Pro Career Highlights: Spent the 2005-06 season in China with the Shougang Beijing Ducks (statistics unavailable). Spent the summer of 2005 in the WBA with the Southern Crescent Lightning, averaging 14.2 points and 7.9 rebounds in nine games. Participated in training camp with the New Orleans Hornets in the fall of 2004. Started the 2004-05 season with Sagesse in Lebanon, averaging 17.0 points and 8.3 rebounds in six games. Signed with the Fayetteville Patriots in the NBA Developmental League, but did not appear in any games.

College Highlights: Played his final three seasons at Georgia State after spending his freshman campaign at Highland Community College in Illinois. A two-time All-Atlantic Sun First Team Selection, joining Shernard Long (1999-2000, 2000-01) as the only players in school history to accomplish this feat. Scored in double figures in 62 games, with 14 career double-doubles. Ranks sixth on Georgia State's career scoring chart (1,222), fifth in rebounds (293), seventh in field goal percentage (.530) and ninth in free throw percentage (.771). Averaged 19.0 points and 6.5 rebounds at the 2004 Portsmouth Invitational Tournament

Senior (2003-04): Suspended until Dec. 20 for violating team rules. Ranked second in the Atlantic Sun Conference in free throw percentage (.863), fifth in blocks (1.6), sixth in field goal percentage (.553), seventh in scoring (14.7) and seventh in rebounding (6.9). Posted six double-doubles. Scored in double figures 16 times, with five 20-point performances. Scored a season-high 28 points and grabbed 12 rebounds against Auburn. Had 19 points and 13 rebounds against Troy State. Had 20 points and seven blocks against Stetson.

Junior (2002-03): Led the Atlantic Sun in scoring (18.0 ppg). His 521 points were the ninth-best single-season total in school history. Scored in double figures in the final 21 games of the season. Ranked in the top 10 in the conference in rebounding, blocks, field goal percentage, defensive rebounds and free throws made. Scored a season-high 25 points against Alabama State.

Sophomore (2001-02): Averaged 12.2 points and 6.4 rebounds. Scored in double figures 19 times and had five double-doubles. Ranked sixth in the conference in blocked shots. Posted a double-double with season-highs of 27 points and 13 rebounds against St. Joseph's. Scored 25 points and grabbed 12 rebounds against Georgia.

Freshman (2000-01): At Highland CC, averaged 16.2 points, 9.1 rebounds, and 2.9 blocked shots, helping his team to a 29-5 mark. Had season highs of 35 points and 21 rebounds. Earned First Team All-Conference.
