Pro Career Highlights: Participated in NBA summer league with the Sacramento Kings in the summer of 2007. Spent the 2006-07 season in Germany with the Artland Dragons, averaging 6.6 points and 4.6 rebounds in 19 games. Participated in NBA summer league with the Detroit Pistons in the summer of 2006.

College Highlights: Named Third-Team All-ACC as a senior. Also named All-District 3 by the USBWA and Second-Team All-District 5 by the NABC. Finished collegiate career as Maryland's 14th all-time leading scorer with 1,573 points. Also ranks 18th all-time in rebounds with 659.

Senior (2005-06): Led the team in scoring (15.3 ppg), finished second in rebounding (6.3 rpg) and third in steals (1.1 spg). Scored 20 or more points seven times and topped the 30-point mark twice. Recorded a season-high 33 points vs. Georgia Tech and followed that up with a 30-point, 10-rebound effort against Temple. Registered 21 points and a season-high 12 rebounds at Clemson. Tallied 20 points, nine rebounds, and five assists vs. Georgia Tech in the first round of the ACC Tournament.

Junior (2004-05): Averaged a team-high 16.0 points and 6.2 rebounds. Started 31 of 32 games. Scored 20 or more points ten times. Recorded a career-high 35 points against Temple. Posted four double-doubles. Tallied 25 points on 8-for-13 shooting at Duke. Scored 19 points and grabbed 11 rebounds at Virginia. Registered 14 points and 10 rebounds against Clemson in the first round of the ACC Tournament. Totaled 45 points, 28 rebounds and 11 assists in four post-season NIT games.

Sophomore (2003-04): Averaged 12.2 points and 4.7 rebounds. Started all 32 games. Scored 20 or more points four times and posted two double-doubles. Posted season-high 23 points to go along with seven rebounds vs. George Mason. Registered 22 points and a career-high 13 rebounds for his first career double-double against Florida. Tallied 21 points and eight rebounds vs. Duke. Scored 12 points vs. UTEP in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Freshman (2002-03): Averaged 5.9 points and 3.5 rebounds in 16.7 minutes a contest. Started 18 of 31 games. Scored in double figures four times, posting a season-high 14 points vs. Georgia Tech. Pulled down a season-high eight rebounds against Duquesne. Scored 12 points vs. UNC Wilmington in first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Personal: Majored in American Studies. Was featured in Sports Illustrated's Faces in the Crowd his senior year in high school.
