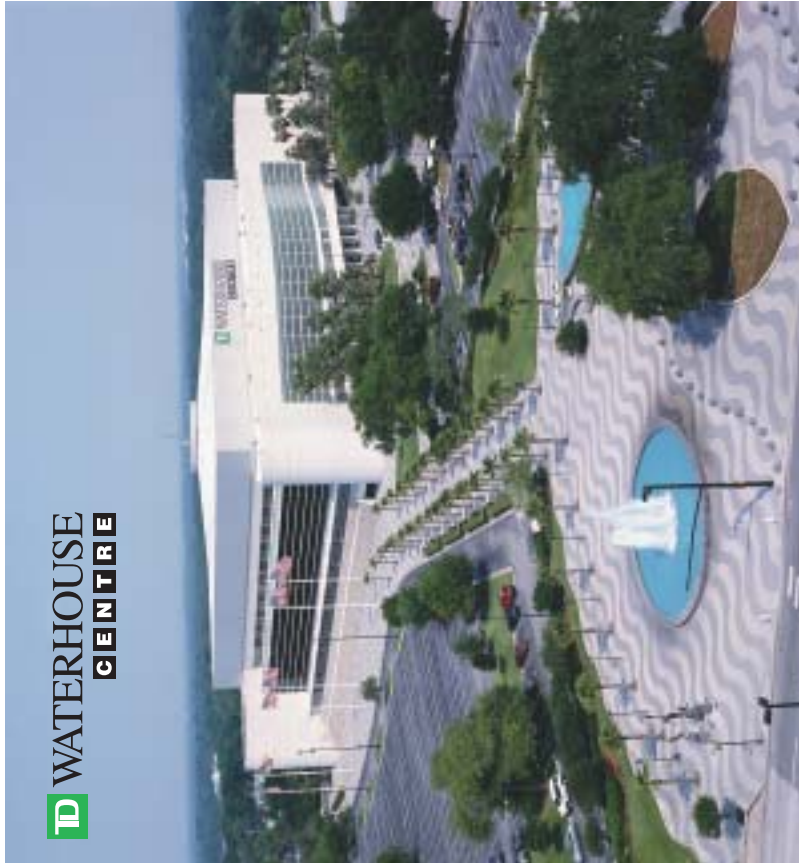

**TD WATERHOUSE CENTRE**



The TD Waterhouse Centre serves as home to the Orlando Magic of the NBA. In addition, it is home to the Orlando Predators of the Arena Football League, and various sporting and entertainment events.

The TD Waterhouse Centre, originally named Orlando Arena, opened in 1989. It is one of four facilities owned and operated by the City of Orlando all under the name of "The Orlando Centroplex." The other three facilities include the Bob Carr Performing Arts Centre, Tinker Field and The Florida Citrus Bowl.

From the historic opening-night emergence of the Orlando Magic onto the National Basketball Association scene - November 4, 1989 - to the glitz and glamour of the 1992 NBA All-Star Weekend, the building has hosted many major sporting events.

Since its opening, the TD Waterhouse Centre has played host to the 1995 NBA Finals, three IHL Turner Cup Finals championship series and the 1998 IHL All-Star Weekend, U.S Figure Skating Championship, three Arena Football Championships, NCAA Basketball Tournament games, McDonald's American Cup Gymnastic Championships and hundreds of world-class concerts and family shows.

Officially opened by Billy Cosby in 1989, the TD Waterhouse Centre has hosted superstars such as the Backstreet Boys, Garth Brooks, Cher, Janet Jackson, Elton John, Bette Midler, George Strait and Tina Turner, just to name a few.

Located in downtown Orlando, the TD Waterhouse Centre features curved walls made of more than 49,000 glass blocks, four corner nodes covered in imported red tiles, shiny terrazzo floors and beautifully landscaped grounds of Florida-style arrangements.

The TD Waterhouse Centre will celebrate its 17th anniversary in January of 2006.

## NBA AND NEPA COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT

The following is an outline of some of the principal economic terms of the collective bargaining agreement in principle between the NBA and the NBPA.

### A. TERM

The new CBA begins with the 2005-06 season and runs through the 2010-11 season plus NBA option for 2011-12 season.

### B. LENGTH OF CONTRACTS

The maximum length of a player contract has been decreased from 7 years for Bird players and 6 years for other players to 6 years for Bird players and 5 years for other players.

### C. ESCROW AND TAX SYSTEM

The escrow level will be 57% (same as the 2004-05 season), which is guaranteed to the players, so that if total player costs before deducting escrow monies from the players are less than 57% of BRI, the difference will be paid by the league to the players.

A team tax trigger will be set at 61% of BRI (the league-wide tax trigger for 2004-05 was 63.3%). The tax will be in effect each season, and will apply to any team with a payroll that exceeds the tax trigger. The tax trigger for each season will be established before the season based on a projection of BRI. For the 2005-06 season, it's set at \$61.7 million.

Each team will be permitted to waive one "amnesty" player on or before August 15, 2005 and to remove that player's salary from its payroll for purposes of computing its tax payment only for the 2005-06 season and any future seasons for which the player was under contract.

### D. SALARY CAP

The Salary Cap for the 2005-06 season is \$49.5 million (49.5% of BRI).

In the new deal, the salary cap increases from 48% of BRI currently to 49.5% of BRI in 2005-06 and 51% of BRI for the remainder of the CBA.

### E. ANNUAL SALARY INCREASES AND DECREASES

Bird and Early Bird Contracts - may increase by up to 10.5% of year-one salary.  
Other contracts - may increase by up to 8% of year-one salary.

### F. ROOKIE SCALE CONTRACTS

Rookie scale contracts will provide for two guaranteed seasons with two separate one-year options in favor of the team for seasons 3 and 4. The first team option is exercisable following the end of the player's first season, and the second team option is exercisable following the end of the player's second season. A team that exercises both options will continue to have first refusal rights following the player's fourth season.

### G. MAXIMUM PLAYER SALARIES

As under the prior CBA, in the first year of a new contract a player may receive the greater of 105% of the player's prior salary, or:

- 0-6 years of service: 25% of Salary Cap (\$12 million this year).
- 7-9 years of service: 30% of Salary Cap (\$14.4 million this year).
- 10 or more years of service: 35% of Salary Cap (\$16.8 million this year).

### H. MINIMUM PLAYER SALARIES

Any amounts paid to a player in a one-year minimum contract that exceed the minimum salary applicable to players with two years of service (instead of four under the prior CBA) shall be paid out of a league-wide benefits fund and shall be excluded from Team Salary.

### I. SALARY CAP EXCEPTIONS

**Mid-Level Exception:** For the 2005-06 season, the mid-level exception will be \$5 million and in subsequent years will equal 108% of the average player salary for the prior season.  
**The "Bi-annual" Exception:** For the 2005-06 season, the amount of the Bi-annual exception will be \$1.67 million and will increase by 4.5% annually.

### J. TRADE RULES

A traded player may be "simultaneously" replaced (i.e., in the same transaction) by one or more players whose salaries in the aggregate do not exceed 125% of the salary of the players being traded, plus \$100,000.  
"Sign-and-trade" transactions will be allowed, but only for contracts of three years or longer.

If a team trades a player and the player is subsequently waived by the assignee team, the assignor team will not be permitted to sign the player to a new contract (or claim him off of waivers) until at least 30 days have passed following the date the trade was made (or 20 days for trades that occur during the off-season).

A draft rookie may not be traded until 30 days following the date on which his contract is signed.

A player signed to a one-year contract who would be a Bird or Early Bird player at the conclusion of his contract cannot be traded without the player's consent.

### K. RESTRICTED FREE AGENCY

Offer Sheets must be for at least two seasons, not including any option year, unless the player's prior team gives the player both a Qualifying Offer and an alternative offer of a "maximum" contract, in which case the Offer Sheet must be for three or more years.

A team now has seven (7) days to match an offer sheet tendered to a player that is subject to such team's Right of First Refusal.

### L. ANTI-DRUG PROGRAM/CONDUCT DISCIPLINE

All players will be subject to four random drug tests each season.

The penalties for testing positive for performance-enhancing drugs will be increased from suspensions of 5, 10, and 25 games for the first, second and any subsequent violation, respectively, to 10 and 25 game suspensions for the first two violations, a one-year suspension for the third violation and disqualification from the league for a fourth violation.

### M. OTHER

During an NBA player's first two seasons in the league, his team will be permitted to assign him to a team in the NBA Development League up to three times per season.

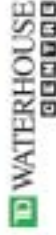
Beginning in 2006, the age limit for entering the Draft will increase from 18 to 19 years of age. U.S. players must be at least one year removed from high school and 19 years of age (by the end of that calendar year) before entering the draft. An international player must turn 19 during the calendar year of the draft.

IN THE COMMUNITY AND ON THE COURT -- DID YOU KNOW?

**GIVING . . .**

- Orlando Magic owner Rich DeVos has donated: \$1 million to the Heart of Florida United Way; \$2.5 million to enable the University of Central Florida to launch the DeVos Sport Business Management Program; and \$1 million in an effort to aid victims of last year's hurricanes in Florida.
- Over the last 16 years, more than \$12 million has been distributed to local non-profit community organizations via The Orlando Magic Youth Foundation. OMYF, a fund of the McCormick Tribune Foundation, focuses on helping every child in Central Florida realize their full potential, especially those most at risk, by supporting programs and partnerships that empower families and change lives.
- Since launching its Read To Achieve literacy program in 2001, the Orlando Magic have donated 17,000 books to elementary schools and literary organizations and taken part in Read Aloud events and related school appearances for more than 5,000 area elementary students.

**IMPACTING . . .**

- Orlando Magic Community Relations programs annually impact an estimated 75,000 kids, while the Orlando Magic Youth Foundation has positively impacted more than 1 million children over the last 16 years.
- On an annual basis, Magic players log more than 200 community appearances to area schools, organizations and neighborhood centers.
- This past season, nine Magic players had ticket programs benefiting 100 at-risk youth per game.

**REACHING . . .**

- Through television programming, the NBA is broadcast in 214 countries in 43 languages reaching more than 750 million households. On the home front, the Orlando Magic works with numerous tourist groups to help promote basketball for visitors to Orlando.
- Since its inception, the Orlando Magic has played on national television 200-plus times, generating hundreds of millions of impressions. Local, state,

national and international media cover the Magic on a regular basis. Orlandomagic.com, the team's official web site, generates 1,500,000-plus impressions each month.

- Season ticket highlights for 2005-2006 include: 7,313 seats priced \$31 or under per game, 2,166 seats priced \$15 or under per game and tickets as low as \$38 per game in the lower bowl, and \$10 per game in the upper bowl. Season tickets range in price from \$10 to \$170 with 15 different price points. There are several ticket packages and group opportunities available.

**COMMITTED TO THE COMMUNITY, OFF THE COURT, AND ON . . .**

- Orlando has advanced to postseason play eight times over the last 12 years. The Magic has also finished with a .500 or better record in 11 of the last 13 seasons. Orlando advanced to the NBA Finals in just its sixth season of existence. Orlando became the second-fastest team to advance to the NBA Finals in league history (Milwaukee advanced to the NBA Finals in 1970-71, its third year).
- Since the DeVos family purchased the Orlando Magic in September of 1991, the franchise has won two Atlantic Division Championships (1995, 1996), one Eastern Conference title (1995) and had three 50-win seasons. Over the course of its history, Orlando has sold out 62 percent of its games, while winning 66 percent of its home games since 1994-95. Included in its history is a 40-game home winning streak (Mar. 21, 1995 - Mar. 26, 1996) and a 247-game sellout streak (Nov. 15, 1990 - Nov. 21, 1996).
- Over the last seven seasons, Orlando has won 13 significant NBA awards (two All-NBA First Team honors, four NBA All-Rookie First Team honors, two Most Improved Player awards, the Rookie of the Year, the Sixth Man of the Year, the Executive of the Year, the Coach of the Year and the NBA Sportsmanship Award).
