Pro Career Highlights: Spent the 2007-08 season in Belgium with Spotter Leuven, averaging 7.6 points and 5.6 rebounds in eight games. Played with AZS Koszalin in Poland in 2006-07, averaging 13.6 points and 7.9 rebounds in 35 games.

College Highlights: Grabbed five or more rebounds in 30 career contests. Started 21 of 113 career games.

Senior (2005-06): Averaged 8.1 points, 3.8 rebounds, and 1.0 blocked shots in 18.5 minutes a contest. Started seven times. Scored in double figures 12 times. Registered 16 points at Purdue. Tallied 13 points, all in the second half, vs. Michigan State. Tied a career-high with four blocked shots at Penn State. Recorded season-high 20 points vs. UTEP in the first round of the post-season NIT. Tallied 15 points, seven rebounds, and three steals vs. Notre Dame in the second round. Scored 16 points vs. Miami (Fla.) in the quarterfinals. Pulled down a career-high-tying ten rebounds vs. Old Dominion in the semifinals. Notched 12 points vs. South Carolina in the championship game.

Junior (2004-05): Averaged 9.3 points and 3.4 rebounds in 18.8 minutes a contest. Started 11 of 23 games, missing eight games due to a high right ankle sprain. Scored in double figures 12 times and topped the 20-point mark in three games. Registered career-high 22 points on 9-for-12 shooting vs. High Point. Recorded 21 points at UCLA, earning CBS Sports Player of the Game honors. Tallied 15 points, a season-high nine rebounds, a career-high six assists, and two blocked shots vs. Delaware State. Hit all ten free throw attempts in scoring 16 points vs. South Florida.

Sophomore (2003-04): Averaged 5.0 points and 3.4 rebounds in 15.1 minutes a contest. Started five of 22 games, missing seven games after undergoing arthroscopic surgery on his left knee. Recorded a season-high ten points in back-to-back games vs. High Point and Butler. Pulled down a season-high seven rebounds on four occasions. Blocked three shots in games vs. Indiana and Missouri in the first round of the post-season NIT. Scored ten points vs. Oregon in the semifinals of the post-season NIT.

Freshman (2002-03): Averaged 5.4 points, 3.5 rebounds, and 1.2 blocked shots in 20.4 minutes a contest. Started four times. Scored in double figures seven times. Posted a season-high 12 points, seven rebounds, and a career-high four blocks vs. Eastern Michigan. Recorded first career double-double with 11 points and a career-high ten rebounds at Illinois. Matched season-high of 12 points in games vs. San Francisco and Penn State.
