Pro Career Highlights: Played with the Idaho Stampede in the CBA in 2005-06, averaging 3.3 points and 4.0 rebounds. Started the summer of 2005 with the Pennsylvania Valley Dogs and the Nebraska Cranes in the USBL, averaging 3.9 points and 3.5 rebounds in 27 total games. Moved on to play for Lechuqueros de Leon in Mexico, averaging 10.0 points and 6.0 rebounds in 22 games. Split the 2004-05 season between the Rockford Lightning and the Michigan Mayhem. In 35 games, starting 23, averaged 3.7 points and 3.0 rebounds. In the summer of 2004 with Coras de Tepic in Mexico, averaged 12.2 points and 7.6 rebounds in 13 games. Spent the 2003-04 season in the ABA with the Kansas City Knights, averaging 2.4 points and 2.2 rebounds. Started the summer of 2003 with the Texas Rim Rockers in the USBL, averaged 5.3 points and 4.7 rebounds in 11 games. Moved on to play for the G&H Hawks in New Zealand, averaging 12.0 points and 9.8 rebounds in ten games. In 2001-02, played with NTNT Haaglanden in The Netherlands, averaging 5.6 points and 4.2 rebounds in 13 games.

College Highlights: Four-year letterman who started 15 of 106 career games. Scored in double figures four times. Finished with career totals of 225 points and 250 rebounds.

Senior (2000-01): Averaged 1.0 points and 1.3 rebounds in 6.0 minutes a contest. Scored season-high eight points and tied a season-high with six rebounds vs. Memphis. Grabbed six rebounds at Cincinnati. Tallied two points and four rebounds vs. DePaul. Pulled down three rebounds vs. Xavier.

Junior (1999-00): Averaged 1.7 points and 2.2 rebounds in 9.4 minutes a contest. Scored a season-high eight points and matched a season-high with six rebounds vs. Xavier. Posted six points and a season-high six rebounds vs. Dayton. Grabbed five rebounds at Baylor.

Sophomore (1998-99): Averaged 3.4 points and 3.5 rebounds in 14.1 minutes a contest. Started 12 of 29 games. Led the team in rebounding three times. Scored in double figures three times. Recorded career highs of 14 points and 13 rebounds vs. Illinois Chicago. Matched career high with 14 points vs. Baylor.

Freshman (1997-98): Averaged 2.1 points and 2.3 rebounds in 8.1 minutes a contest. Played in 30 games and started three times. Shot 4-for-4 from the field in scoring ten points at DePaul. Tallied five points and six rebounds vs. Boston College in his first career start. Grabbed a season-high eight rebounds vs. Creighton in the first round of the post-season NIT.
