Pro Career Highlights: Participated in NBA training camp with the Charlotte Bobcats in the fall of 2007. Participated in NBA summer league with the San Antonio Spurs in 2007. Started the 2006-07 season with Bipop-Carire Reggio Emilia in Italy, averaging 8.5 points and 2.3 rebounds in 17 games. Moved on to play for PAOK Thessaloniki in Greece, averaging 7.4 points and 2.2 assists in five games. Participated in NBA summer league with the San Antonio Spurs in 2006.

College Highlights: Earned Second Team All-SEC honors from the Associated Press and the league coaches as a senior. Finished collegiate career as Tennessee's second all-time leader in assists (577), second in steals (198), sixth in three-point field goal percentage (.396), tied for eighth in three-point field goals (401), and 15th in scoring (1,424 points). Started 118 of 119 career games.

Senior (2005-06): Averaged 15.3 points (ranked eighth in the SEC), 3.1 rebounds, and 3.9 assists (ninth). Scored 20 or more points five times. Set season high of 23 points vs. Appalachian State. Registered 22 points vs. East Tennessee State in the season opener. Tallied 17 points, six rebounds, and four assists at Texas. Posted 20 points, a season-high nine rebounds, and six assists vs. Georgia. Scored 18 points at LSU. Recorded 18 points and a season-high eight assists vs. Auburn. Matched season high with 23 points vs. South Carolina in the first round of the SEC Tournament. Registered 20 points on 7-for-10 shooting vs. Wichita State in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Junior (2004-05): Averaged 11.9 points, 3.3 rebounds, and 5.0 assists (tied for first in the SEC). Opened season with a 16-point, five-rebound, four-assists, five-steal performance vs. Stanford in the Maui Invitational. Scored 14 points and dished out seven assists vs. North Carolina and scored 19 points vs. Texas in the other two games in the event. Recorded a double-double of 11 points and a career-high ten assists vs. Nebraska. Registered 18 points and six assists vs. LSU. Notched season-high 26 points vs. Kentucky in the SEC Tournament quarterfinals.

Sophomore (2003-04): Averaged 11.5 points, 4.2 rebounds, and 5.0 assists (ranked second in the SEC). Recorded season-high 17 points vs. Georgia Tech. Tallied 16 points and six assists vs. Texas A&M. Registered first career double-double with 11 points and a career-high 13 rebounds vs. Vanderbilt. Scored 15 points vs. Louisville. Tallied 16 points, six rebounds, and a season-high nine assists vs. The Citadel. Contributed 12 points at George Mason in the second round of the post-season NIT.

Freshman (2002-03): Averaged 9.1 points, 4.2 rebounds, and 5.5 assists (ranked third in the SEC). Scored in double figures 13 times, recording a season-high 17 points at Mississippi. Tallied 16 points vs. Charleston Southern. Posted 11 points, six rebounds, and six assists vs. Vanderbilt. Notched 15 points at Arkansas. Grabbed a season-high ten rebounds at Georgia. Dished out a season-high eight assists vs. VMI. Scored 15 points vs. Kentucky.
