Pro Career Highlights: Played with the UBC Mattersburg 49ers in Austria in 2005-06, averaging 18.7 points, 3.8 rebounds, and 4.4 assists. Started the season in China with the Zhejiang Wanma Cyclones (statistics unavailable). Played with the Pennsylvania Valley Dawgs in the USBL in the summer of 2005, averaging 11.0 points and 2.5 rebounds in 11 games. Spent the 2004-05 season with Kraftwerk Wels in Austria, averaging 13.7 points, 2.7 rebounds, and 2.6 assists in 17 games.

College Highlights: Named Pac-10 Newcomer of the Year as a junior. Ranks ninth all-time in Oregon history in career three-point field goal percentage (.397). Finished collegiate career at Oregon after playing first two seasons at Lee Junior College in Baytown, Texas. Sat out the 1999-00 season as a redshirt at Stephen F. Austin.

Senior (2003-04): Averaged 12.6 points, 4.5 rebounds, and 2.9 assists. Finished third in the Pac-10 in three-point field goal percentage (.441), the seventh-best single season mark in school history. Ranked second on the team in scoring and assists and third in rebounding. Started all 31 games. Led the team in scoring five times, including four of the last six games of the season. Scored 17 points vs. Alabama. Registered 15 points on 6-for-9 shooting vs. Fresno State. Tallied 15 points, six rebounds, and six assists at Portland. Sank five three-pointers in scoring 19 points at Washington. Dished out a career-high seven assists vs. UCLA. Scored 19 points vs. California in the Pac-10 Tournament. Earned Pac-10 All-Tournament honors. Recorded 14 points, six rebounds, and five assists vs. Colorado in the first round of the post-season NIT. Notched a career-high 22 points in the second round vs. George Mason. Scored 16 points and grabbed six rebounds at Notre Dame in the NIT quarterfinals.

Junior (2002-03): Averaged 9.3 points and 3.0 rebounds in 23.8 minutes a contest. Started four times. Scored in double figures 15 times, with a season-high 18 points at Southern Cal. Registered 17 points vs. Washington. Hit five threes on his way to 17 points vs. Stanford. Scored 16 points vs. Portland. Contributed 14 points vs. Minnesota. Tallied ten points and a season-high five assists vs. Arizona State. Pulled down a career-high ten rebounds vs. Oregon State.

Sophomore (2001-02): At Lee JC, averaged 22.3 points, 6.0 rebounds, and 3.0 assists. Led conference in three-point field goals made (123) and free throw percentage (.872) while ranking third in scoring and second in three-point field goal percentage. Helped lead Lee to a 24-10 record and a Region XIV tournament semifinals appearance.

Freshman (2000-01): Averaged 15.8 points, 4.4 rebounds, and 2.5 assists. Helped Lee to a 18-13 overall record.
