College Highlights: Played in 117 career outings and made 51 starts in those contests ... finished with career scoring average of 6.5 points and 2.4 rebounds ... concluded career eighth in three-point field goals made (80) and three-point field goals attempted (401) and tied for third in three-point field goal percentage (.424).

Senior (2008-09): started 33 of 36 games during the season ... scored in double figures in 19 contests ... led the team in scoring three times ... posted career-best averages in points per game (11.1) and rebounds per game (3.5) ... shot 43.8 percent from the field and 42.9 percent from three-point range ... scoring average placed him third on the team ... blocked a career-best 25 shots, which ranked second on the team ... netted double figures for the first time in win over Indiana in first round of the EA Sports Maui Invitational.

Junior (2007-08): Played in all 33 contests and started the first 17 games of the season before coming off the bench against Villanova ... averaged career-best of 7.8 points and 3.2 rebounds ... enjoyed best shooting performance of his career as he connected on 45.7 percent from the field and 45.1 percent from three-point range ... notched 10th double-figure scoring outing of the season in Notre Dame's first-round NCAA tournament win against George Mason as he connected on 5-10 shots from the field ... netted a career-high 17 points in loss at Louisville connecting on a career-high six field goals (6-9) and personal-best five three-pointers (5-6).

Sophomore (2006-07): Played in 30 games ... averaged 2.9 points and 1.4 rebounds ... connected on all four of his three-point attempts in registering a career-high 12 points against Cincinnati while playing a season-high 30 minutes ... earned first career start in win over Providence as he played 12 minutes and scored five points ... matched career-best with seven points in win over Syracuse.

Freshman (2005-06): Played in 18 games... enjoyed best outing of the season in second-round loss to Michigan in National Invitation Tournament as he came off the bench and played a season-high 34 minutes and finished with personal bests of seven points and four rebounds ... played 14 minutes against Florida International and scored a career-high three points ... tallied first collegiate points in season opener against Lafayette when he scored two points in 12 minutes off the bench and also had two points in win over Fordham ... played double-digit minutes in four contests.

Personal: son of Randy and Carol Ayers ... younger brother is Cameron ... two-year member of Germantown Academy's Board of Trustees, as well as a participant in Forum Council and All Cultures Together Club ... his father, Randy, played basketball at Miami (Ohio) and is the former head coach of the NBA's Philadelphia 76ers and at Ohio State, he is currently an assistant coach on the Washington Wizards staff majored in marketing ... Named the 2005 Gatorade Pennsylvania Boys Basketball Player of the Year
