Pro Career Highlights: Spent the 2007-08 season in the NBA Developmental League with the Los Angeles D-Fenders, averaging 6.9 points and 2.9 rebounds in 15 games. Selected by the D-Fenders in the sixth round (77th pick overall) of the 2007 NBA D-League Draft. Played with the Vancouver Volcanoes in the IBL in the summer of 2007, averaging 18.6 points and 4.8 rebounds in eight games.

College Highlights: Named First Team All-West Coast Conference as a senior. Earned honorable mention All-Conference honors as a junior. Finished collegiate career at Portland after playing freshman season at Eastern Washington. Left Eastern Washington at the start of the 2002-03 season and attended Portland Community College during 2003-04, but did not play. Granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA in April of 2006 due to extreme hardship of his family situation.

Senior (2006-07): Averaged a team-high 12.1 points, 4.3 rebounds, and 2.4 assists. Started 18 of 23 games, missing nine contests due to a pulled hamstring. Scored in double figures 14 times and surpassed the 20-point mark twice. Recorded season-high 28 points vs. Loyola Marymount. Tallied 23 points, five rebounds, and four assists vs. Montana. Tallied 19 points, seven rebounds, and four assists vs. Pepperdine and posted a 16-point, 11-rebound double-double in the rematch. Dished out a season-high seven assists vs. San Francisco. Scored 13 points and grabbed nine rebounds vs. Loyola Marymount in the first round of the WCC Tournament.

Junior (2005-06): Averaged a team-high 14.9 points, 2.2 rebounds, and 2.2 assists. Started 25 of 27 games. Scored 20 or more points ten times, including one stretch of six consecutive games. Recorded season-high 25 points on 8-for-12 shooting vs. Oregon State. Hit four threes on his way to 24 points at Montana State. Tallied 21 points and a season-high six rebounds vs. Oregon. Led team with 23 points vs. Gonzaga. Registered 23 points vs. Pepperdine and scored 24 points in the rematch. Dished out a season-high seven assists vs. Loyola Marymount. Sank all 14 free throw attempts on his way to 20 points vs. San Francisco.

Sophomore (2004-05): Averaged 11.4 points, 2.7 rebounds, and 2.3 assists. Started 26 of 30 games. Scored 20 or more points four times, all within the last five games of the season. Sank 6-for-9 from three-point range on his way to 21 points at Pepperdine. Tallied 14 points and a season-high seven rebounds at UC Riverside. Distributed a season-high five assists at Loyola Marymount. Recorded 20 points vs. Gonzaga. Registered a season-high 23 points vs. San Francisco in the first round of the WCC Tournament.

Freshman (2001-02): At Eastern Washington, averaged 6.5 points, 1.6 rebounds, and 2.1 assists in 17.1 minutes a contest. Started three times. Scored in double figures nine times. Registered season highs of 16 points and five rebounds vs. Idaho State. Tallied 11 points and a season-high eight assists vs. Northwest College. Scored 13 points in his collegiate debut vs. St. Joseph's.
