2005-06 Season: Averaged a career-high 7.5 points along with 2.6 rebounds and 1.3 assists in a career-high 21.1 minutes...appeared in 81 of 82 games (14 starts) for the Jazz...shot .393 from the field, .331 from three-point range and .745 from the free throw line...recorded 10+ points in 24 games, scoring 20+ points twice...led the team in scoring four times, rebounds three times and assists once...led or tied for team-high in scoring off the bench 25 times...scored a career-high 25 points, going 7-13 from the field and 10-12 from the foul line in 35 minutes, 2/13 at LAL...recorded his 100th career steal 4/12 at DEN, 500th career rebound 3/21 vs. PHO and his 1,000th career point 1/6 at MEM.

Professional: 2004-05: Averaged 7.4 points, 2.6 rebounds and 1.4 assists in 67 games for the World Champion San Antonio Spurs...shot .423 from the field, .372 from the three-point line and .792 from the foul line...scored 20+ points six times...averaged 1.8 points and 0.6 rebounds in 5.0 minutes over 12 playoff games...missed one game due to back spasms and final 14 games of the regular season due to L4/L5 disc injury. 2003-04: Averaged 4.0 points and 2.2 rebounds in 10.8 minutes over 58 games for the Spurs...shot .434 from the field, .286 from the three-point line and .811 from the foul line...recorded 10+ points nine times...season-high 19 points in a season-best 28 minutes, 4/2 at UTA...averaged 5.8 points, 2.0 rebounds and 1.0 assists in 14.4 minutes over nine postseason games...16 points and seven rebounds in Game 3 of Round Two, 5/9 at LAL...recorded 15 DNP-CDs...missed a total of nine games due to injury-first six games of the season with left patella tendonitis and final three games of season with a costochondral separation. 2002-03: Split time between the NBA and the NBDL...appeared in a total of 10 games for the Spurs and Denver Nuggets...averaged 1.7 points and 1.0 rebounds in seven games for the Spurs...averaged 6.0 points, 3.7 rebounds and 1.7 assists in 23.7 minutes over three games (two starts) for the Nuggets...appeared in 44 games for the NBDL's Fayetteville Patriots, averaging 16.9 points, 4.1 rebounds and 2.0 assists in 24.7 minutes...shot .500 from the field, .370 from three-point range and .822 from the foul line...named the 2003 NBDL MVP, also taking home the Rookie of the Year and All-NBDL First Team honors. 2002: Named the 2002 USBL Rookie of the Year after averaging 17.3 points and 6.2 rebounds for the Kansas Cagerz.

College: Played four seasons at the University of Texas at San Antonio...the all-time leading scorer in Roadrunners' school history with 1,922 career points...appeared in 105 career games, averaging 18.3 points, 7.2 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 1.75 steals in 32.0 minutes...led UTSA in scoring all four years...earned First Team All-Southland Conference honors in each of his final three seasons...tabbed the Southland Conference Newcomer of the Year in 1999 after leading the Roadrunners to its second NCAA Tournament berth...as a junior, recorded the only triple-double in school history, finishing with 33 points, 11 rebounds and 11 assists 2/17/01 vs. Louisiana-Monroe...his #23 jersey was retired by UTSA on 2/12/04, the first player in school history to receive the honor.

Personal: Raised in San Antonio...son of Ann and James Brown and has one sister, Christal...lettered in basketball, baseball, golf and track at South San West Campus High School in San Antonio...San Antonio's all-time high school scoring leader, finishing with 2,763 points in just three years at West Campus...had his jersey retired in high school and college...helped collect and distribute food and donations for Hurricane Katrina victims...hosts a basketball camp in San Antonio in off-season...as a child, participated in the Spurs/Pizza Hut Drug-Free Youth Basketball League, today he is the honorary commissioner...has his own website, DBrown23.com...is an avid golfer.
