College Highlights: Named First Team All-MEAC as a senior and earned Second Team All-MEAC honors his sophomore and junior years. Named to the conference All-Rookie Team as a freshman. Finished collegiate career as Norfolk State's seventh all-time leading scorer with 1,815 points. Also ranks as the school's all-time leader in three-point field goals made (262) and attempted (746). Registered 35 career 20-point games.

Senior (2007-08): Led team and ranked third in the MEAC in scoring (17.9 ppg). Also ranked second in the conference in steals (1.7 spg), third in free throw percentage (.829), and fourth in three-point field goals made (2.35 per game). Started all 31 games. Scored 20 or more points 13 times. Scored season-high 29 points in the season opener at Richmond, matching his own school record with seven made three-point field goals. Tallied 26 points and a season-high nine rebounds at Florida A&M. Recorded 26 points and six rebounds at Fairleigh Dickinson. Sank all 12 free throw attempts on his way to a season-high-matching 29 points vs. Florida A&M in the MEAC Tournament quarterfinals. Hit six threes in scoring 20 points vs. Coppin State in the tournament semifinals.

Junior (2006-07): Led team and ranked fourth in the MEAC in scoring (16.5 ppg). Also ranked third in the conference in three-point field goals made (2.63 per game), seventh in free throw percentage (.781), and eighth in three-point field goal percentage (.382). Started all 30 games. Scored 20 or more points nine times. Exploded for a career-high and school Division I record of 43 points on 16-for-21 shooting including seven three-point field goals made vs. Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. Tallied 33 points vs. North Carolina A&T. Scored 35 points on 13-for-21 shooting vs. Florida A&M. Registered back-to-back double-doubles with 11 points and ten rebounds at Florida A&M and 17 points and ten rebounds vs. Bethune-Cookman. Recorded 24 points vs. Maryland-Eastern Shore in the first round of the MEAC Tournament and notched 20 points vs. North Carolina A&T in the quarterfinals.

Sophomore (2005-06): Led team and ranked third in the MEAC in scoring (15.6 ppg). Also ranked fifth in the conference in three-point field goals made (1.9 per game) and eighth in free throw percentage (.745). Started all 31 games. Scored 20 or more points ten times, recording a season-high 26 points in games against Howard, Morgan State, and Bethune-Cookman. Sank six threes on his way to 25 points at George Washington. Tallied 24 points, eight rebounds, and season highs of four assists and four steals vs. Hampton. Shot 9-for-13 from the field in scoring 24 points at Fresno State. Led team with 23 points vs. Coppin State in the quarterfinals of the MEAC Tournament.

Freshman (2004-05): Ranked second on the team in scoring (10.8 ppg) and fourth in rebounds (3.6 rpg). Started 23 of 26 games. Scored in double figures 15 times, posting a season-high 25 points on 10-for-16 shooting vs. Delaware State. Registered 19 points vs. North Carolina A&T. Tallied 16 points, a season-high five assists, and three rebounds at Florida A&M. Scored 21 points at Hampton. Sank four threes in scoring 21 points vs. South Carolina State in the MEAC Tournament.
