Pro Career Highlights: Played with Constituyentes de San Cristobal in the Dominican Republic in the summer of 2006, averaging 2.0 points in three games. Later played with the Griffin Warriors in the WBA and Rome Serv-Pro-1 in the SEBL. Started the 2005-06 season with Rome ServPro-1 in the SEBL before moving on to the Birmingham Magicians in the ABA, averaging 25.3 points in 12 games. Finished the year with Polpak Swiecie in Poland, averaging 10.0 points in two games. Played with the Rome Gladiators and the Cleveland Magic in the WBA in the summer of 2005, averaging 9.2 points in nine games.

College Highlights: Earned Third Team All-Sun Belt Conference honors as a senior and earned Second Team honors as a junior. Ranks as Middle Tennessee's fifth all-time leader in three-point field goals made (115). Finished collegiate career at Middle Tennessee after playing first two seasons at Georgia.

Senior (2004-05): Led team in scoring (14.4 ppg) while averaging 3.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists. Recorded season-highs of 25 points and eight rebounds vs. Tennessee State. Registered 20 points and a season-high seven assists at Rice. Scored 15 points at Villanova. Tallied 14 points and four assists vs. Auburn. Shot 16-for-18 from the free throw line in scoring 18 points vs. Arkansas State. Posted 19 points and four rebounds at Western Kentucky. Scored 21 points at Mississippi Valley State. Sank five threes on his way to scoring 17 points at Louisiana-Lafayette.

Junior (2003-04): Averaged a team-high 16.2 points (ranked third in the Sun Belt) and 4.1 rebounds. Ranked second in the league in three-point field goal percentage (.437) and fifth in three-point field goals made (2.7). Started all 23 games after missing the first four games of the season due to NCAA transfer rules. Registered six 20-point games and led the team in scoring 11 times. Recorded career-high 30 points, including 7-for-12 shooting from beyond the three-point line, vs. Arkansas State. Sank five threes in scoring 23 points at New Orleans. Scored 26 points vs. North Texas. Recorded 21 points on 6-for-9 shooting (6-for-8 from three-point range) and five rebounds at Cincinnati. Notched 21 points in his MTSU debut vs. Tennessee Wesleyan.

Sophomore (2002-03): At Georgia, averaged 2.8 points. Appeared in six games before making the decision to transfer. Scored a season-high nine points vs. Arkansas.

Freshman (2001-02): Averaged 1.8 points and 0.4 rebounds in 6.5 minutes a contest. Joined the team after the fall semester and appeared in 23 games. Had a season high of nine points.
