College: Made his mark in the Cardinal record book...was the 34th player in school history to reach 1,000 career points finishing with 1,265...ranks fourth all-time in career three-pointers (198)...ranks fifth in career assists (396) and steals (138)...his 75 three-point FG his senior season rank sixth for a single season...his senior season FT percentage of .901 (109-121) puts him fourth for a single season, while his career free throw mark (359-418) ranks sixth all-time. **Senior (2005-06):** Started 30 games for the Cardinal...averaged 14.0 points and led the team with a .901 free throw shooting percentage...first team Pac-10 All-Conference honoree...first team Pac-10 All-Academic selection...led team with 35 steals and 99 assists...drained a career-best seven three-pointers against Arizona (2/19)...was tabbed Pac-10 Player of the Week (Feb. 6). **Junior (2004-05):** Named first team All Pac-10 Conference...named 2005 Hank Luisetti Most Valuable Player ...named a District-8 *ESPN The Magazine* University Division First Team All-Academic selection...also named All Pac-10 Academic first team...named to the five-man National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District-14 first team along with teammate Dan Grunfeld...a pre-season John Wooden All-America candidate...member of the Pac-10 All-Tournament team...team co-captain along with Nick Robinson...led team in minutes played (34.8 mpg, #3 in the Pac-10)...leading active scorer (15.2 ppg, #9 in the Pac-10)...notched a career-high 37 points in Stanford's 78-65 victory over UCLA (2/20/05)...that was the most number of points by a Stanford player since Casey Jacobsen scored 41 points against Oregon during the 2001-02 season...helped lead Stanford to victory over nationally-ranked Arizona (1/8/05) with 23 points, a career-high six steals and four assists...averaged 4.0 apg (#6 in the Pac-10)...team leader in three-pointers made (65)...went .404 (65-for-161) from behind the arc, eighth-best in the Pac-10. **Sophomore (2003-04):** A finalist for the Bob Cousy Award, symbolic of the nation's top point-guard...Stanford's fourth leading scorer (10.0 ppg)...named first team All Pac-10 and also to the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District-9 first team...also named first team Basketball Times All-District (West Coast)...named second team All Pac-10 Academic...led Pac-10 in free throw percentage (.914, 96-for-105, fourth nationally)...hit 31 straight free throws before missing against Washington State (1/2/04)...led the league in three-point field goal percentage (.460, 46-for-100)...first on the team in steals (33)...averaged 4.4 assists per game, eighth in the Pac-10...carried an assist/turnover ratio of 1.83, #6 in the Pac-10. **2002-03:** Sidelined for the 2002-03 season with a broken foot...was projected as the team's starting point-guard, but broke a bone in his left foot during practice on Oct. 26...forced him out of action until the Dec. 14 game against St. Mary's when he collected three assists in six minutes of play...rebroke the bone in his left foot two nights later against Montana (12/16/02)...granted medical redshirt year. **Freshman (2001-02):** Named honorable mention All-Pac-10 as a freshman...winner of the Roy Young Toughness Award...one of Stanford's two reserve point-guards...appeared in 29 games with a season-high 23 minutes against Washington State (1/17/02) and Washington (2/14/02)...collected a season-high 14 points (4-for-5 from beyond the arc), four assists and two steals.
