Pro Career Highlights: Participated in NBA training camp with the Denver Nuggets in the fall of 2008. Originally an early entry candidate for the 2007 NBA Draft before withdrawing his name from consideration.

College Highlights: Finished collegiate career as Clemson's seventh all-time leader in steals (166) and ninth in blocked shots (94). Started 81 of 108 career games.

Senior (2007-08): Averaged 10.7 points and 6.8 rebounds. Started 28 of 29 games. Posted three double-doubles. Posted season-high 20 points and nine rebounds at Maryland. Tallied 18 points on 8-for-13 shooting at Alabama. Recorded a double-double of 16 points and a season-high 11 rebounds vs. Florida State. Notched 17 points and a career-high six steals in the season opener vs. Furman. Scored 16 points vs. Duke in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament. Earned Second Team All-ACC Tournament honors.

Junior (2006-07): Averaged 12.2 points and 6.4 rebounds. Started 34 of 36 games. Posted seven double-doubles. Registered career-high 22 points vs. Georgia Southern. Matched season-high of 22 points and added a season-high 15 rebounds at Maryland. Tallied 14 points, 11 rebunds, a season-high seven assists, and a season-high four blocked shots vs. Western Carolina. Scored 19 points and grabbed ten rebounds vs. Miami (Fla.).

Sophomore (2005-06): Averaged 9.2 points and 7.6 rebounds. Started the first 11 games of the season before being declared academically ineligible. Scored in double figures five times. Posted season-high 18 points and four blocked shots vs. Coppin State. Registered ten points and 13 rebounds at Charleston Southern. Pulled down a season-high 14 rebounds vs. Bethune-Cookman.

Freshman (2004-05): Averaged 4.3 points and 3.4 rebounds in 16.0 minutes a contest. Started eight times. Scored in double figures twice. Tallied a season-high 11 points in the season opener vs. Hampton. Recorded ten points and five rebounds vs. Georgia Tech.

Personal: Majored in sport management. Father, Hardrick, played collegiately at Shaw University.
