College Highlights: First team All-Conference Media & Coaches ... 1,075 career points left him 38 points shy of the Mocs scoring record for a two-year player held by Derrick Kirce (1,113 - 1990-91) ... Mocs career leader in 3-pt. FGM with 243 and 3-pt. FGA with 611 ... scored 1,000th point at App State where he also set a new season standard for treys made passing Mays (118) ... only UTC player to make 100 or more threes in more than one season.

Senior (2008-09) Chattanooga: Southern Conference Tournament Most Outstanding Player averaging 21.3 points, 5.0 rpg, and 3.3 assists while making 5.0 three-pointers per game in the tournament...Played and started in 35 games ... 13 games this season with 20-plus points, 18 for his career...three 30-point games with a career high of 38 against Niagara ... 27 games this season with three or more three-pointers ... 12 games with five or more three-pointers ... career high of seven assists to go with 20 points in home win over UNCG...set new high with four steals in home win over Samford adding 16 points and four assists...new high playing all 50 minutes at Elon breaking high from earlier in the year playing all 45 minutes of the home overtime win over App State...32 points (7-10 3-ptFG) and five assists in SoCon Semis win over Samford...15 points, seven rebounds and four assists with no turnovers playing all 40 minutes in the SoCon Title win over Charleston...22 points with seven boards in home win over Furman...27 points with seven treys in the loss to Memphis in Puerto Rico...31 points with six threes and five rebounds at Davidson...game-high 27 points including six treys in win at The Citadel...27 points and five boards to go with four assists and three steals in home win over Georgia Southern...MVP of the Dr Pepper Classic...Southern Conference Player of the Week on Jan. 6.

Junior (2007-08) Chattanooga: Played in 31 games, starting 30 games while averaging a team best 14.3 points per game ... All-Southern Conference performer...led the team with 40 steals and 108 three-pointers made...set a school record with 293 three-pointers attempted...ranked 15th nationally and second in the Southern Conference in three-pointers made per game (3.5)...sixth in scoring average...Southern Conference Winter Academic All-Conference ... sat out 2006-07 season, transferred to Chattanooga from South Carolina.

Sophomore (2005-06) South Carolina: Played in 29 games for the Gamecocks and averaged 1.8 points in 6.9 minutes per game...was 3-3 from three-point range and tallied 10 points in win over Western Kentucky in the first round of the NIT...drained a key 3-pointer in USC's win over Florida.

Freshman (2004-05) South Carolina: Played in 25 games for the Gamecocks averaging 1.6 points... named to the 2005 SEC Freshman Honor Roll...member of the President's List (4.0) in the fall of 2004, and the Dean's List (3.5 or higher) in the spring of 2005...highest GPA on the team both years at USC.

Personal: son of Kamona and Stephen McDowell...holds B.B.A. in Finance ... prepped for one season at IMG Basketball Academy and averaged 16 points and five assists ... in 2005 played on summer All-Star team with SCORE International and led the team in scoring and assists against stiff international competition...scored 30 points against Germany and 21 against Russia in the Nation's Cup...established his career-high as a freshman against Tennessee, scoring 10 points while tallying four assists and three steals...
