College Highlights: Played in 123 games earning 21 starts ... averaged 2.3 points, 3.0 rebounds in 4.5 minutes.

Senior (2008-09): Played in 35 games with three starts ... one of 63 players in school history to play in 100 games ... shooting .519 (28-of-54) from the field ... has five or more rebounds in six games with two double-digit rebound contests ... has nine games with two steals and has blocked a shot in 14 contests ... made 2-of-3 from the field for four points to go with two rebounds, two blocked shots and one steal on senior night against No. 24 Florida State (3/3) ... had a streak of 50 consecutive games played snapped after sitting out the St. John's game (2/19) due to a stomach virus.

Junior (2007-08): Played in 30 games with four starts ... Averaged 1.0 points and 1.9 rebounds per game, while shooting 43.8 percent (14-of-32) from the field ... Grabbed four rebounds and had one steal in 14 minutes against West Virginia (3/22) in the second round of the NCAA Tournament ... Came off the bench to contribute six points, six rebounds, three assists, one block and three steals in two games at the ACC Tournament ... Had two points and five rebounds and against Clemson (3/15) in the quarterfinal game ... posted four points, two assists and three steals in 15 minutes against Georgia Tech (3/14) in the semifinals ...; Tallied a season-high six rebounds to go with two assists and two steals in the ACC opener against Virginia (1/13) ... Missed the first two games of the season recovering from knee surgery performed in August. Missed the 2005-06 season recovering from offseason knee surgery (left) to repair an osteochondral lesion on his patella.

Sophomore (2005-06): Played in 33 contests, making 11 starts ... Averaged 4.2 points and 4.9 rebounds in 21.7 minutes per game ... Shot .491 from the field (54-of-110) ... Tied for second on the team in steals with 39 ... Also second on the team in offensive rebounds and blocked shots ... Had two double-figure scoring and double-figure rebounding games ... Led the team in rebounds seven times ... Had five or more rebounds in a game 19 times ... Pulled down five rebounds and added one assist and one block against N.C. State (3/8) in the opening round of the ACC Tournament ... Scored six points on 3-of-3 shooting from the field to go along with six rebounds and a steal against Columbia (11/12) in the first round of the CBE Classic.

Freshman (2004-05): Saw action in 25 games and earned three starting assignments ... Averaged 1.7 points, 1.4 rebounds and 0.4 assists in 7.4 minutes per game ... Shot .436 from the floor (17-of-39) and .533 from the free throw line (8-of-15) ... 20 of his 34 total rebounds were on the offensive glass ... Collected three rebounds in three minutes in the ACC Championship game versus Georgia Tech (3/13) ... Set season highs with nine points, five rebounds, three field goals and one three-point field goal versus Virginia (3/11).

Personal: Father, Jim, is a physical therapist and his mother, Betty, is a registered nurse ... Has an older sister, Laura ... Father played basketball from 1966-70 at Davis and Elkins College ... Recipient of President's Education Award for Outstanding Academic Achievement in 2004 ... Volunteered his time for Dads for Kids Inc. ... Hobbies include listening to music, singing, working on computers, playing video games and watching movies ... Favorite athlete is Michael Jordan ... Was born the day after Duke played in its first NCAA title game under Mike Krzyzewski
