**Pro Career Highlights:** Played for the Giessen 46ers in the German Bundesliga League in 2005-06, averaging 12.9 points, 2.3 rebounds, and 1.6 assists in 26 games. Helped lead the 46ers to the Bundesliga Cup Semifinals.

**College Highlights:** Earned Second Team All-ACC honors as a junior. Also named Honorable Mention All-American by the Associated Press and earned All-District honor from the USBWA and NABC. Named to the All-ACC Third Team as a sophomore. Finished collegiate career as Georgia Tech's 13<sup>th</sup> all-time leading scorer with 1,616 points. Also ranks fourth all-time in three-point field goals made with 222. Started 98 of 122 career games.

**Senior (2004-05):** Averaged 12.6 points and 2.3 rebounds. Started 21 of 23 games, missing nine games due to a strained left hamstring. Scored in double figures 14 times and reached the twenty-point mark four times. Sank 7-for-9 from three-point range on his way to a season-high 27 points vs. Michigan. Registered 22 points in road games at Florida State and Wake Forest. Tallied 16 points and a season-high four assists vs. Gonzaga. Recorded 19 points vs. Virginia Tech in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament. Led team with 15 points vs. George Washington in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

**Junior (2003-04):** Averaged 14.9 points (seventh in the ACC) and 2.8 rebounds. Also ranked ninth in the league in field goal percentage (.421), ninth in three-point field goal percentage (.379), and tenth in field goal percentage (.781). Started 36 of 38 games. Exploded for a career-high 36 points, shooting 6-for-10 from beyond three-point range, vs. Clemson. Nailed a career-high seven three-pointers on his way to 30 points vs. North Carolina. Led team with 27 points vs. Wake Forest. Posted only career double-double with 15 points and ten rebounds at Cornell. Recorded a team-high 25 points vs. Duke in the ACC Tournament semifinals. Tallied 18 points vs. Boston College in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bounced back from a sprained ankle suffered against Nevada in the Sweet Sixteen to register 14 points and four rebounds vs. Connecticut in the NCAA Tournament championship game.

**Sophomore (2002-03):** Averaged 15.0 points (ninth in the ACC) and 2.6 rebounds. Also ranked seventh in the league in three-point field goal percentage (.396), seventh in overall field goal percentage (.461), and tenth in three-point field goals made per game (2.03). Started 28 of 30 games, missing the season opener with a sore foot. Scored 20 or more points eight times. Recorded season-highs of 25 points (shooting 9-for-13 from the field and 6-for-8 from three-point range) and seven assists vs. Troy. Scored 24 points in his first action of the season vs. Georgia. Posted 22 points at Duke. Tallied 24 points and four assists vs. North Carolina State. Led team with 23 points at Texas Tech in the quarterfinals of the post-season NIT.

**Freshman (2001-02):** Averaged 9.9 points and 2.1 rebounds in 20.3 minutes a contest. Ranked as the second-leading scorer in the ACC among freshmen. Started 13 times. Scored 23 of his season-high 25 points in the second half vs. Wake Forest. Led team with 19 points in only 16 minutes at Clemson. Posted 17 points on 7-for-12 shooting vs. North Carolina. Tallied 18 points and four assists at Virginia. Shared team lead with 16 points vs. Florida A&M in his collegiate debut. Contributed 11 points vs. Wake Forest in the ACC tournament. Earned ACC Rookie of the Week honors the last two weeks of the season.
