Pro Career Highlights: Started the 2006-07 season in Portugal with Casino Figueira Ginasio, averaging a league-high 20.4 points, 7.7 rebounds, and 2.1 assists. Earned a spot in the Portuguese League All-Star Game. Moved on to play with Alerta Cantabria Lobos in the Spanish LEB, scoring seven points in one regular season game and contributing 24 points in four playoff contests..

College Highlights: Named Southland Conference Player of the year as a senior. Earned First Team All-Conference honors his junior and senior years. Finished collegiate career at Southeastern Louisiana after starting at Norfolk State and routing through Paris Junior College in Texas.

Senior (2006-07): Averaged 17.8 points (ranked third in the Southland Conference) and a league-high 10.9 rebounds. Scored 20 or more points 11 times. Set season high with 28 points vs. Southern. Posted 18 double-doubles. Registered a 18-point, 16-rebound performance vs. UC Davis. Scored 15 points and grabbed 15 rebounds at Mississippi State. Recorded 27 points and ten rebounds at Texas-San Antonio. Tallied 17 points, a career-high 18 rebounds, and six assists at Sam Houston State. Notched the first triple double in school history with 28 points, 16 rebounds, and a career-high ten steals in the regular season finale at Lamar.

Junior (2005-06): Averaged 17.2 points (ranked second in the Southland Conference) and 6.8 rebounds (eighth). Started 31 of 33 games. Scored 20 or more points 11 times, posting a career-high 31 points at Southern. Posted six double-doubles. Registered 28 points and 11 rebounds vs. McNeese State and recorded 26 points and 12 rebounds in the rematch. Scored 27 points at Louisiana-Monroe. Tallied 23 points and seven rebounds at Boise State. Notched 23 points at Houston. Posted 17 points and a season-high 13 rebounds at Lamar. Scored 16 points vs. Oklahoma State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Named Southland Conference Tournament MVP and League Newcomer of the Year.

Sophomore (2003-04): At Paris JC, led team in scoring (16.9 ppg), rebounding (7.4 rpg), and steals (1.8 spg). Ranked eighth in the region in scoring and fourth in field goal percentage (.585). Registered season highs of 30 points and 15 rebounds. Helped team to a 26-7 record and a third-place conference finish. Earned First Team All-Region XIV honors.

Freshman (2002-03): At Norfolk State, averaged 6.7 points and 3.6 rebounds in 18.5 minutes a contest. Started once. Scored season-high 16 points and blocked three shots vs. Howard. Led team with 15 points at Bethune-Cookman.
