounds. Played with DKV Joventut Badalona in Spain in 2005-06. Averaged 6.2 points and 2.8 rebounds in the Spanish ACB League. Spent the 2004-05 season in Italy with Villaggio Solidago Livorno, averaging 11.5 points and 8.1 rebounds. Played with Union Olimpija Ljubljana in 2003-04. Averaged 5.7 points and 3.9 rebounds in the Adriatic League, and 6.7 points and 4.8 rebounds in the Euroleague.

College Highlights: Finished collegiate career as the third all-time leading shot blocker in Michigan State history with 88. Also ranked sixth all-time in career field goal percentage (.569) and fourth in games played (133).

Senior (2002-03): Averaged 7.4 points and 5.3 rebounds. Started all 35 games. Scored in double figures 12 times. Led team with a season-high 21 points and grabbed eight rebounds vs. Oklahoma State. Registered 16 points and seven rebounds vs. Toledo. Recorded a 11-point, 12-rebound double-double at Minnesota. Scored 13 points, grabbed a team-high seven rebounds, and dished out four assists vs. Syracuse. Led team with eight rebounds vs. Maryland in the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA Tournament.

Junior (2001-02): Averaged 7.7 points and 6.3 rebounds (ranked eighth in the Big Ten). Started all 31 games. Scored in double figures nine times. Posted a season-high 17 points and grabbed ten rebounds at Indiana. Pulled down a season-high 11 rebounds three times, vs. Lamar, UNC-Asheville, and Iowa. Scored 14 points at Penn State. Tallied 14 points and nine rebounds in the season opener vs. Detroit. Shared the team lead in rebounding with seven vs. North Carolina State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Sophomore (2000-01): Averaged 4.7 points and 3.1 rebounds in 17.7 minutes a contest. Led team in field goal percentage (.624). Started 24 of 33 games. Recorded first career double-double with ten points and a season-high 12 rebounds vs. Seton Hall. Posted a season-high 13 points vs. Fresno State in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Freshman (1999-00): Averaged 2.9 points and 3.0 rebounds in 13.6 minutes a contest for Michigan State's national championship team. Started five times. Tallied a season-high nine points, five rebounds and three blocked shots vs. Connecticut. Pulled down a season-high eight rebounds twice, vs. Indiana and Northwestern.
