**F 6-9 220 2<sup>ND</sup> NBA SEASON**

*One of the leading candidates for the NBA's Most Improved Player Award... Leads all NBA sophomores in scoring (19.3 points) in 2007-08... Only NBA player to rank in the Top 40 in dunks (63, 10<sup>th</sup>) and 3FGM (72, T-30<sup>th</sup>)... On pace to become the first player other than Pau Gasol to lead the franchise in scoring since Shareef Abdur-Rahim in 2000-01... 2006-07 All-Rookie NBA First Team... Placed third in NBA Rookie of the Year voting after averaging 10.8 points and 4.5 rebounds in rookie campaign... Named Western Conference Rookie of the Month for November 2006.*

**PAU GASOL #16**

**F 7-0 260 7<sup>TH</sup> NBA SEASON**

*One of four players averaging 20-plus points (22.6) and 10-plus rebounds (10.9) in the month of January... Leads team in rebounding (8.9) for the third consecutive year... Shooting a career-high .818 from the free throw line (prev. .748 in 2006-07)... Entering the 2007-08 season, was already the franchise leader in 12 statistical categories, including points (8,228), rebounds (3,754) and blocks (821)... Posted career highs in scoring (20.8), field goal percentage (.538), rebounds (9.8) and tied a career high in blocks (2.1) in 2006-07... 2006 NBA All-Star and the only Grizzly in club history to play in the All-Star Game... Won a gold medal with Spain at the 2006 FIBA World Championships... 2001-02 NBA Rookie of the Year.*

**DARKO MILICIC #31**

**C 7-0 275 5<sup>TH</sup> NBA SEASON**

*Ranks 11<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in blocks (career-high 1.91)... Posting 6.3 points and 5.2 rebounds in first season with the Grizzlies... Originally selected by Detroit with the second overall pick in the 2003 NBA Draft... Ranked 14<sup>th</sup> in the NBA with 1.8 blocks last season with Orlando and posted career highs in scoring (8.0) and rebounding (5.5).*

**MIKE MILLER #33**

**G 6-8 218 8<sup>TH</sup> NBA SEASON**

*One of only three NBA players this season shooting above 50 percent FG, 40 percent 3FG and 80 percent FTs... Shooting a career-high in field goal percentage (.516) and three-point field goal percentage (.442, 10<sup>th</sup> in the NBA)... Leads club in three-point field goals made (96, T-5<sup>th</sup> in the NBA), three-point field goal percentage and minutes played (37.9) in 2007-08... 2005-06 NBA Sixth Man of the Year and 2000-01 NBA Rookie of the Year... Seven-year NBA veteran recorded career highs in scoring (18.5), assists (4.3), three-point field goals made (202) and tied a career high in rebounds (5.4) in 2006-07... Recently became the 43<sup>rd</sup> player in NBA history to reach 1,000 career three-pointers made... Has shot 40 percent or better from three-point range in each of the last three seasons (2004-07).*

**MIKE CONLEY #11**

**G 6-1 180 ROOKIE**

*Leads all NBA rookies in assists (team-high 4.8), averaging more than any two first-year players combined... Has started every game in 2008... Helped lead Ohio State to a 35-4 record and the national championship game in his only season in college... Named First Team All-Big Ten by the media and Second Team All-Big Ten by the coaches after averaging 11.3 points, 6.1 assists and 3.4 rebounds per game for the Buckeyes in 2006-07... Had 20 points, six assists and four steals in the championship game against Florida.*

**Wizards 104, Grizzlies 93**

**1/25/08 at Verizon Center**

**WASHINGTON, DC** – The Grizzlies scored a season-low nine first-quarter points, and the club's road losing streak swelled to a season-high six games against the Wizards... **Antawn Jamison** led all scorers with 24 points (9-of-17 FG) for a Wizards team that had all five starters score double-figures... Jamison scored a season-high 40 points in the two teams' first meeting this season on Nov. 24... **Mike Miller** paced the Grizzlies with 21 points (8-of-19 FG, 5-of-11 3FG) and nine rebounds, while **Kyle Lowry** recorded the first double-double of his career with 13 points (5-of-11 FG) and a career-best 10 assists to go with a career-high-tying five steals... Lowry filled in for **Mike Conley**, who suffered a right chest/rib contusion early in the second half... Down by as many as 22 points in the first half, the Grizzlies mounted a second-half rally, eventually whittling the deficit to six points with 9:51 left in the fourth quarter before Washington pulled away for good... Washington, staging a first-quarter burst similar to the contest at the Verizon Center last season (45-18 after the first quarter, Dec. 26, 2006) led the entire way... The Grizzlies have not won away from FedExForum since beating the Indiana Pacers 90-72 on Jan. 2.

## PREVIOUS GAME

**Magic 112, Grizzlies 85**

**1/23/08 at FedExForum**

**MEMPHIS, TN** – The Magic set a franchise record with 18 three-pointers (including a club-best 10 in the first half), defeating the Grizzlies for just the third time in the last 12 meetings... Orlando had eight players connect from long-range, and the 18 treys matched a Grizzly opponents' all-time high... **Rudy Gay** led the Grizzlies with 20 points (7-of-11 FG), including a career-high-tying four of the team's six three-point makes while **Pau Gasol** recorded his sixth double-double in the last seven games with 17 points (4-of-12 FG) and 11 rebounds... Orlando got 26 points from **Hedo Turkoglu** (10-of-16 FG, 6-of-8 3FG), who scored 24 points in the Dec. 15 contest... **Rashard Lewis** and **Maurice Evans** added 16 and 12 points, respectively... Memphis limited **Dwight Howard** to 16 points (5-of-7 FG) and 10 rebounds after Howard had averaged 28.7 points (29-of-36 FG) and 18.0 rebounds in three previous meetings, but the Grizzlies forced just six turnovers and registered only one steal, leading to a season-low-tying four points off turnovers... On the other side of the floor, Memphis committed 15 turnovers, which led to 23 Magic points... Orlando used an 11-2 run late in the second quarter to build a 10-point halftime lead (58-48) and would lead the entire second half by double-figures, building the margin up to 27 by the end of the game... The 27-point loss tied Memphis' largest margin of defeat this season (Dec. 21, 2007 vs. Detroit, 67-94).

**SERIES HISTORY:** The Clippers are one of three NBA teams (Charlotte Bobcats, Toronto Raptors) who own a losing overall record against the Grizzlies... Memphis leads the all-time series 25-23 but has lost the last four contests between the teams after winning 11 of the previous 13... Memphis is 15-9 at home vs. the Clippers... In the teams' first meeting this season on Dec. 14, the Grizzlies went 10:38, spanning the third and fourth quarters, without a field goal, breaking an 11-year-old franchise mark (9:44) originally set on March 16, 1997 against the New York Knicks.

**NOTABLES:** Grizzlies Limited Partner and Radio Color Analyst **Elliot Perry** was originally drafted in the second round (37<sup>th</sup> overall) by the Clippers in the 1991 NBA Draft... Clippers guard **Brevin Knight** played two seasons with the Grizzlies (2001-03), averaging 5.4 points and 5.0 assists in 108 games (15 starts)... Clippers forward **Elton Brand** matched his career-high in scoring with 44 points vs. Memphis on April 13, 2006... Grizzlies Assistant Coach **Johnny Davis** was the head coach of the Orlando Magic when the team traded for current Clippers guard **Cuttino Mobley** before the 2004-05 season... Davis also served under **Bob Weiss'** coaching staff in the 1993-94 season with the Clippers... Clippers head coach **Mike Dunleavy** coached Grizzlies guard **Damon Stoudamire** on the Portland Trail Blazers from the 1997-01... Grizzlies Radio Color Analyst **Hank McDowell** played one season (1983-84) with the San Diego Clippers and averaged 3.6 points in 57 games.

**SERIES HISTORY:** The Grizzlies are 7-40 all-time against the Mavericks and have lost their last seven in the series... In the teams' last meeting on Feb. 7, 2007, Mavericks forward and reigning league MVP **Dirk Nowitzki** scored 38 points (14-of-20 FG), the most any player has scored in the all-time series... The Grizzlies are 1-11 since Dallas' move to the American Airlines Arena... The Mavericks swept the Grizzlies in the first round in Memphis' most-recent trip to the postseason (2005-06).

**Mavericks 108, Grizzlies 105 | 11/17/07 at American Airlines Center**

**DALLAS, TX** – The Grizzlies went on a 10-0 rally late in the fourth quarter, but a potential game-tying three-point attempt from **Juan Carlos Navarro** with 3.9 seconds remaining was offline, as the Mavericks escaped with a 108-105 home win... With the victory, Dallas Head Coach **Avery Johnson** became the fastest to 150 wins in NBA history (150-41, .785)... Dallas has won the last eight games in the series, sending Memphis home with its season-high third consecutive defeat... Grizzlies swingman **Mike Miller** led the team in scoring for the first time this season with 23 points (9-of-13 FG), 10 of which came in the fourth quarter... Mavericks forward **Josh Howard** finished with a game-high 27 points (13-of-23 FG)... In **Darko Milicic's** absence (sprained thumb, day-to-day), Grizzlies forward **Hakim Warrick** came off the bench to net a season-high 17 points (7-of-11 FG)... The Grizzlies' 105 points were the most Dallas had given up at home this season.

### IT'S A SLAM DUNK FOR RUDY

One of the NBA's leading dunkers, Grizzlies forward **Rudy Gay** will become just the third Grizzlies player ever to appear in the NBA slam dunk contest, following **Hakim Warrick** (3rd) in 2006 and **Stromile Swift** (T-4<sup>th</sup>) in 2001, the league announced on Jan. 21... Gay, who will make his second appearance during All-Star Weekend after leading the rookie team with 22 points in last year's T-Mobile Rookie Challenge in Las Vegas, will join defending champion and Minnesota Timberwolves swingman **Gerald Green**, Orlando Magic center **Dwight Howard** and Toronto Raptors rookie forward **Jamario Moon** in the 2008 Sprite Slam Dunk competition at New Orleans Arena on NBA All-Star Saturday Night on Feb. 16.

Gay is inviting basketball players to suggest what kind of dunk he should deliver at the dunk contest at All-Star. Gay is asking basketball players from across the globe to upload footage demonstrating their best dunk on the "RudyGay22SlamDunk" page of YouTube.com ([www.youtube.com/rudygay22slamdunk](http://www.youtube.com/rudygay22slamdunk)) where he will ultimately pick his favorite and attempt to replicate it in the Feb. 16 dunk-off.

At the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Game on Jan. 21 against the Chicago Bulls, four Memphis Grizzlies (**Rudy Gay**, **Mike Miller**, **Pau Gasol** and **Mike Conley**) recorded double-doubles... The last time the Grizzlies had four players register double-doubles was before the franchise moved to Memphis, on Dec. 15, 1999, when **Shareef Abdur-Rahim**, **Bryant Reeves**, **Mike Bibby** and **Cherokee Parks** accomplished the feat in a loss to the Sacramento Kings... On that night, current Chicago Bulls Head Coach **Jim Boylan** sat on the sidelines for the Grizzlies as an assistant under then-Vancouver Head Coach **Brian Hill**... No team has had four players post double-doubles vs. the Bulls since the Portland Trail Blazers accomplished the feat on Nov. 29, 1991 in a double-overtime loss (**Clyde Drexler**, **Jerome Kersey**, **Terry Porter** and **Buck Williams**)... ### GRIZZ WIN ON MLK, JR. DAY

Memphis knocked off the Chicago Bulls 104-90 at the Sixth Annual Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Game in front of a capacity crowd at FedExForum... The Grizzlies saw four players (**Rudy Gay**, **Mike Miller**, **Pau Gasol** and **Mike Conley**) register double-doubles in the game, the first time that has happened since the franchise moved to Memphis... Gay and Miller led the Grizz in scoring with 24 apiece... The Grizzlies won at the annual celebration for the first time since 2005, and Memphis has sold out for the event each of the four years since moving to FedExForum... Here's a look at the game's history.

## EN FUEGO!

**Pau Gasol** has been on quite the hot streak lately... The only All-Star in franchise history is **13<sup>th</sup>** in the NBA in scoring (**22.6** points) among all qualifiers in the year 2008 and is averaging **23.4** points, **11.6** rebounds, **4.7** assists and **2.0** blocks on **57.1** percent shooting in the last **seven** games... Gasol also has **six** double-doubles in his last **seven** games... In a two-game stretch against Golden State on Jan. 11 and the Los Angeles Lakers on Jan. 13, Gasol recorded new season-highs in points (43 at GS), rebounds (career-high-tying 18 at LAL), assists (8 at LAL), field goals made (career-high tying 17 at GS) and field goal attempts (25 at GS)... After a slow start to the season, Gasol has been rounding into form, averaging **21.0** points and **10.2** rebounds on **52.0** percent shooting in the last **21** games played after averaging just 16.6 points and 7.2 rebounds on 47.2 percent from the field in his first 17... **Rudy Gay** has kicked off the year 2008 right where he left off in 2007... In **12** games played in January, Gay is averaging **19.9** points, **7.0** rebounds, **2.1** assists and **2.0** steals while shooting **46.4** percent from the field in **39.4** minutes per game... Last month, Gay averaged 21.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 1.9 assists, 1.3 steals and 1.0 blocks, while shooting 49.0 percent from the floor in 38.3 minutes... Gay ranked 25<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in scoring in the month of December and set a new career high in scoring with 32 points on Dec. 15 at Orlando, matching it the very next game against Golden State on Dec. 17... Nicknamed “La Bomba” for his high-arching floaters, Grizzlies rookie **Juan Carlos Navarro** is dazzling NBA fans and opponents with his crafty passes, gritty play and deadly shooting ability... Navarro currently ranks in the top 5 among all rookies in scoring average (**10.7, 2<sup>nd</sup>**), three-point field goals made (**89, 1<sup>st</sup>**), three-point field goal percentage (**.412, 1<sup>st</sup>**), assists (**2.1, T-3<sup>rd</sup>**) and free throw percentage (**.831, 4<sup>th</sup>**)... He tied an NBA rookie record with eight three-point field goals (on nine attempts) vs. New Orleans on Nov. 16... No other NBA club has lost more than five...** The Sacramento Kings (3-5), the Philadelphia 76ers (2-5) and the Miami Heat (2-6) are the only other NBA teams to have lost more than four... The Grizzlies suffered their **ninth** loss by three points or less this season following a 100-99 loss to the Los Angeles Lakers on Jan. 13... Memphis also lost its season opener vs. San Antonio (104-101) on Oct. 31, at Milwaukee (102-99) on Nov. 14, in overtime vs. New Orleans (120-118) on Nov. 16, at Dallas (108-105) on Nov. 17, vs. Portland (106-105) on Dec. 3, in overtime again at New Orleans (118-116) on Dec. 7, vs. Philadelphia (99-97) on Dec. 22 and at Sacramento (116-113) on Jan. 10.

Grizzlies Head Coach **Marc Iavaroni** promised to bring a high-scoring, fast-paced offensive system to Memphis, much like he did in his five previous seasons with the Phoenix Suns (including the last three-and-a-half as **Mike D'Antoni's** lead assistant) and so far has done little to disappoint... The Grizzlies are averaging **100.9** points per game, slightly behind last season's club record 101.6 scoring average...
