**Three-point field goals:** 2005-06, 11-for-46 (.239).

**Pro Career Highlights:** Started the 2005-06 season with the Seoul SK Knights in South Korea, averaging 19.4 points and 8.9 rebounds in eight games. Moved on to play for ALBA Berlin in Germany, averaging 7.1 points and 4.8 rebounds. Also played in five ULEB Cup games, averaging 7.6 points and 6.0 rebounds. Started the 2004-05 season with the Kentucky Colonels in the ABA, averaging 17.7 points and 6.0 rebounds in 18 games. Finished the year with the Daegu Orions in South Korea, averaging 25.8 points and 11.5 rebounds in six games.

**College Highlights:** Named Third Team All-Conference USA as a senior. Finished collegiate career as Louisville's 49<sup>th</sup> all-time leading scorer with 1,078 points. Started 70 of 119 career games. Scored in double figures 54 times and posted 17 career double-doubles.

**Senior (2003-04):** Averaged 11.1 points and a team-leading 7.7 rebounds (ranked fifth in Conference USA) in 28.7 minutes a contest. Started 24 of 29 games. Scored in double figures 17 times and recorded six double-doubles. Registered season-high 23 points vs. Murray State. Posted 14 points, a career-high 19 rebounds, and three steals vs. Marquette. Scored 13 points and grabbed 18 rebounds vs. UAB. Tallied 18 points and eight rebounds vs. Cincinnati. Recorded 18 points and 14 rebounds in the season opener vs. Iowa. Scored 15 points vs. Xavier in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

**Junior (2002-03):** Averaged 9.0 points and 5.4 rebounds in 21.2 minutes a contest. Started 11 of 32 games. Scored season-high 21 points vs. Purdue. Tallied 19 points, a season-high 15 rebounds, and six assists vs. Charlotte. Named Conference USA Tournament MVP after averaging 15.2 points, 11.5 rebounds (grabbing a tournament record 37 rebounds), and shooting 87 percent from the field (26-for-30), posting double-doubles in all three games. Registered 17 points, 14 rebounds, and three assists vs. UAB in the championship game. Recorded 20 points and 11 rebounds vs. Austin Peay in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

**Sophomore (2001-02):** Averaged 10.6 points and 6.4 rebounds in 26.6 minutes a contest. Started 22 of 29 games. Scored in double figures 16 times. Scored in double figures 16 times and posted five double-doubles. Recorded career-high 30 points and grabbed ten rebounds vs. Murray State. Shot 10-for-13 from the field in scoring 20 points at Memphis. Tallied 11 points, ten rebounds, and a career-high seven assists vs. South Florida. Scored 25 points vs. Marquette in the Conference USA Tournament quarterfinals. Tallied 14 points and 11 rebounds vs. Temple in the second round of the post-season NIT.

**Freshman (2000-01):** Averaged 5.6 points and 3.1 rebounds in 16.1 minutes a contest. Started 13 of 29 games. Scored in double figures nine times. Posted season-high 16 points and grabbed seven rebounds at Tulane. Registered first career double-double with 12 points and ten rebounds vs. Georgetown. Tallied 12 points, a season-high eight rebounds, and three assists vs. UNLV.

**Personal:** Majored in communications. Father, Eddie, played at Louisville from 1963-66. Favorite NBA team is the Los Angeles Lakers.
