Professional Highlights: Drafted by the Utah Flash in the 2nd round of the 2009 NBA D-League Draft. Started four times for the Flash during the 2008-09 season. Scored in double figures 13 times, including a career-high 28 points on two occasions (12/15 vs. Reno; 1/2 vs. Austin). Played in all four of the Flash's 2009 post-season games. Scored 11 points in the second game of the 2009 NBA D-League Finals when the Flash fell to the Colorado 14ers. Earned an invitation to the 2008 Portsmouth Invitational Tournament held by the NBA each spring.

College Highlights: Finished collegiate career as North Carolina State's 24th all-time leading scorer with 1,342 points. Also ranks tied for third in school history in games played (132) and tenth in minutes played (3,430). Started 79 of 132 career games. Scored 20 or more points 15 times.

Senior (2007-08): Averaged 13.1 points, 4.5 rebounds, and 2.9 assists. Started all 31 games. Scored 20 or more points five times. Recorded career-high 26 points on 9-for-11 shooting at Duke. Tallied 25 points and six rebounds at East Carolina. Registered 23 points and seven rebounds vs. South Carolina State. Notched 15 points and a season-high eight rebounds at Villanova. Led team with 23 points at Seton Hall. Dished out a season-high seven assists vs. Georgia Tech. Scored 16 points, grabbed seven rebounds, and dished out five assists at Wake Forest.

Junior (2006-07): Averaged 14.7 points, 5.3 rebounds, and 3.8 assists (ranked tenth in the ACC). Started 35 of 36 games. Scored 20 or more points six times. Recorded season-highs in points (24) and blocked shots (3) at Wake Forest. Posted 22 points in back-to-back games vs. Boston College and Clemson. Registered an 18-point, career-high 13-rebound double-double to go along with six assists vs. UNC Greensboro. Tallied 16 points, ten rebounds, and a season-high three steals at Virginia Tech. Dished out a career-high-matching ten assists at Cincinnati. Earned All-ACC Tournament honors after averaging 14.8 points. Posted a 13-point, 12-rebound double-double vs. Marist in the first round of the post-season NIT.

Sophomore (2005-06): Averaged 8.3 points, 4.7 rebounds, and 2.3 assists in 22.8 minutes a contest. Ranked tenth in the ACC in free throw shooting (.746). Started nine times. Scored 20 or more points three times. Tallied 22 points and a season-high nine rebounds vs. Delaware. Recorded a double-double of 13 points and a career-high ten assists vs. Stetson. Posted 21 points, eight rebounds, and a season-high three blocked shots at Wake Forest. Scored a season-high 24 points on 9-for-13 shooting vs. Wake Forest in the first round of the ACC Tournament.

Freshman (2004-05): Averaged 4.2 points and 2.4 rebounds in 13.1 minutes a contest. Started four times. Scored in double figures four times. Posted a season-high 14 points in games at Virginia Tech and North Carolina. Pulled down a season-high ten rebounds vs. Florida State. Tallied 13 points and five rebounds vs. Georgia Tech.
