Pro Career Highlights: Spent the 2005-06 season playing in Italy and Israel. With Edimes Pavia in the Italian Legadue, averaged 17.1 points, 3.9 rebounds, and 3.2 assists in 12 games. With Ramat-Hasharon in the Israeli League, averaged 15.4 points, 2.8 rebounds, and 2.0 assists in 22 games. Participated in NBA summer league with the Dallas Mavericks in the summer of 2005.

College Highlights: Named NCAA Division II Player of the Year by Daktronics and the Division II Bulletin. Also earned All-American honors from Daktronics, Basketball Times, and the NABC. Named to the Great Lakes Region First Team by Daktronics his junior and senior seasons. A unanimous pick for Great Lakes Valley Conference Player of the year as a senior. Earned First Team All-Great Lakes Valley Conference honors his sophomore, junior, and senior seasons. Finished collegiate career as the all-time leading scorer in Indianapolis and GLVC history with 2,352 points.

Senior (2004-05): Led the nation in scoring (28.6 ppg). Also led the GLVC in three-point field goals made per game (4.1, ranked third nationally), ranked third in assists (5.0 apg), and second in steals (1.9 spg). Started all 29 games. Scored 20 or more points 26 times, 30 or more points 13 times, and topped the 40-point mark twice. Exploded for a season-high 46 points on 19-for-28 shooting vs. Bellarmine. Posted 42 points on 13-for-28 shooting (including 7-for-15 from three-point range) and nine rebounds vs. Northern Kentucky. Scored 36 points and grabbed a season-high six steals vs. Quincy. Registered a double-double of 32 points and a season-high ten assists at Missouri-St. Louis.

Junior (2003-04): Led the GLVC in scoring (20.6 ppg) and three-point field goals made per game (3.0) and ranked fourth in steals (1.8 spg). Started all 30 games. Scored 30 or more points four times. Recorded a career-high 47 points on 15-for-21 shooting, 6-for-9 from three-point range, at Kentucky Wesleyan. Tallied 44 points at Northern Kentucky. Tallied 27 points, a season-high eight assists, and three steals vs. Ferris State.

Sophomore (2002-03): Ranked second in the GLVC in scoring (19.4 ppg) and third in steals (1.8 spg). Ranked second on the team in assists (3.1 apg). Started all 29 games. Scored 30 or more points five times. Registered season-high 35 points and six steals vs. Grand Valley State in the season opener. Tallied 30 points, eight rebounds, and four steals at Southern Indiana. Scored 17 points and dished out a season-high seven assists at Wisconsin-Parkside.

Freshman (2001-02): Averaged 12.7 points, 3.0 rebounds, and 2.0 assists. Started 19 of 27 games. Scored 20 or more points four times. Posted season-high 23 points and grabbed eight rebounds vs. Quincy. Scored 22 points at Kentucky Wesleyan. Earned Honorable Mention All-Conference honors.
