**Three-point field goals:** 2005-06, 20-for-57 (.351).

**Pro Career Highlights:** Started the 2005-06 season with the Toledo Ice in the ABA (statistics unavailable). Moved on to play for FC Kaiserslautern in the German 2.Bundesliga league, playing in eight games and averaging 26.1 points, 6.5 rebounds, 4.4 assists, and 4.3 steals.

**College Highlights:** Named First Team All-Mid-American Conference as a senior. Earned Honorable Mention All-Conference honors as a junior. Finished collegiate career as Toledo's all-time leader in steals (278), second in games played (119), third in scoring (1,812 points), fourth in three-point field goals made (170), third in free throws made (430), and fifth in field goals made (607).

**Senior (2004-05):** Led team in scoring (15.1 ppg) and steals (2.59 spg, ranked first in the MAC). Scored 20 or more points seven times. Posted season-high 28 points vs. Nevada. Scored 15 points and dished out a season-high eight assists at East Carolina. Tallied 24 points, six rebounds, four assists, and four steals at Buffalo. Posted 21 points and six rebounds vs. Western Michigan. Registered 19 points, four rebounds, and five assists vs. Eastern Michigan. Scored 26 points and grabbed seven rebounds at Bowling Green. Tallied 22 points and five assists at Marshall.

**Junior (2003-04):** Led team in scoring (19.6 ppg, ranked second in the MAC), rebounding (4.7 rpg), and steals (2.5 spg, first), and ranked second in assists (3.1 apg). Also ranked third in the league in free throw percentage (.804) and three-point field goal percentage (.415). Started all 31 games. Paced team in scoring 24 times. Posted season-high 29 points vs. DePaul and Western Michigan. Tallied 25 points, a season-high eight rebounds, and four steals at Central Michigan. Registered 22 points and dished out a career-high seven assists vs. Buffalo. Matched season high with 29 points vs. Buffalo in the MAC Tournament quarterfinals. Scored 26 points vs. Western Michigan in the semifinals. Led team with 20 points vs. Marquette in the first round of the post-season NIT.

**Sophomore (2002-03):** Led team in scoring (16.9 ppg, ranked ninth in the MAC) and rebounding (5.8 rpg). Also ranked second in the league in steals (2.4 spg). Started 28 of 29 games. Set career high with 31 points on 10-for-11 shooting vs. Ohio University. Named MAC Player of the Week after posting 21 points in back-to-back wins over Wright State and Detroit. Registered 29 points at Northern Illinois. Scored 28 points at Buffalo.

**Freshman (2001-02):** Averaged 9.3 points and a team-high 6.0 rebounds. Ranked fourth in the MAC in steals (1.93 spg). Started 26 of 30 games. Scored in double figures 12 times. Posted first career double-double with 18 points and a career-high 12 rebounds vs. Marshall. Registered 16 points and a season-high five steals vs. Youngstown State. Scored 12 points at Cincinnati. Recorded a season-high 25 points and eight rebounds vs. Eastern Michigan in the first round of the MAC Tournament. Posted 22 points and nine rebounds in the second round.

**Personal:** Grandfather, the late Mel Triplett, was a star fullback at Toledo in the 1950's.
