College Highlights: Finished collegiate career at West Virginia after playing first two seasons at Penn State. Sat out the 2004-05 season at West Virginia under NCAA transfer rules. Started 77 of 125 career games played.

Senior (2006-07): Averaged 4.4 points and 4.6 rebounds. Started all 36 games. Scored a career-high 12 points and grabbed a season-high nine rebounds vs. Maryland-Eastern Shore. Posted ten points vs. Western Michigan. Blocked a career-high-matching four shots vs. Canisius. Matched season-high with nine rebounds vs. Mississippi State in the semifinals of the post-season NIT.

Junior (2005-06): Averaged 0.5 points and 0.4 rebounds in 3.8 minutes a contest. Registered season-high three points in the season opener vs. Louisiana-Monroe. Scored two points in each of West Virginia's first two NCAA Tournament games vs. Southern Illinois and Northwestern State.

Sophomore (2003-04): At Penn State, averaged 3.8 points and 4.3 rebounds in 24.0 minutes a contest. Started 20 of 28 games. Scored six points and pulled down a season-high ten rebounds at Iowa. Registered season-high nine points at Buffalo and vs. Illinois. Tallied seven points and a team-high eight rebounds vs. Ohio State.

Freshman (2002-03): Averaged 3.9 points and 4.0 rebounds in 18.9 minutes a contest. Led team in field goal percentage (.506). Started 21 of 28 games. Registered a season-high ten points and grabbed a career-high 13 rebounds vs. Michigan. Tallied ten points and six rebounds at Clemson. Posted ten points, nine rebounds, and a career-high four blocked shots vs. Buffalo.
