Pro Career Highlights: Originally an early entry candidate for the 2005 NBA Draft before withdrawing his name from consideration.

College Highlights: Named First Team All-Big West as a senior. Earned Honorable Mention honors as a junior. Finished collegiate career as Long Beach State's all-time leader in three-point field goals made with 252 (ranking sixth in Big West history). Also ranks ninth all-time in scoring with 1,241 career points. Started 87 of 114 career games.

Senior (2005-06): Averaged 14.1 points, 1.5 rebounds, and 1.5 assists. Season total of 87 made three-pointers set a new school record. Started 27 of 30 games. Recorded career-high 27 points, hitting 6-for-9 from three-point range, at Cal State Northridge. Scored 24 points vs. UC Santa Barbara and UC Irvine. Tallied 23 points and four steals at Cal State Fullerton. Scored 15 points at California. Tallied 19 points and three rebounds at UC Santa Barbara. Hit six threes in scoring 18 points vs. UC Irvine in the Big West Tournament semifinals.

Junior (2004-05): Averaged a team-high 12.7 points, 2.2 rebounds, and 2.3 assists. Started 27 of 30 games. Scored 20 or more points five times. Posted season-high 24 points twice, vs. UC Riverside and at Cal State Northridge. Shot 8-for-11 from the field (5-for-8 from three-point range) in scoring 21 points vs. Portland. Tallied 18 points, a season-high six rebounds, and five assists at Cal Poly. Scored 17 points vs. UC Santa Barbara in the regular season finale.

Sophomore (2003-04): Averaged 10.2 points, 2.0 rebounds, and 2.9 assists. Ranked second on the team in scoring and assists. Started 21 of 27 games. Scored in double figures 11 times, with a season-high 21 points vs. Cal Poly. Sank five threes in scoring 20 points vs. Cal State Fullerton. Posted 18 points at Portland and vs. UC Irvine. Scored 17 points at Pepperdine. Dished out a season-high seven assists vs. Utah State.

Freshman (2002-03): Averaged 6.0 points, 1.4 rebounds, and 2.1 assists in 20.9 minutes a contest. Started 12 times, including the last 11 games of the season. Scored in double figures five times. Recorded season-high 19 points vs. UC Santa Barbara. Scored 17 points at Utah State. Tallied 14 points and three assists vs. Pacific. Registered ten points and a career-high seven assists vs. Cal State Fullerton. Named to the Big West All-Freshman Team.

Personal: Majored in communications. Father, Craig, also a Long Beach State alumnus, played ten years in the NBA with the Chicago Bulls, Phoenix Suns, and San Diego Clippers.
