College Highlights: Earned Third Team All-Mountain West Conference honors as a senior. Started 60 of 133 career games. Scored in double figures 35 times.

Senior (2007-08): Averaged 11.1 points, 3.3 rebounds, and a league-leading 4.8 assists. Started all 35 games. Scored in double figures 19 times. Registered a career-high 26 points on 9-for-12 shooting in the season opener vs. Montana State. Tallied 20 points and six rebounds vs. UTEP. Recorded 16 points and a season-high eight rebounds at Northern Arizona. Dished out a career-high 11 assists vs. Colorado State. Led team with 21 points on 7-for-12 shooting vs. BYU. Notched first career double-double with 22 points and ten assists vs. Utah. Scored 20 points vs. Utah in the semifinals of the MWC Tournament. Hit 11-for-14 free throws on his way to 20 points vs. BYU in the championship game on his way to earning All-Tournament Team honors. Registered eight assists vs. Kent State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Scored 12 points vs. Kansas in the second round.

Junior (2006-07): Averaged 4.5 points, 1.9 rebounds, and 1.6 assists in 19.1 minutes a contest. Scored in double figures twice. Sank 4-for-5 from three-point range in scoring a season-high 12 points at Texas Tech. Posted ten points vs. Eastern Washington. Notched a season-high seven assists at TCU. Scored nine points in back-to-back road games at Colorado State and BYU. Posted six points vs. Wisconsin in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Sophomore (2004-05): Averaged 7.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, and 2.3 assists. Started 25 of 30 games. Scored in double figures ten times. Posted season-high 15 points in games vs. Southern Utah and at TCU. Pulled down a season-high nine rebounds in the season opener vs. Long Beach State. Dished out a season-high seven assists vs. New Mexico. Scored 14 points vs. Utah.

Freshman (2003-04): Averaged 3.7 points and 1.7 rebounds in 12.2 minutes a contest. Scored in double figures four times. Recorded season highs of 17 points and nine rebounds at San Diego State. Posted 13 points at Wyoming. Tallied 13 points vs. Colorado State.
