LAST GAME:

NBA Playoffs 2003 – First Round – May 2 vs. Detroit, Game #6 – Pistons 103, Magic 88: Chauncey Billups poured in a career-playoff-high 40 points and Richard Hamilton added 22 points, as Detroit avoided elimination for the second straight game and defeated Orlando, 103-88, at TD Waterhouse Centre in Game #6 of their best-of-seven, first round series. The series is now tied at 3-3. Ben Wallace tallied 20 points, 17 rebounds, five blocked shots and four steals for the Pistons. Tracy McGrady led the way for the Magic with 37 points. For the fifth straight game, Orlando fell behind early, trailing 30-21 after the first quarter. Billups went 5-of-5 from three-point range in the quarter and had 18 points. He had 26 at halftime and the Pistons led 54-43 at halftime. Orlando cut the deficit to 83-76 with 5:36 left after a jumper by Gordan Giricek. However, it would be as close as the Magic could get. Billups netted 11 more points in the fourth quarter, as the Pistons held Orlando to just 39.5 percent from the floor during the contest.

FIRST ROUND VS. DETROIT:

NBA Playoffs 2003 – First Round - Apr. 30 @ Detroit, Game #5 – Pistons 98, Magic 67: Six Pistons scored in double figures, led by Richard Hamilton's 24 points, as Detroit avoided elimination and defeated Orlando, 98-67, at The Palace of Auburn Hills in Game #5 of their best-of-seven, first round series. The Magic still lead the series, 3-2. Chauncey Billups and Tayshaun Prince each netted 15 points for Detroit, while Ben Wallace recorded 14 points and 21 rebounds, his third straight game with 20-plus boards. Tracy McGrady led the way for the Magic with 19 points, and Drew Gooden tallied another double-double with 10 points and a team-high 15 rebounds. Orlando shot just 32.0 percent from the field and never led during the contest. The Pistons shot just 43.8 percent from the floor, but had 16 offensive rebounds and 20 second chance points.

NBA Playoffs 2003 – First Round - Apr. 27 vs. Detroit, Game #4 – Magic 100, Pistons 92: After overcoming a 10-point, first quarter deficit, the Magic pulled away from Detroit thanks to an 18-0 run during the third quarter and recorded a 100-92 victory over the Pistons at a sold-out TD Waterhouse Centre in Game #4 of their best-of-seven, first round series. Orlando takes a 3-1 series advantage. Tracy McGrady again led all scorers with 27 points and dished out nine assists. Drew Gooden tallied 20 points and 13 rebounds for the Magic, while Darrell Armstrong netted 18 points off the bench. Chauncey Billups led the Pistons with a career-playoff-high 25 points and Ben Wallace ripped down 24 rebounds, his second straight game with 20-plus boards. Orlando shot 50.0 percent from the floor and held Detroit to just 41.3 percent. In the second and third quarters combined, the Magic outscored Detroit, 62-38. They led by as many as 19 points early in the fourth quarter.

NBA Playoffs 2003 – First Round - Apr. 25 vs. Detroit, Game #3 – Magic 89, Pistons 80: Tracy McGrady scored a game-high 29 points, while Darrell Armstrong added 20 points off the bench, as Orlando defeated Detroit, 89-80, at a sold-out TD Waterhouse Centre in Game #3 of their best-of-seven, first round series. The Magic now hold a 2-1 series lead. Drew Gooden added 15 points and seven rebounds, while Gordan Giricek netted 10, all in the third quarter. Richard Hamilton led the Pistons with 22 points, and Ben Wallace ripped down 22 rebounds, the most-ever by an opponent during Magic playoff history. The Pistons jumped out of the gates quickly, thanks to 13 points by Hamilton and led 29-19 after the first quarter. Orlando responded in the second quarter, outscoring Detroit, 29-17, and leading 48-46 at halftime. Giricek led sparked a 12-2 run for the Magic midway through the third with eight of his 10 points. The Pistons cut the Orlando lead to 82-76 with 2:03 remaining, but it would be as close as they would come.

NBA Playoffs 2003 – First Round - Apr. 23 @ Detroit, Game #2 – Pistons 89, Magic 77: Five Pistons scored in double figures, led by Richard Hamilton's 30 points, as Detroit defeated Orlando, 89-77, at The Palace of Auburn Hills in Game #2 of their best-of-seven, first round series. Chauncey Billups scored 15 points for Detroit, while Ben Wallace pulled down 16 rebounds. Tracy McGrady torched the Pistons for a playoff-career-high and Magic postseason record 46 points. He was 16-of-26 from the floor, 4-of-9 from three-point range and 10-of-11 from the free throw line. Detroit jumped out to a quick advantage, leading 31-14 after the first quarter and by as many as 22 in the first half. Orlando trailed 54-40 at halftime, and trimmed the

deficit to 70-61, after 14 points in the third quarter by McGrady. However, the Magic could not get much closer. Orlando shot just 39.7 percent from the floor.

NBA Playoffs 2003 – First Round - Apr. 20 @ Detroit, Game #1 – Magic 99, Pistons 94: Tracy McGrady poured in a Magic playoff record 43 points, as Orlando defeated Detroit, 99-94, at The Palace of Auburn Hills in Game #1 of their best-of-seven, first round series. Drew Gooden, making his playoff debut, tallied 18 points, 14 rebounds and two blocks for the Magic, who won the first game of a playoff series for the first time since the 1996 Eastern Semifinals (vs. Atlanta). Richard Hamilton led the Pistons with 28 points, while Chauncey Billups had 21. The Magic held the Pistons to just 31.6 percent shooting from the field. However, the Pistons stayed in the game by going 40-of-47 from the free throw line. The 40 free throws set a new Magic playoff record for an opponent and the 47 attempts tied the Orlando postseason mark. In contrast, Orlando was 22-of-25 from the charity stripe. The Magic got tremendous production from their bench, outscoring Detroit, 28-16.

SEASON RESULTS AGAINST OPPONENT:

May 4, Game #7 @ Detroit, NBA Playoffs 2003 - First Round (Auburn Hills, MI): Orlando is 25-28 all-time vs. Detroit (17-9 at home, 8-19 on the road) during regular season action, including 1-2 this season (see below)...Orlando is 6-3 vs. Detroit all-time during the playoffs (2-0 at home, 1-0 on the road, 1996 first round series; **2-1 at home, 1-2 on road this series**)... Orlando split the last six regular season meetings with the Pistons overall...The Magic have won 17 of the last 20 regular season matchups at home, but lost five of the last six at Detroit...Grant Hill spent the first six seasons of his NBA career with Detroit...Assistant Coach Mark Hughes helped the University of Michigan capture the 1989 NCAA Championship and served as Head Coach of Grand Rapids of the CBA (1998-2002)...For last season's stats and Magic career numbers vs. Detroit, see p. 287 of the media guide...**Feb. 13 @ Detroit – Pistons 98, Magic 88:** Richard Hamilton scored a team-high 29 points, leading the Pistons to a 98-88 victory over Orlando at The Palace of Auburn Hills. It was the fifth loss in six trips to Detroit for the Magic. Clifford Robinson netted 18 points, including a three-quarter court shot at the end of the third quarter. Ben Wallace ripped down a game-high 18 rebounds and had four blocked shots. Tracy McGrady led all scorers with 35 points and added team-highs of 11 rebounds and six assists. The Magic committed 19 turnovers and shot just 41.9 percent from the field. McGrady converted a layup with 4:22 remaining in the contest to trim the deficit to 84-81. However, it would be as close as Orlando could get, as Robinson answered on the ensuing possession with a three-pointer, pushing the lead back to six points....**Jan. 13 vs. Detroit – Pistons 101, Magic 86:** Richard Hamilton poured in a game-high 27 points, as Detroit defeated Orlando, 101-86, at TD Waterhouse Centre. It was the third straight home loss for the Magic. Hamilton went 9-of-13 from the floor and 9-of-10 from the free throw line. Clifford Robinson had 17 points for the Pistons, while Ben Wallace ripped down a game-high 19 rebounds. Tracy McGrady paced Orlando with 20 points and Mike Miller netted 18. Orlando led 29-22 after the first quarter and 54-53 at halftime. However, the Pistons opened the second half with an 8-0 run and never looked back. Detroit outscored the Magic in the second half, 48-32, and held Orlando to just 11 points in the fourth quarter....**Dec. 25 vs. Detroit – Magic 104, Pistons 99:** Tracy McGrady exploded for a game-high 46 points, as Orlando defeated Detroit, 104-99, at TD Waterhouse Centre. McGrady was 14-of-26 from the floor and 18-of-21 from the free throw line. Mike Miller netted 15 points for the Magic, while Grant Hill tallied 10 points and a season-high-tying 15 rebounds. Richard Hamilton led the way for the Pistons with 22 points, and Corliss Williamson added 17 points off the bench. The Pistons had six players record double figures in scoring. Orlando never trailed during the contest, leading by as many as 17 points in the third quarter. Detroit made a push in the fourth quarter, trimming the deficit to two points on three different occasions. However, the Magic would never relinquish the lead. McGrady went 10-of-12 from the charity stripe in the final stanza to help seal the victory.

WELCOME TO NBA PLAYOFFS 2003...

With a 98-86 victory @ Indiana on Apr. 11, the Orlando Magic clinched a berth in NBA Playoffs 2003...This is the Magic's third straight playoff appearance and eighth postseason trip in franchise history...It is also the third time in four years under Head Coach Doc Rivers...Orlando is 26-33 all-time in the postseason: 14-19 in the opening round, 8-3 in the conference semifinals, 4-7 in conference finals and 0-4 in NBA Finals action...The Magic are 18-13 all-time at home during the NBA Playoffs and 8-20 on the road...Orlando advanced to the Eastern Conference Finals in 1995 and 1996, and became the second-fastest team to reach the NBA Finals in 1995.

CHANCE TO ADVANCE TONIGHT...

With a win tonight, the Orlando Magic will advance to the Eastern Conference Semifinals for the third time in franchise history, and the first time since 1996...During Orlando's playoff history, the Magic are 5-5 in games where they can clinch a series win, including 3-4 on the road.

WINNING WAYS...

With their 98-86 win on Apr. 11 @ Indiana, the Orlando Magic recorded their 41st victory of the season...The Magic finished with a record of 42-40 (.512)...It marks Orlando's 11th consecutive season with a .500 record or better...The last time the Magic finished under .500 was 1991-92, when they were 21-61 (.256).

MAGIC TRICKS – SEVENTH HEAVEN

The Magic will face Detroit in a decisive Game #7 this afternoon...It is only the second Game #7 in Magic franchise history...The only other Game #7 was during the 1995 Eastern Conference Finals, where they defeated Indiana, 105-81 (June 4, 1995).

MAGIC TRICKS – WIN...OR GO HOME

Today marks the third time in Magic franchise history that they will play a decisive game during a playoff series...Orlando beat Indiana, 105-81, in Game #7 of the 1995 Eastern Conference Finals, and the Magic lost @ Miami in Game #5 of the 1997 First Round, 91-83 (May 4, 1997).

HOME ON THE RANGE...

The Magic finished 26-15 at home, won six of the last eight, and 12 of the last 16 home games...Since 1994-95 (350 games), Orlando has gone 251-99 (.717) at the TD Waterhouse Centre...The Magic have an all-time home mark of 359-199 (.643).

MAGIC TRICKS – HOME COURT

During the NBA Playoffs, Orlando is 18-13 (.581) all-time at home, including 2-1 this postseason.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...

The Magic finished 16-25 on the road this season...Last season, the Magic went 17-24 away from the TD Waterhouse Centre.

****MAGIC TRICKS – ROAD TRIP****

During the NBA Playoffs, Orlando is 8-20 (.286) all-time on the road, including 1-2 this postseason.

NECESSARY CHANGES...

The Orlando Magic battled through numerous injuries during the 2002-03 season, forcing all 12 members of the team to be ready at a moment's notice...The Magic used 21 different starting lineups during the regular season...Orlando used 18 different sets of starters during the 2001-02 campaign.

T-MAC'S PRIME TIME PERFORMANCES...

Tracy McGrady continues to step up his game come playoff time...T-Mac poured in a career-playoff high 46 points on Apr. 23 @ Detroit in Game #2...The 46 points sets a new Magic playoff record for most points in a game...It also tied the record for the most points ever scored at The Palace of Auburn Hills...In Game #1 on Apr. 20, McGrady poured in 43 points during the Magic's 99-94 win...T-Mac's first two scoring outputs against the Pistons are the third and fourth-highest point totals against a #1 seed since the NBA went to a 16-team format in 1984 (Jordan @ Boston - 63 on Apr. 20, 1986 and 49 on Apr. 17, 1986)...In 17 career postseason outings, T-Mac is averaging 29.9 ppg. (509 points), has scored 30-plus points nine times and 40-plus points three times, the three highest single-game scoring performances in Magic postseason history...He has led (or tied) the Magic in all 14 postseason games he has played with Orlando.

****MAGIC TRICKS – T-MAC BACK-TO-BACK****

Tracy McGrady scored 40-plus points in Games #1 and #2 of the Magic's first round series against Detroit...His 89 combined points are the highest two-game total in Magic playoff history...The previous record was held by Anfernee Hardaway, who scored 40-plus points (83 total) in back-to-back games against Miami during the 1997 First Round (42 on Apr. 29, 41 on May 1).

T-MAC ATTACK...

Guard Tracy McGrady continued to show why he was named to the All-NBA First Team in 2001-02, earned a spot in the NBA All-Star Game for the third straight time, and is a candidate for NBA MVP...This season, McGrady led the NBA in scoring, while also leading the Magic in assists, steals and minutes played...He led (or tied) the team in scoring 69 times, including a career-high 52 points on Feb. 21 vs. Chicago...He scored 20-plus points 70 times, 30-plus points 51 times and 40-plus points 11 times...During his career, McGrady has scored 30-plus points 99 times and 40-plus points 22 times.

****MAGIC TRICKS – T-MAC****

Tracy McGrady scored 30-plus points in 51 games during the 2002-03 season, a franchise record...McGrady's 51 outings with 30-or-more are the most by any NBA player since Michael Jordan recorded 52 30-point games during the 1990-91 season with Chicago...Tracy McGrady averaged 34.8 ppg. during the last 26 outings he played (906 points), scored 30-plus points 20 times and 40-plus points six times.

****MAGIC TRICKS – T-MAC 2****

McGrady scored 20-plus points in 45 straight appearances (Dec. 25-Apr. 1), shattering the franchise record for most consecutive games with 20-or-more points...The old record was 26 games, set by Shaquille O'Neal in 1993-94...It was the longest streak in the NBA this season and tied for the fifth-longest streak in the NBA since 1975-76:

YOUTH GONE WILD...

Tracy McGrady finished the season as the NBA scoring champion and averaged 30-plus points per game, becoming the youngest player to average 30-plus points per game since the NBA/ABA merger in 1976-77...He also became the youngest player to accomplish the feat since Bob McAdoo averaged 34.5 ppg. for the Buffalo Braves back in 1974-75...Here is a look of the top five youngest players to average 30-or-more points in a season:

****MAGIC TRICKS – 30-SOMETHING****

Tracy McGrady scored 30-plus points in 14 consecutive outings (Mar. 5-Apr. 1), easily breaking his own franchise record for consecutive games played with 30-or-more points...He scored 30-plus points in eight straight games from Jan. 16-Feb. 2...T-

Mac also scored 30-plus points in seven straight games earlier this season (Nov. 10-Nov. 20), breaking the franchise record previously held by Shaquille O'Neal, who scored 30-plus points in five straight outings during the 1993-94 campaign...McGrady's streak was the second-longest in the NBA since 1975-76:
