Ranked the No. 14 player nationally in the Junior College Top 125 by Rivals.com ... First-team all-conference and all-region selection ... Helped lead Redlands to a No. 1 ranking in the NJCAA D-1 poll for three straight weeks, a No. 2 ranking in the final regular season poll, and an overall record of 29-2 on the year ...
