HORNETS-KINGS CONNECTIONS

- Peja Stojakovic played for the Kings from 1998-2006. In 487 career games with Sacramento, Stojakovic averaged 18.5 points and 4.9 rebounds in 34 minutes per game.
- Bobby Jackson played for the Hornets from 2006-08. In 102 career games with New Orleans, Jackson averaged nine points, 2.1 assists, and 2.1 rebounds in 21.7 minutes per game. Jackson was traded to Houston on Feb. 28, 2008 in a three-team deal that brought Bonzi Wells and Mike James to New Orleans.
- Brad Miller played for the Hornets from 1998-2000 when the team was in Charlotte. In 93 games Miller averaged 7.1 points and 4.4 rebounds in 15.4 minutes per game.
- James Posey and Kenny Thomas were teammates in Houston during the 2002-03 season.
- Byron Scott was an Assistant Coach with the Kings from 1998-2000.

Chris Paul set an NBA record with a steal in his 106th straight regular-season game and had 19 points and 12 assists to lead New Orleans to a 90-83 comeback victory against the Spurs on Dec. 17...Paul broke Alvin Robertson's NBA mark - which stood since 1986 - when he deflected and quickly corralled an attempted pass by Tony Parker late in the second quarter...David West scored 21 points for New Orleans, hitting a pair of late 3s to help erase a seven-point deficit in the last 5 minutes...Parker led San Antonio with 20 points, and Tim Duncan had 16 points and 11 rebounds...Paul got a brief rest to start the fourth quarter before checking back in with 8:50 to go and New Orleans trailing 74-67. Soon after, he converted a layup while getting fouled on a ball fake as he hung in the air...he then used a crafty bounce pass to set up West for an open jumper that pulled New Orleans to 75-72 with 6:25 to go...those plays sparked a 23-8 Hornets run to close out the game...the Spurs, who lead 74-65 after Manu Ginobili's driving layup early in the fourth quarter, did little else to help themselves offensively the rest of the period, when they shot 19 percent (4-of-21)...Tyson Chandler had 10 points and 11 rebounds and gave the Hornets the lead for good with a pair of free throws with 2:13 to go...on the Spurs' next possession, the Hornets got a stop and took off on the fast break, which Rasual Butler converted when he put back James Posey's miss... Posey then hit a 3 to make it 85-79 with 1:06 to go and San Antonio did not threaten again.

Chris Paul had 18 points, nine assists and five steals, James Posey scored nine of his 15 points in the fourth quarter, and the New Orleans Hornets beat the Memphis Grizzlies 91-84 on Tuesday night...the loss snapped Memphis' four-game winning streak, its longest of the season...the Hornets won for the fifth time in six games despite struggling from the field at times...David West also scored 18 points. Paul was just 3-of-10 from the field but made 11 of 12 free throws. He also tied Alvin Robertson's NBA record by recording a steal in his 105th consecutive game...Rudy Gay led Memphis with 28 points and O. J. Mayo added 20...New Orleans led by 15 in the first half, but Memphis capitalized on the Hornets' poor shooting to tie it at 81 with 3:18 left. A 3-pointer by Peja Stojakovic from the left corner with the shot clock running down put New Orleans up to stay at 84-81 with 2:52 remaining...despite shooting 24 percent in the first quarter, the Grizzlies stayed close behind 16 points from Gay and 12 from Mayo.

David West scored 29 points, James Posey added a season-high 20 points, including six 3-pointers, and 10 rebounds for the Hornets, who beat the Raptors 99-91 Sunday for their eighth win in 10 games...Rasual Butler scored 16 points and Paul added 12 points and 12 assists for the Hornets... Paul extended his streak of consecutive games with at least one steal to 104, and can match Alvin Robertson's NBA record when the Hornets visit Memphis on Tuesday. Paul's streak was in jeopardy until he swiped the ball from Jermaine O'Neal with 5:48 left...Paul didn't take long to pick up on Toronto's strategy and made the Raptors pay, feeding Posey for five 3-pointers in the first half...Chris Bosh had 25 points, and Jose Calderon scored 22 for Toronto on 8-for-8 shooting...Calderon also made his only free throw and has hit 59 straight dating to last season...O'Neal added 19 points for the Raptors, who were shooting for their first three-game winning streak since a 3-0 start...Toronto is 5-6 at home.

DID YOU KNOW?

TEAM

- The Hornets have held their last seven opponents to 95 or fewer points, winning eight of their 10 nine games.
- The Hornets limited the Spurs to two sub-20 point quarters...San Antonio scored just 15 points in the first quarter on 6-of-19 (31.6%) shooting, while in the fourth quarter, despite leading 70-63 at the start of the period, the Spurs posted just 13 points on 4-of-21 from the floor (19.0%)...New Orleans' most productive quarter, however, has been the third period, as the Hornets have outscored their opponents 544-494.
- The Spurs' 13-point fourth quarter was a season-low in point production, while for the Hornets, marked an opponent season-low .
- The Hornets have shot 40% or better in all but one game this season (12/12 at BOS, 35.4%).
- Memphis scored just 11 points in the first quarter of the Hornets' win over the Grizzlies 12/16 at FedEx Forum, a season-low for an opponent in the first quarter...the Grizzlies hit on 5-of-21 shots in the first period (23.8%).
- The Hornets took a season-best 38 free-throws 12/16 at MEM, hitting on 29 of those attempts...eight out of the Hornets' 10 players that saw action in the game attempted at least two free throws (with the exception of Sean Marks and Rasual Butler).
- The Hornets attempted a franchise-high 33 three-pointers 12/14 at Toronto...the previous franchise record was 31 (at ORL, 13-of-31, OT, 8-Mar-96; vs. SAC, 7-of-31, 18-Dec-03).
- After finishing the month of November with a record of 7-6, the Hornets have not had a .500 or worse monthly record since March of 2007 when they went 4-6.
- The Hornets blocked a season-high 10 shots 12/10 vs. CHA...the last time they posted 10 blocks was their 2007-08 season finale at DAL on 4/16.
- With the 105-89 win over CHA on 12/10, the Hornets moved to 6-0 all-time against the Bobcats on their home court.
- New Orleans set a season-high for points in a quarter with 37 points in the first period 12/6 vs. MEM.

INDIVIDUAL

- Chris Paul has had a steal in 106-consecutive games, breaking Alvin Robertson's NBA record of 105 games...it is the longest active streak in the NBA with the next best streak a 22-game effort from Boston's Rajon Rondo...Robertson had 393 steals during his streak, 111 more than Paul has had over his 105 games.
- James Posey came off the bench to score 20 points and grabbed 10 rebounds 12/14 at TOR, his first double-double since 12/7/07 vs. TOR during his time as a Boston Celtic...the last time Posey had a 20-10 game was 2/24/02 when he was with Denver and they lost to ATL...in that game, Posey had 20 points and 14 rebounds.
- There have been 13 games during the NBA season in which a player has scored 20-plus points and had 13-plus assists...Chris Paul has registered seven of those contests and is the only player with multiple performances of that caliber.
- Chris Paul posted 18 points, nine assists and five steals 12/16 at MEM, breaking his streak of five consecutive double-doubles...it's the first time since 11/28 at POR that he did not post a double-double.
- Chris Paul registered a double-double with 17 points and 11 assists 12/17 vs. SAS...Paul hasn't gone consecutive games without a double-double since 3/2/08 (at WAS) and 3/30/08 (at NYK).
- Chris Paul is the only player to record two triple-doubles this season and the first player to hit the 200-assist mark.
- Chris Paul ranks first in the NBA with 18 double-doubles (Orlando's Dwight Howard has 17).
- Chris Paul has registered six games with 15 or more assists; a league-best...Utah's Deron Williams is second with three.
- Chris Paul has registered 20-plus points and 10-plus assists on 13 occasions this season, ranking first in the NBA...the remainder of the NBA has 41 such games, as Dwyane Wade ranks second with four games of 20-plus points and 10-plus assists.
- Chris Paul has registered eight games with at least 20 points, 15 assists and three steals, along with three or fewer turnovers, eight times in his career, ranking second in NBA history behind John Stockton who registered 31 such performances...only 13 players in NBA history have recorded games with at least 20 points, 15 assists, three steals and three or less turnovers in NBA history.
- Chris Paul has had double-digit assists in 18 of 22 games this season...he is the first player to start the season with at least eight straight games with double-digit assists (to start the year) since John Stockton had at least 10 assists in his first nine games in 1991-92.
- Since his rookie season, Chris Paul has tallied three games with at least 20 points, 15 assists, five rebounds and three steals...the only other players to do so are Baron Davis (twice) and Dwyane Wade (once).
- Rasual Butler has eight blocks in the last five games, including a season-high three blocks 12/10 vs. CHA.
- Rasual Butler hit four three-pointers 12/14 at TOR...the last time he had four triples in a game was 1/25/08 at LAC when he went 4-of-5 from three-point range.
- Newly-acquired Antonio Daniels saw his first action as a Hornet 12/14 at TOR, dishing out five assists in nine-and-a-half minutes of play...Daniels was 0-of-1 from the field.
- Peja Stojakovic ranks second (tied with Reggie Miller) in NBA history with 28 games with six or more three-pointers...Stojakovic and Miller are second behind Ray Allen who has hit six or more triples on 40 separate occasions in his career.
- With eight points in the first quarter 12/10 vs. CHA, Peja Stojakovic surpassed the 12,000-point mark for his career.
- David West passed Alonzo Mourning for 5th all-time on the Hornets career rebounds list...P.J. Brown holds the franchise record with 4,203 rebounds.

CP3 BREAKS RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE GAMES WITH A STEAL: Chris Paul has had a steal in 106-consecutive games, the longest active streak in the NBA, and a new NBA record...Paul broke the mark set by Alvin Robertson from 11/6/85 to 12/29/86 with a swipe at the 3:43 mark in the second quarter against the Spurs on 12/17...Robertson had 393 steals during his streak, 111 more than Paul has had over his last 105 games...Paul has multiple steals in all but four games this season.

FANTASTIC FOURTH QUARTER: Heading into the final 12 minutes 12/17 vs. SAS, the Hornets trailed 70-63, however, a 27-13 quarter sealed the win for New Orleans...to close out the game, New Orleans went on a 16-4 run over the last 5:37 of the game en route to the 90-83 win. POSEY POSTS SEASON-HIGHS AT TORONTO: James Posey registered a season-high 20 points 12/14 at TOR, including a season-best seven field goals...he also had 10 rebounds for the Hornets, his first double-double since coming to New Orleans, and last since 12/7/07 vs. Toronto when he was with the Celtics during the 2007-08 campaign...he finished the game with 10 points and 10 rebounds...the last time Posey had a 20-10 game was 2/24/02 when he was with Denver and they lost to ATL...in that game, Posey had 20 points and 14 rebounds...12/14 at TOR, Posey had six triples in the game (a season-best for the first year Hornet) and tied an individual season-high...Posey is the first player off the bench to post a 20-point performance against the Raptors this season.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE FOR TC: Tyson Chandler registered his fifth double-double of the season with 10 points and 11 rebounds 12/17 vs. SAS...he also blocked a season-best four shots, as well as grabbing a season-high seven offensive rebounds.

WEST HOT IN THE LAST 13 GAMES: David West has been putting up big numbers for the Hornets in the last 13 games, scoring 18 or more points in 10 times in those contests...he's averaging a team-best 21.2 points in those 13 games (out of 98.2 Hornets points per game)...West is hitting on 51.5% (103-of-200) from the floor and is 93.1% (67-of-72) from the free-throw line...he's also grabbing 7.4 rebounds per contest, including 23 total on the offensive end.

2008 ALL-STARS PROVING THEIR WORTH: In the last seven games, Chris Paul and David West are averaging 38.9 points combined (279 total) of the Hornets' 96.7 points per contest...the trio is shooting 49.2% (92-of-187) from the field...Paul and West have hit on 95.7% (90-of-94) of free throws in the last seven outings and are combining for 13.6 rebounds and 3.4 steals per game...in the Hornets' win over SAS on 12/17, West and Paul combined for 40 of the Hornets' 90 points.

DANIELS MAKES HORNETS DEBUT: Antonio Daniels came off the bench to see action in a Hornets uniform for the first time 12/14 at TOR...he played nine minutes, dishing out five assists against the Raptors...Daniels also registered six points and two assists 12/16 at MEM...he was acquired from Washington for Mike James in a three-team deal with the Wizards and the Grizzlies on 12/10.

WEST HITTING THE BOARDS: In the last seven games, David West is averaging 9.0 rebounds, having averaged just 6.7 through the first 10 games of the season...West has grabbed eight or more rebounds five times in the last seven games, including two double-digit rebounding performances.

BEE-FENSE: The Hornets have seen improvement in a number of defensive categories in the last 12 games...New Orleans has held nine of their last 12 opponents to 95 or fewer points, posting an 10-2 record in those contests...the Hornets have had eight or more steals in 10 of the last 14 contests, while in the last 10 games, the Hornets have blocked four or more shots eight times, including a season-high, 10 blocked shots, 12/10 vs. CHA, and seven blocks 12/17 vs. SAS.

MORE THREE-POINTERS = MORE WINS: In the seven Hornets' losses this season, the three-ball has been the x-factor...in wins, the Hornets are hitting on 47.7% (9.0 3PM/game), including eight or more triples in the eight of the last nine contests (2-of-14 12/12 at BOS)...in losses, New Orleans is hitting on just 32.2% (5.4 3PM/game)...last season, the Hornets were third in the NBA, shooting 38.9% from three-point range...currently, New Orleans ranks first in the league, shooting 41.2%.

ROUGH SHOOTING NIGHT FOR PEJA: Over the eight games prior to 12/12 at BOS, Peja Stojakovic averaged 17.2 ppg while shooting 47.1% (48-102 FG) from the floor, including 53.8% (28-52 3PT) from three point range...Stojakovic had hit multiple three-pointers in six of the last eight games...in the match-up at Boston, Stojakovic was just 1-of-6 from the field, including 0-of-2 from three-point range, the first time in 63 games he failed to hit a three-pointer...Stojakovic finished the game with two points...the last time Stojakovic failed to hit multiple field goals in a game was 11/15 at HOU when he was 1-of-6 from the field.

FIRST 10 GAMES VS. SECOND 10 GAMES: In the first 10 games, the Hornets owned a 5-5 record, including averaging 93.9 points on 45.5% shooting...New Orleans shot 37.7% through the first 10 games, and also averaged 38.0 rebounds, while their opponents were grabbing 38.3 boards per game...in the last 10 games, however, the Hornets have seen much improvement, including an 8-2 record...in the last 10, New Orleans is hitting on 47.1% from the field, as well as 43.5% from behind the arc, averaging 100.0 points...they've also out-rebounded opponents, averaging 46.0 rebounds/game compared to 45.2 for opponents in those nine contests.

SELLING OUT: A sellout at the New Orleans Arena is nothing new these days...the Hornets have sold out 16 of the last 23 games at home...overall, they have had 23 sellouts since returning to New Orleans following Hurricane Katrina...the Hornets secured an average attendance of 14,181 during the 2007-08 season, including 12 regular-season sellouts...the Hornets sold out all 7 playoff games in 2008.

'SUAL SOLID AS A STARTER: In 14 starts this season, including nods in the last 13 games, Rasual Butler has come into the starting line-up as shooting guard, helping the Hornets to a 10-3 record in those 13 games...Butler is averaging 9.4 points and 2.8 rebounds in 27.9 minutes per game...he is hitting on 41.9% (44-of-105) of field goals, including 24-of-52 (46.2%) from behind the arc...off the bench, Butler averaged 5.4 points and 2.0 rebounds in eight contests...as a reserve, he shot 39.5% (17-of-43) from the field, including 38.9% from three-point range (7-of-18)...Butler also started in the Hornets win over Cleveland on 11/1.

STARTING STRONG: The Hornets scored a season-high 37 points in the first quarter 12/6 vs. MEM...New Orleans shot 86.7% in the period, making it the second best shooting display for a quarter this season in the NBA...the only quarter that surpasses New Orleans' was the Phoenix Suns' on Nov. 4 at New Jersey, when the team shot 92.8% (13-14 FG) in the second quarter of a 114-86 win.

WINS VS. LOSSES: When comparing Hornets' wins against Hornets' losses this season, the stats don't lie...the chart below shows the categories which are the difference between a win or a loss for New Orleans.

BACK-TO-BACK TRIPLE DOUBLES: Chris Paul recorded his sixth career triple-double 11/24 at LAC, just two days after registering the same feat against OKC on 11/22...he had 14 points, a season-high 17 assists, and 10 rebounds against the Clippers, while tallying 29 points, 10 rebounds and 16 assists to help the Hornets to a home win over the Thunder...the last player to post back-to-back triple-doubles was LeBron James on Feb. 19, 2008 and February 20, 2008

HORNETS HISTORY: TRIPLE-DOUBLES: The last Hornet to post back-to-back triple-doubles was Anthony Mason during the 1996-97 season (3/4/97 vs. San Antonio 19 points, 13 rebounds, 12 assists; 3/6/97 vs. Boston 19 points, 14 rebounds, 12 assists)...Paul is now second in franchise history with six triple-doubles, as Anthony Mason holds the franchise mark with seven in his career.

NOT JUST YOUR TYPICAL TRIPLE-DOUBLE: Chris Paul had 14 points, 10 rebounds and 17 assists in the Hornets' win against the Clippers on 11/24...that's the most assists in a triple-double for any NBA player over the last two seasons.

PAUL'S TRIPLE-DOUBLE SPOILS COACH'S NBA DEBUT: Chris Paul had 29 points, 10 rebounds and 16 assists to help the Hornets ruin Scott Brooks' debut as an NBA head coach 11/22 as the Hornets defeated the Thunder, 109-97 at the New Orleans Arena...Paul became the first player (on the coach's team or the opposition) in over 23 years to post a triple-double in a game in which a head coach was making his NBA debut...the last player to do that was Boston's Larry Bird, who recorded 21 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists against the Nets on opening night of the 1985-86 season, as Dave Wohl made his NBA coaching debut with New Jersey.

THE NEW CRESCENT CITY CONNECTION: After leading the NBA in alley-oops last season, Chris Paul and Tyson Chandler are at it again, leading the league with 20 alley-oops, more than doubling the total of the next best tandem...last season Paul and Chandler led the NBA with 106 alley-oops, more than 60 ahead of the next closest duo in the league in 2007-08.

20/10 STREAK COMES TO A HALT FOR CP3: With 17 points, nine assists, six rebounds and four assists 11/14 vs. POR, Chris Paul saw his seven-game streak of 20/10 games come to an end...the last player with as many as seven consecutive 20/10 games at any point in a season was Michael Adams, who had a nine-game streak for Denver in December 1990.

CP AND 'BIG O' ARE ELITE PAIR: Chris Paul reached 20 points and 10 assists in each of the first seven games this season...the feat surpassed an NBA record set by Oscar Robertson of six-straight games with at least 20 points and 10 assists to start the season...Robertson did so with the Cincinnati Royals in 1968.

MASTER OF THE 20-15-5 GAME: Since the 2005-06 season, Chris Paul has tallied seven games with at least 20 points, 15 assists, and five rebounds, tying Baron Davis for the most of any active NBA player...Steve Nash is second with six.

MAINTAINING A LEAD: In the Hornets match-up at PHO on 10/30, the Suns never led in their home loss to the Hornets...Phoenix had held a lead in its last 174 home games since losing to San Antonio on March 6, 2004...that had been the second longest current streak in the NBA behind the Spurs, who have led in their last 244 home games...the Hornets also never trailed in a 105-80 win at OKC on 11/21.

GOLDEN BOY: Chris Paul was a busy guy over the summer as a member of the 2008 Olympic Gold Men's Basketball team...Team USA boasted an unblemished record en route to the Gold Medal and Paul was a solid contributor off the bench at the point guard slot, averaging 8.0 points and 4.0 assists in 21.9 minutes...he shot 50-percent (19-of-38) from the floor and hit on 22-of-24 FT attempts (91.7-percent). Defensively, he had 18 steals in the squad's eight contests.

HORNETS DON NEW DUDS: In addition to a trio of new faces, the Hornets will debut new uniforms, new colors and new logos for the 2008-09 campaign...Creole Blue, Deep Passion Purple and Mardi Gras Gold will make up the Hornets color scheme, and three new logos will be used to represent the team, including the Fleur-de-Bee, a logo that was featured on last year's uniform...Below are the Hornets three new logos that will represent the Hornets connection to not only the city of New Orleans, but its tradition, flavor and textures.



2007-08: CP3'S YEAR

- Only one player (Steve Nash, last season) other than Chris Paul (11.6 assists, this season) has averaged at least 11.5 assists for a season in the last 13 years.
- Paul is the fourth player since the NBA started tracking steals in 1973-74 to lead the league in both assists and steals in a season.
- Paul is the first player in NBA history to lead the league in assists and steals while scoring 20 or more points per game.
- Paul is the first player ever to average at least 21 points, 11 assists and 2.7 steals per game...he finished the season first in the NBA in assists and steals, becoming the first player to finish first in steals and assists since John Stockton in 1991-92.
- Chris Paul became the first player in 15 years to average at least 20 points and 10 assists (Tim Hardaway, GSW, 21.5 ppg, 10.6 apg, 1992-93 season).

STEADY IMPROVMENTS: Over the last three seasons, the Hornets have improved immensely, winning 18 more games in the 2007-08 campaign than they did during the 2005-06 season...The below chart shoes the vast improvement and progress the Hornets have made:
