College Highlights: Named Second Team All-SEC by the league coaches as a senior. Named Third Team All-SEC by the Associated Press his junior and senior seasons. Finished collegiate career at South Carolina as the school's all-time leader in games played (132). Also ranks sixth all-time in points scored (1,541), and sixth in field goals made (600) and attempted (1,266). Started 86 of 132 career games.

Senior (2004-05): Led team in scoring (16.4 ppg), rebounding (6.5 rpg), and field goal percentage (.530). Started 31 of 33 games. Scored 20 or more points five times, including a career-high 30-point effort on 11-for-14 shooting vs. Ole Miss. Recorded five double-doubles, including a 22-point, season-high 13-rebound performance vs. Temple. Posted 13 points and ten rebounds at Kansas. Scored 20 points vs. Tennessee. Registered 18 points and a season-high 13 rebounds vs. Florida.

Junior (2003-04): Averaged 12.2 points and 6.2 rebounds. Started 31 of 34 games. Posted three double-doubles. Registered a season-high 23 points and a career-high six steals at Clemson. Scored 12 points and grabbed a career-high 16 rebounds vs. Gardner-Webb. Posted 12 points, 12 rebounds, and a career-high five blocked shots at Richmond. Tallied 15 points, nine rebounds, four assists, and four steals vs. Kentucky. Scored 11 points vs. Memphis in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Sophomore (2002-03): Averaged 12.6 points and 4.3 rebounds. Started 15 of 28 games. Scored 20 or more points four times. Recorded season highs of 21 points and a career-high seven assists vs. Vanderbilt. Scored 20 points vs. Temple. Registered 19 points at North Carolina State. Posted 15 points, ten rebounds, and a season-high five steals vs. East Tennessee State in the season opener. Tallied 18 points, five rebounds, three assists.

Freshman (2001-02): Averaged 6.3 points and 2.7 rebounds in 15.7 minutes a contest. Started nine times. Scored in double figures ten times, recording a season-high 19 points at Tennessee. Tallied 17 points and six rebounds vs. UCLA and registered 11 points and five rebounds vs. Duke in the Maui Invitational. Scored 14 points and grabbed six rebounds in the first round of the SEC Tournament vs. Ole Miss.
