Pro Career Highlights: Played briefly in Iceland in 2006-07, averaging 17.0 points and 6.3 rebounds in four games. Appeared in three games in the French ProB League with Evreux in 2005-06, averaging 7.7 points and 3.7 rebounds. Selected by the Albuquerque Thunderbirds in the eighth round (85th pick overall) of the 2006 NBA Developmental League Draft.

College Highlights: Named Preseason NIT Most Valuable Player in 2003. Mainly came off the bench during his four year career at Georgia Tech, but started 34 times in 126 career games played.

Senior (2004-05): Averaged 8.4 points and 5.0 rebounds in 23.3 minutes a contest. Started 22 of 29 games. Missed much of the post-season due to patellar tendonitis in his right knee. Scored in double figures 11 times, with a season-high 17 points on 7-for-11 shooting vs. Wake Forest. Also dished out a career-high six assists vs. the Demon Deacons. Recorded 16 points vs. Charleston Southern. Grabbed a season-high ten rebounds in the season opener vs. Alabama State. Registered 15 points at Maryland.

Junior (2003-04): Averaged 9.3 points and 4.7 rebounds in 19.9 minutes a contest. Started six times. Scored in double figures 16 times, and led the team in scoring in three games. Scored a career-high 22 points on 9-for-13 shooting vs. Connecticut in the pre-season NIT semifinals. Shot 7-for-7 from the field on his way to 16 points vs. Texas Tech in the pre-season NIT finals. Pulled down a career-high 12 rebounds vs. St. John's. Scored 12 points at Duke. Tallied eight points and nine rebounds in the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament vs. Kansas. Posted ten points in the NCAA Tournament championship game vs. Connecticut.

Sophomore (2002-03): Averaged 5.9 points and 3.9 rebounds in 18.3 minutes a contest. Started six times. Scored in double figures seven times. Posted season highs of 15 points and nine rebounds in the season opener vs. Arkansas-Pine Bluff. Registered 13 points vs. Tennessee. Tallied ten points vs. North Carolina State in the ACC Tournament. Recorded 11 points and seven rebounds at Iowa in the second round of the post-season NIT.

Freshman (2001-02): Averaged 7.1 points and 3.1 rebounds in 18.4 minutes a contest. Missed three games with various injuries. Scored in double figures eight times, with a season-high 16 points on 7-for-11 shooting vs. Wake Forest in the ACC Tournament. Recorded 15 points at Maryland. Scored 12 points and grabbed a season-high seven rebounds vs. Florida State.
