**Pro Career Highlights:** Selected in the first round (12<sup>th</sup> overall) by the Austin Toros in the 2007 NBA D-League Draft. Played in 16 games for the Toros before joining the Albuquerque Thunderbirds where he played 33 games to finish the season. Participated in NBA summer league with the Cleveland Cavaliers in 2007. Played with Conquistadores de Guaynabo in the Puerto Rican BSN league in the summer of 2007, averaging 14.4 points and 6.1 rebounds in 30 games. Played with the Pittsburgh Xplosion in the CBA in 2006-07, averaging 19.4 points and 6.2 rebounds in 34 games. Earned a CBA All-Star Game nod and was named to the league All-Rookie Team. Participated in NBA training camp with the Boston Celtics in the fall of 2006. Participated in NBA summer league with the Miami Heat in 2006. Originally an early entry candidate for the 2005 NBA Draft before withdrawing his name from consideration.

**College Highlights:** Earned First Team All-Big East honors as a senior. Also named an Honorable Mention All-American by the Associated Press. Finished collegiate career as West Virginia's sixth all-time leading scorer with 1,708 points. Started 94 of 128 career games. Was a member of the United States national team that competed at the 2003 Under-18 World Championships held in Greece.

**Senior (2005-06):** Led the team in scoring (19.3 ppg, ranked third in the Big East) and ranked second in rebounding (5.5 rpg). Also ranked fifth in the conference in free throw shooting (.857). Started all 33 games. Scored 20 or more points 18 times. Posted season-high 34 points vs. Canisius. Registered a double-double of 27 points and ten rebounds vs. Kentucky. Scored 30 points vs. Marquette. Tallied 16 points, 11 rebounds, and four blocked shots vs. Providence. Recorded 26 points vs. Pittsburgh. Notched 23 points and nine rebounds at Cincinnati. Scored a team-high 18 points vs. Southern Illinois in the first round of the NCAA tournament. Sank five threes on his way to a team-leading 19 points vs. Texas in the Sweet 16.

**Junior (2004-05):** Averaged 11.9 points and 3.7 rebounds. Started 16 of 35 games. Scored 20 or more points six times. Registered season-high 27 points vs. Pittsburgh. Posted 21 points and a season-high eight rebounds at St. John's. Scored 24 points and grabbed eight rebounds vs. Providence in the first round of the Big East Tournament. Tallied 22 points and eight rebounds vs. Texas Tech in the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. Hit six threes on his way to 25 points vs. Louisville in the Regional Finals.

**Sophomore (2003-04):** Averaged 10.2 points and 3.7 rebounds. Started 26 of 31 games. Recorded season highs of 24 points and eight rebounds vs. Seton Hall. Scored 22 points at Virginia Tech. Shot 7-for-9 from the field, including 5-for-6 from three-point range on his way to 19 points at Miami (Fla.). Tallied 16 points vs. Rhode Island in second round of the post-season NIT.

**Freshman (2002-03):** Averaged 11.6 points and 4.8 rebounds. Started all 29 games. Scored in double figures 16 times, posting a season-high 26 points vs. Rutgers. Registered 24 points vs. Syracuse. Pulled down a season-high nine rebounds in the rematch. Recorded 18 points vs. Virginia Tech.

**Personal:** Majored in athletic coaching education. Married with one child. Took the 2008-09 season off from basketball to teach elementary school.
