Pro Career Highlights: Participated in NBA training camp with the Orlando Magic in the fall of 2007.

College Highlights: Named Third Team All-Mountain West as a senior. Earned Honorable Mention All-Pac-10 honors as a junior. Finished collegiate career at UNLV after playing first three seasons at Arizona State. Was eligible to play immediately at UNLV because of a NCAA rule passed allowing athletes with a fifth year of eligibility to transfer and play immediately provided they have graduated with a bachelor's degree. Redshirted the 2002-03 season at Arizona State. Ranks as Arizona State's fifth all-time leader in three-point field goals made (181) and seventh in three-point field goal percentage (.376).

Senior (2006-07): Ranked third on the team in scoring (13.5 ppg) while leading the Mountain West Conference in assists (5.1 apg). Started 30 of 31 games, missing two contests due to an ankle injury. Scored 20 or more points six times. Posted season-high 29 points on 8-for-11 shooting, 7-for-9 from three-point range, and added nine assists at New Mexico. Hit eight threes on his way to 25 points while dishing out eight assists vs. Utah. Scored 16 points at Arizona. Posted a double-double of 14 points and ten assists vs. Air Force. Scored 21 points vs. Utah in the first round of the Mountain West Tournament. Tallied 21 points and nine assists vs. Colorado State in the semifinals. Registered ten points and four steals vs. BYU in the championship game, on his way to Tournament MVP honors. Recorded 16 points, a season-high six rebounds, and seven assists vs. Wisconsin in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Scored 15 points vs. Oregon in the Sweet 16.

Junior (2005-06): At Arizona State, averaged 15.0 points (ranked ninth in the Pac-10), 3.4 rebounds, and 3.5 assists (tenth). Also led the league in three-point field goals made per game (2.89). Started all 28 games. Scored 20 or more points seven times. Recorded season-high 27 points vs. Minnesota. Scored 23 points vs. Arizona, Washington, and at Washington State. Dished out a season-high six assists on four occasions. Sank five threes in scoring 22 points vs. Oregon State in the first round of the Pac-10 Tournament.

Sophomore (2004-05): Averaged 11.0 points, 2.6 rebounds, and 3.4 assists (ranked ninth in the Pac-10). Started 11 of 32 games. Tallied 17 points and five assists vs. USC and registered 17 points and six assists in the rematch. Scored 17 points vs. Valparaiso. Sank five threes in scoring 17 points at Washington. Posted season-high 22 points vs. Washington in the first round of the Pac-10 Tournament.

Freshman (2003-04): Averaged 5.3 points and 2.1 assists in 16.6 minutes a contest. Started four times. Scored in double figures five times. Recorded season highs of 22 points and six assists at Arizona. Tallied 20 points at Oregon State. Scored 16 points and grabbed a season-high six rebounds vs. USC. Registered 17 points at Oregon.

Personal: Graduated from Arizona State with a bachelor's degree in justice studies. Father, Lon, is the head coach at UNLV. An avid movie buff whose favorite movies include Happy Gilmore, Anchorman, and Dodgeball.
