**Pro Career Highlights:** Played with the Braunschweig New Yorker Phantoms in Germany in 2006-07, averaging 5.9 points and 1.8 assists in 33 games. Scored in double figures eight times. Set season highs with 14 points and four assists vs. BG Karlsruhe.

**College Highlights:** Finished collegiate career as Georgetown's 37th all-time leading scorer with 1,014 points. Also ranks 16th all-time in assists (287) and 24th in steals (127). Started 90 of 114 career games.

**Senior (2005-06):** Averaged 10.8 points, 2.5 rebounds, and 2.5 assists. Started all 33 games. Scored in double figures 16 times. Registered career-high 25 points on 8-for-10 shooting at Oregon. Tallied 17 points, five rebounds, and four assists vs. Duke. Handed out a season-high six assists at West Virginia. Recorded 15 points and five assists vs. Notre Dame. Sank four threes in scoring 16 points at Villanova. Tied for the team lead with 16 points vs. Marquette in the Big East Tournament quarterfinals. Scored 12 points vs. eventual NCAA champion Florida in the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen.

**Junior (2004-05):** Averaged 10.8 points, 2.8 rebounds, and 2.5 assists. Started all 32 games. Scored in double figures 19 times. Hit all four three-point attempts in scoring a season-high 23 points at Pittsburgh. Matched season high with 23 points and added six assists at Rutgers. Recorded 17 points vs. Connecticut in the quarterfinals of the Big East Tournament. Tallied nine points, six assists, and a career-high-tying ten rebounds vs. Cal State Fullerton in the second round of the post-season NIT.

**Sophomore (2003-04):** Averaged 9.2 points, 4.1 rebounds, and 3.8 assists. Started all 28 games. Scored in double figures 11 times, registering a season-high 18 points vs. Connecticut. Pulled down a career-high ten rebounds vs. Norfolk State. Distributed a career-high eight assists vs. St. John's.

**Freshman (2002-03):** Averaged 5.0 points, 1.4 rebounds, and 1.2 assists in 14.5 minutes a contest. Came off the bench in all 24 games, missing six contests due to a sprained ankle. Posted season-high 16 points at Tennessee.

**Personal:** Majored in sociology with a minor in theology. Brother Ahmaad played his freshman season at Ball State in 2006-07.
