Senior (2007-08): NABC Division I All-District 9 First Team ... All-Big 12 2nd Team ... Played in 31 games averaging 16.0 points, 4.5 rebounds, 2.9 assists in 34.3 minutes per contest ... Led the team in scoring and rebounds ... had an assist-to-turnover ratio of 1:1.

Junior (2006-07): Started 33 of 34 games...averaged 35.6 minutes per game...played 35 (or more) minutes per game in 25 games—including 40 minutes in nine games and 47 minutes in the double-overtime game at OSU...averaged 16.6 ppg...led the Red Raiders in FG percentage (.495) and was sixth in the conference...shot .500 (or better) 22 times...Martin's .791 FT percentage (178-of-225) was first on the team...perfect from the free throw line in 12 games (50-for-50) during the year...sank 13-of-14 attempts in the win at home over Texas A&M...scored double figures in 30 games with 10 games of 20 or more points...registered three double-doubles during the season...leading rebounder on the squad with 5.3 rpg...had four games with 10 or more rebounds and 11 rebounds in three different games...led the team with 109 assists...second on the team with 43 steals...ranks sixth on the Big 12 career list in free throws made with 416... NABC All-District (9) Second Team...All-Big 12 Third Team.

Sophomore (2005-06): Started 31 of 32 games for the season...averaged 35.2 minutes per game for the season... played 40 minutes in nine games and 35 minutes nine other games... played 41 minutes in the overtime win at home against Oklahoma State...played 50 minutes in the double-overtime against Wake Forest...averaged 13.7 ppg in the 2005-2006 season ... leading rebounder for the Red Raiders in with 5.3 rebounds per game...registered his first double-double with 11 points and a career best 11 rebounds against KSU...made 112 of 154 free throw attempts(.727) ... second on the team with 44 steals...second on the squad with 91 assists...established a career high of 28 points against Georgia Southern...scored 20 (or more) points in 8 games...named Regional MVP in the 2K Sports Coaches vs. Cancer games in Lubbock with 15-of-27 field goal attempts, 9-of-12 free throw attempts, 10 rebounds, and 9 assists...All-Big 12 Honorable Mention.

Freshman (2004-05): Played in 33 games during his first season...started 26 games... averaged 32 minutes-per-game for the season – including 50 minutes against Kansas in Tech's 80-79 double-overtime win...his 167 FT attempts was tops for the Red Raiders ... made his first 16 FT attempts ...shot 167 free throws during the season and was successful on 126 tries – both tops for the 2004-2005 squad...perfect from the free-throw line in 7 games (31-of-31)...scored in double-figures in 24 games...had 11 games of at least 15 points...season high of 24 points against Kansas...his 37 steals were second to Ronald Ross's 86 steals...had 4 steals against UNCAshville... second on the team with 112 assists...had 4 or more assists in 15 games and a season-best of 8 assists against Baylor...Big 12 Rookie of the Week (Dec. 6)...selected to the CollegeInsider.com 2004-2005 Freshmen All-America Team.
