Professional Career: Has averaged 2.0 points, 0.8 rebounds, 0.8 assists and 7.4 minutes in 62 games (no starts) in two NBA seasons with Boston ... 2008-09 (Boston): Averaged 2.0 points, 0.9 rebounds, 0.8 assists and 7.8 minutes in 47 games (no starts)...Registered a career-high with nine points and added four assists vs. New Jersey, Jan. 14...Recorded career-highs of six assists, three steals and 21 minutes to go with seven points vs. Washington (Apr. 15)...Saw action in four playoff games and averaged 0.5 assists and 2.8 minutes per game ... 2007-08 (Boston): Averaged 2.1 points, 0.9 assists and 6.3 minutes in 15 games as a rookie...Scored a season-high seven points in five minutes of action vs. Milwaukee, Dec. 14...Assigned to the Utah Flash of the NBA Development League three times during the season and averaged 18.6 points, 2.8 rebounds and 3.9 assists in 18 games with the Flash...Was inactive for the 2008 playoffs.

Career Transactions: Selected by the Boston Celtics following his junior season in the second round (32nd overall) in the 2007 NBA Draft ... Signed by New York as a free agent on Sep. 11, 2009.

Junior (2005-06): After sitting out the first 11 games of the season due to academic issues, returned to action on Dec. 22 vs. Kansas State. Came off the bench in the loss, playing 20 minutes and going 0-for-3 from the floor, 2-for-3 from the line and committing four turnovers ... For the second straight season won the Joe Barbato Award for the top free throw percentage on the Trojans (.800).

Sophomore (2005-06): Started 25 games for USC and finished second on the team and fifth in the Pac-10 with a 16.9 scoring average, while grabbing 4.0 rebounds and dishing out 3.1 assists per game. Named to the All-Pac-10 first team along with teammate Nick Young becoming the first pair of Trojans to make the team since 1992 (Duane Cooper and Harold Miner). Also selected to the NABC District 15 first team. Recorded his first career double-double on Dec. 3 vs. BYU, scoring 17 points and pulling down a career-high 10 rebounds

Freshman (2004-05): Earned team co-MVP honors along with fellow freshman Nick Young as the pair put together two of the best freshman seasons by Trojan basketball players in school history. Led the Trojans in points (356), scoring average (12.3), three-point percentage (.450), assists (92) and steals (56) en route to being named to the Pac-10 All-Freshman team. His three-point field goal percentage set a school record and he hit a .547 clip (41 of 75) in the second half of the season.
