Pro Career Highlights: Played with five teams in the NBA from 1998-99 to 2004-05. Participated in NBA training camp with the Denver Nuggets in the fall of 2007. Played with the Santa Barbara Breakers in the IBL in the summer of 2007 (statistics unavailable). Started the 2006-07 season with Azovmash Mariupol of Ukraine in the Superleague before moving on to play with Vive Menorca in Spain, averaging 6.4 points and 5.4 rebounds in eight games. Spent the 2005-06 season with Viola Reggio Calabria in Italy, averaging 16.4 points and 10.9 rebounds in 16 games. Participated in NBA training camp with the Milwaukee Bucks in the fall of 2005 before signing to play with the Atlanta Hawks, averaging 1.5 points and 2.1 rebounds in ten games. Joined the Long Beach Jam in the ABA the same year, averaging 14.0 points and 6.0 rebounds in three games before moving on to play for Jiangsu Nangang Dragons Nanjing in China, averaging 15.8 points and 6.3 rebounds in 12 games. Briefly played for the Cleveland Cavaliers in 2003-04, appearing in two games and going scoreless. Played with the Toronto Raptors in 2002-03, averaging 6.8 points and 5.3 rebounds in 67 games. Spent the 2001-02 season with the Los Angeles Lakers, averaging 1.2 points and 1.2 rebounds in 21 games. With the Seattle SuperSonics in 2000-01, averaged 4.5 points and 3.6 rebounds in 70 games. With the SuperSonics in 1999-00, averaged 4.3 points and 3.1 rebounds in 58 games. In his rookie season with the SuperSonics in 1998-99, averaged 5.1 points and 3.0 rebounds in 26 games. Selected by the Sonics in the second round (33rd pick overall) of the 1998 NBA Draft. An early entry candidate for the 1998 NBA Draft.

College Highlights: Ranks as UCLA's all-time leader in field goal percentage (.694) and blocked shots (188). As a junior, joined the team in December after being suspended for violating team and university rules and averaged 9.9 points and 7.1 rebounds. As a sophomore, averaged 10.9 points and 6.5 rebounds. Set a school single season record for field goal percentage (.756). Earned First Team All-Pac-10 honors. As a freshman, averaged 10.2 points and 6.9 rebounds. Earned Pac-10 All-Freshman Team honors.

Personal: Nicknames are "Big Lon" and "J-Mac". Favorite NBA player growing up was Magic Johnson. Is an accomplished singer.
