Pro Career Highlights: Participated in NBA training camp with the Philadelphia 76ers in the fall of 2007. An early entry candidate for the 2007 NBA Draft, but was not selected.

College Highlights: Played three seasons at Kentucky before transferring to Manhattan, where he sat out the 2006-07 under NCAA transfer rules.

Junior (2005-06): Averaged 2.0 points, 1.3 rebounds, and 0.7 blocked shots in 6.2 minutes a contest. Started two times. Registered career-high 16 points, grabbed six rebounds, and dished out a career-high three assists vs. Georgia State. Blocked four shots in the season opener vs. South Dakota State. Scored five points and blocked two shots in the SEC Tournament quarterfinals vs. Alabama.

Sophomore (2004-05): Averaged 2.8 points, 1.9 rebounds, and 1.5 blocked shots (ranked seventh in the SEC) in 9.2 minutes a contest. Scored in double figures three times. Registered season highs of 11 points, eight rebounds, and six blocked shots vs. Morehead State. Tallied nine points, six rebounds, and four blocked shots vs. LSU. Shot 5-for-6 from the field on his way to ten points vs. Ball State. Scored ten points and blocked four shots vs. Indiana.

Freshman (2003-04): Averaged 0.8 points and 0.7 rebounds in 3.3 minutes a contest. Scored a season-high six points on 3-for-4 shooting vs. Eastern Kentucky. Tallied one point, two rebounds, and a blocked shots in his collegiate debut vs. Winthrop.
