Pro Career Highlights: Has played professionally in Germany, China, , France, Australia and the United States since finishing his collegiate career. Played with the New Zealand Breakers in the NBL in Australia in 2006-07, averaging 19.4 points and 4.2 rebounds in 22 games. Spent the 2005-06 season with Hyeres-Toulon in France, averaging 12.5 points and 3.6 rebounds in 34 games. Played with the Hunter Valley Pirates in the NBL in Australia in 2004-05, averaging a league-high 24.3 points and 6.5 rebounds in 33 games. Named NBL Most Valuable Player. Spent some time in the USBL in the summer of 2004 with the St. Louis Skyhawks, averaging 6.0 points and 2.4 rebounds in 14 games. Started the 2003-04 season in Germany with BS Energie Braunschweig, appearing in two games before moving on to play with Shangdong Jinsidun Lions in China, averaging 23 points, five rebounds, and four assists.

College Highlights: Earned Honorable Mention All-Pac-10 honors as a senior. Finished collegiate career as California's 15th all-time leading scorer with 1,239 points. Started 88 of 126 career games.

Senior (2002-03): Averaged 15.1 points, 4.4 rebounds, and 3.0 assists. Started 30 of 31 games. Scored 20 or more points five times. Scored 24 points at USC. Recorded 21 points, five rebounds, two blocked shots, and a season-high five steals at Oregon. Led team with 21 points at UCLA. Dished out career-high seven assists vs. Washington. Matched career high with 27 points vs. Oklahoma in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Junior (2001-02): Averaged 10.3 points, 4.2 rebounds, and 1.4 assists in 22.8 minutes a contest. Started 17 of 32 games. Scored in double figures 16 times. Posted season-high 24 points at USC. Tallied 15 points, six rebounds, and a season-high six assists vs. UCLA. Registered 18 points at Arizona in the regular season finale. Recorded 22 points and seven rebounds vs. Arizona in the Pac-10 Tournament semifinals. Scored 19 points vs. Penn in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Sophomore (2000-01): Averaged 8.5 points, 2.3 rebounds, and 1.5 assists in 21.5 minutes a contest. Ranked ninth in the Pac-10 in field goal percentage (.517). Started the final 23 games of the season. Scored in double figures 11 times. Scored career-high 27 points on 10-for-13 shooting vs. Arizona State. Registered 21 points vs. Georgia in the Pete Newell Classic. Recorded 18 points at Stanford.

Freshman (1999-00): Averaged 5.5 points, 2.9 rebounds, and 1.8 assists in 19.2 minutes a contest. Started 18 of 32 games. Scored in double figures seven times. Posted season highs of 16 points and ten rebounds in a double-double performance vs. Arizona State. Tallied 12 points and six rebounds at Oregon.
