**College Highlights:** Earned First Team All-Southland Conference honors his junior and senior seasons. Also earned Second Team All-District honors from the NABC as a senior. Named Southland Conference Freshman of the Year in 2004-05. Finished collegiate career as Sam Houston State's seventh all-time leading scorer with 1,429 points and second all-time leading rebounder with 967 boards. Posted 31 career double-doubles.

**Senior (2007-08):** Led the Southland Conference and ranked eighth nationally in rebounding (10.9 rpg) while leading the team in scoring (11.7 ppg). Started all 31 games. Posted 16 double-doubles. Registered 11 points, a career-high 18 rebounds, and six assists vs. Stephen F. Austin. Tallied 14 points, 17 rebounds, six assists, and three steals vs. Texas-Arlington. Narrowly missed a triple-double with ten points, 11 rebounds, and eight assists vs. UC Irvine. Grabbed a career-high eight steals at McNeese State. Scored 17 points and grabbed ten rebounds vs. Texas State. Recorded 17 points, 15 rebounds, and five steals in the first round of the SLC Tournament vs. McNeese State. Posted a season-high 19 points and pulled down 13 rebounds vs. Texas-Arlington in the tournament semifinals.

**Junior (2006-07):** Led the team in scoring (14.8 ppg) and rebounding (8.1 rpg). Ranked in the top ten in the SLC in scoring, rebounding, field goal percentage (.514), and steals (1.7 spg). Started 29 of 31 games. Recorded nine double-doubles. Registered season-high 27 points on perfect 9-for-9 shooting and grabbed 12 rebounds at Northwestern State. Scored 26 points at Alcorn State. Tallied 20 points, 12 rebounds, four assists, and three steals at Oklahoma State. Posted 12 points, seven rebounds, and four assists at UCLA. Notched career-high 31 points and added eight rebounds, five assists, three steals, and two blocked shots vs. Lamar in the first round of the SLC Tournament.

**Sophomore (2005-06):** Ranked third on the team in scoring (11.5) and led the team in rebounding (7.9 rpg, ranked fourth in the SLC). Started 21 of 31 games. Scored in double figures 17 times. Posted five double-doubles. Registered season-high 28 points, seven rebounds, and six assists at Missouri in the season opener. Recorded ten points and a season-high 13 rebounds vs. Louisiana-Monroe. Tallied 20 points and 12 rebounds vs. Stephen F. Austin in the semifinals of the SLC Tournament. Posted 17 points, nine rebounds, four assists, three blocked shots, and two steals vs. Northwestern State in the tournament finals.

**Freshman (2004-05):** Averaged 8.3 points and 4.5 rebounds in 17.6 minutes a contest. Led the team in three-point field goal percentage (.417). Scored in double figures 14 times. Posted season-high 19 points at Texas-Pan American. Recorded 17 points vs. SE Louisiana. Registered first career double-double with 13 points and a season-high 11 rebounds vs. Nicholls State.

**Personal:** Named Southland Conference Student-Athlete of the Year in 2007 and 2008 and was a three-time Academic All-Conference honoree. Earned Academic All-American honors from CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine and was named the recipient of the Steve McCarty Citizenship Award in 2008. Favorite Movie is "Batman Begins".
