Pro Career Highlights: Participated in NBA summer league with the Detroit Pistons in the summers of 2005 and 2006. Played the 2005-06 season in Latvia with BK Riga. Averaged 8.9 points, 4.3 rebounds, a league-leading 6.3 assists, and a league-leading 3.1 steals in 33 games in the Latvian League. Shot 54 percent from two-point range and 76 percent from the free throw line. Averaged 10.7 points, 2.7 rebounds, and 3.7 assists in three games in the EuroCup Challenge.

College Highlights: Earned Third Team All-Sun Belt Conference honors as a senior. Ranks fourth all-time in Denver history in career assists (418) and fourth in steals (154). Finished collegiate career at Denver after playing freshman season at Los Angeles Valley College in California.

Senior (2004-05): Averaged 10.2 points, 3.2 rebounds, and 6.4 assists. Led the Sun Belt Conference ranked 17th nationally in assists. Started all 31 games. Scored in double figures 16 times and posted two double-doubles. Set season-high of 18 points on 7-for-12 shooting vs. Stanford. Matched season high with 18 points and added nine assists vs. Middle Tennessee State. Tallied 18 points, a career-high nine rebounds, seven assists, and a career-high five steals vs. New Orleans. Registered 13 points and 12 assists vs. Louisiana-Lafayette and posted 12 points and a career-high 15 assists in the rematch. Scored 16 points vs. Louisiana-Lafayette in the championship game of the Sun Belt Tournament. Recorded ten points, three rebounds, and four assists at San Francisco in the first round of the post-season NIT.

Junior (2003-04): Averaged 10.4 points, 2.5 rebounds, and league-leading 5.0 assists. Also ranked third in the Sun Belt in steals (1.9 spg). Started all 27 games. Scored in double figures 11 times. Posted season-high 26 points vs. New Mexico State. Recorded 25 points on 10-for-14 shooting at Eastern Washington. Tallied 23 points, six rebound, seven assists, and four steals vs. New Orleans. Registered 20 points and five assists vs. Loyola Marymount. Distributed out a season-high 11 assists at UMKC.

Sophomore (2002-03): Averaged 5.3 points, 2.3 rebounds, and 2.7 assists. Led the team and ranked 11th in the Sun Belt in steals (1.4 spg). Came off the bench in all 32 games. Scored in double figures six times. Recorded season-high 14 points vs. Chicago State. Dished out a season-high 12 assists vs. UMKC. Scored ten points at Colorado State, vs. Auburn, and vs. South Alabama. Averaged 10.3 points in three Sun Belt Tournament games. Recorded 13 points vs. Middle Tennessee State in the semifinals.

Freshman (2001-02): At LA Valley, averaged 9.1 points and a league-leading 6.1 assists. Earned Honorable Mention All-Western State Conference honors. Helped lead team to a 12-0 conference record and a school-record 15-game winning streak.

Personal: Majored in management. Older brother, Chauncey, is an all-star guard with the Detroit Pistons.
