**Pro Career Highlights:** Participated in NBA summer league with the Portland Trail Blazers in the summer of 2008. Played with the Tulsa 66ers in the NBA Developmental League in 2007-08, averaging 5.4 points and 4.4 rebounds in 48 games. Participated in NBA training camp and NBA summer league with the Trail Blazers in the fall and summer of 2007. Played with the 66ers in the NBA D-League in 2006-07, averaging 5.9 points and 4.9 rebounds in seven games. Selected by the 66ers in the eighth round (89<sup>th</sup> pick overall) of the 2006 NBA D-League Draft. Participated in NBA summer league with the Denver Nuggets in the summer of 2006.

**College Highlights:** Finished collegiate career as Wake Forest's 15<sup>th</sup> all-time leader in blocked shots (70). Started 12 times in 112 career appearances. Scored in double figures 14 times.

**Senior (2005-06):** Averaged 5.6 points and 4.3 rebounds in 19.6 minutes a contest. Started ten of 33 games. Scored in double figures eight times, including the last five games of the season. Posted first career double-double with ten points and ten rebounds at Maryland. Notched 11 points, six rebounds, and three blocked shots vs. George Mason. Tallied 11 points and two blocked shots vs. North Carolina State. Sank three three-pointers in scoring ten points vs. Florida State in the ACC Tournament quarterfinals. Recorded career-high 15 points and pulled down seven rebounds vs. North Carolina State in the semifinals. Registered 13 points and nine rebounds vs. Duke in the ACC Tournament championship game. Scored a team-high 12 points, grabbed six rebounds, and blocked two shots at Minnesota in the post-season NIT.

**Junior (2004-05):** Averaged 3.8 points and 3.0 rebounds in 12.1 minutes a contest. Played in 32 games, starting once. Scored in double figures four times. Hit both three-point attempts in scoring 14 points vs. Yale. Scored 11 points vs. North Carolina. Tallied 11 points and eight rebounds vs. Longwood in his only start of the season. Made all four field goal attempts and scored ten points vs. Elon. Blocked three shots vs. Miami (Fla.).

**Sophomore (2003-04):** Averaged 1.4 points and 1.4 rebounds in 6.5 minutes a contest. Appeared in 16 games, missing the first seven games of the season due to a broken bone in his foot. Recorded season highs of eight points and five rebounds in 11 minutes at Clemson. Tallied five points, two rebounds, two assists, and two blocked shots vs. Brown.

**Freshman (2002-03):** Averaged 2.8 points and 2.5 rebounds in 12.8 minutes a contest. Played in all 31 games, starting one time. Scored in double figures twice. Posted a season-high 14 points vs. Bethune-Cookman. Scored six points and grabbed a season-high ten rebounds vs. Georgia Tech. Registered ten points vs. South Carolina State.

**Personal:** Majored in communications. Hobbies include sleeping, fishing, and golfing. Father, Dale, played in the NBA with Dallas, Seattle, Miami, and San Antonio.
