PACERS NOTES

The Indiana Pacers entered their second season after reaching the NBA Finals with a different look after making some changes to the roster and becoming the youngest team in the NBA. The Pacers waived Derrick McKey and Sam Perkins prior to the start of the season and Tyus Edney, Lari Ketner and Terry Mills did not re-sign. Jamison Brewer, Primož Brezec, Norm Richardson, Carlos Rogers and Jamaal Tinsley were added to the roster through the draft and free agent signings.

The Pacers transformed the roster again in February when they made the biggest trade in franchise history. The Pacers acquired Ron Artest, Ron Mercer, Brad Miller and Kevin Ollie from the Chicago Bulls in exchange for Travis Best, Norm Richardson, Jalen Rose and a second round draft pick. Pacers' Sports & Entertainment President Donnie Walsh made the trade because he believed it would add strength in areas the team needed and be helpful to the team's future. The Pacers would go 16-13 following the trade and end the season 42-40.

OCTOBER / NOVEMBER OVERALL: 9-9; HOME: 6-3; AWAY: 3-6

For the third consecutive season, the Pacers started the season on the road and won six of their first eight games to record the best start in the team's NBA history. The Pacers lost their next four games, all to playoff teams – New Jersey, Boston, Minnesota and Detroit – to even their record at 6-6. They closed out the month going 3-3 and getting a road win at Denver. The Pacers played seven sets of back-to-backs and were 7-7 in those games. Jamaal Tinsley dazzled everyone with his play and earned Eastern Conference got milk? Rookie of the Month. He recorded a triple-double vs. Washington, 11/22, with 19 points, 11 rebounds and a franchise record 23 assists. For the month, Tinsley averaged 10.9 points, 4.1 rebounds, 9.2 assists and 2.06 steals in 18 contests.

DECEMBER OVERALL: 9-6; HOME: 5-2; AWAY: 4-4

Completing a five-game West Coast trip, the Pacers won at Utah to open the month and finish the road trip with a record of 2-3. Returning to Conseco Fieldhouse, the Pacers would win five of their next six games at home and improve their overall home record to 11-4. The Pacers rattled off three consecutive road victories – Atlanta, Cleveland and Orlando – to produce their longest road winning streak of the season. Al Harrington contributed a strong month for the Pacers as he averaged 15.5 points, 7.2 rebounds, 1.2 assists, 1.47 steals and 33.1 minutes per game, all off the bench.

JANUARY OVERALL: 6-8; HOME: 3-4; AWAY: 3-4

January started out promising as the Pacers had won four of the previous six games to end December and continued the winning ways by getting road victories at San Antonio and Houston to open the month. The Pacers, owners of the longest current streak of any NBA team to not lose five consecutive games, dating back to January, 1994, saw that streak come to an end. The Pacers dropped five consecutive games from 1/12 – 1/19. The month continued with bad news as the Pacers saw their sixth man, Al Harrington, suffer a season ending knee injury at Boston, 1/23. They ended the month by winning two of their last three games and were 24-23 on the season.

FEBRUARY OVERALL: 4-6; HOME: 3-3; AWAY: 1-3

The Pacers opened their third consecutive month with a victory, but went on to lose four straight surrounding the all-star break. The Pacers revamped their roster on February 19 by acquiring Ron Artest, Ron Mercer, Brad Miller and Kevin Ollie from the Chicago Bulls in exchange for Travis Best, Norm Richardson, Jalen Rose and a second round draft pick. Following the trade, the Pacers finished out the month 2-2.

MARCH OVERALL: 8-7; HOME: 4-2; AWAY: 4-5

Entering the month, the Pacers were 28-29 and looking to make a playoff push. The schedule did not look friendly as they were completing their second west coast swing and faced the Lakers and Kings. The Pacers fell to the Lakers, but knocked off the Kings for a second time and returned home from the trip 2-2. After dropping games at Memphis and Philadelphia, the Pacers got a big road win at Detroit which propelled them on to win five of their next six games. Following their hot streak, the Pacers ended the month by losing three of their last four and ending March at 36-36. Jamaal Tinsley registered 11.9 points, 4.0 rebounds and 6.2 assists in 15 games during March and was acknowledged as the Eastern Conference got milk? Rookie of the Month for a second time.

APRIL OVERALL: 6-4; HOME: 4-2; AWAY: 2-2

The Pacers entered April with a distinct possibility of not making the playoffs for just the second time in the past 13 seasons. Losing four of their first five games of April, the Pacers did not do themselves any favors and were seeing their playoff chances decrease each game. As the last two spots in the Eastern Conference playoffs were up for grabs between Indiana, Milwaukee and Toronto, the Pacers knocked off the Raptors as they started their resurgence in the playoff race. Indiana kept the momentum as they went on to beat Milwaukee, Washington, Cleveland and Philadelphia to secure the eighth seed in the playoffs and produce their first five game winning streak of the season. Jermaine O'Neal led the Pacers during April by averaging 24.1 points on 50.3 percent shooting from the floor, 9.9 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.60 blocks in 10 games.

SIXTH MAN OF THE YEAR

Al Harrington was having his most productive season in the NBA and a leading candidate for Sixth Man of the Year until he suffered a torn right anterior cruciate ligament at Boston, 1/23. Harrington averaged 13.1 points, 6.3 rebounds, 1.2 assists, 0.93 steals and 29.8 minutes per game in 44 contests, making one start. He established career-highs in points, field goals made, attempted and percentage, free throws made and percentage, defensive and total rebounds, steals and blocks. He recorded five double-doubles, four of them coming off the bench and he averaged 14.0 points and 13.4 rebounds in those five games.

O'NEAL IS MOST IMPROVED

Jermaine O'Neal has shown such steady improvement over the past two seasons that he has been rewarded by being named to the 2001 USA Goodwill Team, 2002 NBA All-Star Team and the 2002 USA World Basketball Team. O'Neal averaged career-highs of 19.0 points, 10.5 rebounds, 1.6 assists, and 0.63 steals per game. O'Neal led the Pacers in points (1371), rebounds (757) and blocks (166). He also established career-highs this season in points, field goals made, free throws made, free throws attempted, defensive rebounds and steals. O'Neal broke into the top 10 and ranks fifth all-time in Pacers' NBA history after only his second season in blocks with 394. Below is a chart showing his improvement over the past three seasons.

The Pacers increased their scoring per game from 96.6 points to 100.7 points the 11 games following the trade. The main reason can be attributed to the charity stripe. POWER IN THE PAINT

The Pacers are averaging 39.7 points in the paint since the trade on Feb. 19. Prior to that, the Pacers were only averaging 35.7 points in the paint. MILLER MOMENTS

Reggie Miller added to his sharp-shooting legacy by becoming the first NBA player to make 2,200 3-pt FGs when he hit his sixth 3-pt FG at Toronto on 4/7. He finished the season with 180 3-pt FGs, his third highest total of his career. Miller shot 91.1 percent (296-325) from the free throw line winning his second consecutive NBA free throw accuracy title, third in the last four seasons and fourth of his career. Miller finished the season ranked sixth all-time in the NBA in free throw percentage (.885) for his career.

Reggie Miller entered the 2001-02 season ranked 21st on the NBA all-time scoring list. He averaged 16.5 points over 79 games and moved into 18th place passing Hal Greer, Larry Bird and Clyde Drexler. He needs 527 points to overtake Elgin Baylor for the 17th position. Miller, extending his longevity with the Pacers, only needs five more games to surpass Hakeem Olajuwon for the most games played with one team.

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

Jamaal Tinsley, the 27th overall pick in the 2001 NBA Draft, entered the NBA and quickly showed why he deserved the starting point guard spot by earning Eastern Conference *got milk?* Rookie of the Month for November. He established the Pacers' single season rookie record in assists with his second dime vs. Miami, 12/31, giving him 296, breaking the record before the halfway point of the season. After suffering through nagging injuries during December, January and February, Tinsley rebounded with a strong month of March and garnered the Eastern Conference *got milk?* Rookie of the Month award for a second time. He led all rookies in assists (8.1 apg) and steals (1.73 spg), finished tied for 6th in points (9.4 ppg) and 4th in minutes (30.5 mpg). He ranks tied for 39th in the NBA (2nd among rookies) in double-doubles with 17 and is tied for 3rd in the NBA (1st among rookies) with two triple doubles.

10/30 – New Jersey 103, Indiana 97 - The Pacers made their first seven shots from the field and led by as many as 14 points in the first quarter and extended their lead to a game-high 17 points early in the second period. The Pacers were led by Jermaine O'Neal, who scored a game-high 25 points to go with 11 rebounds for his 14th double-double of the season. Kerry Kittles helped the Nets jump out to an early lead with 15 of his team-high 22 points in the first half. 11/2 – Indiana 117, Orlando 107 - After exchanging the lead eight times in the first period, Indiana took the lead for good on a 19-11 run to close out the first period that gave Indiana a seven-point lead. Fueled by 14 points from the duo of Tracy McGrady and Mike Miller, the Magic cut the Indiana lead to just one point with a minute-and-a-half left in the contest. Reggie Miller and Al Harrington each made two free throws in the remaining time to seal the victory. In addition to Harrington's team-high 23 points, Jermaine O'Neal had 20 points, including 14 in the first half. Tracy McGrady scored a game-high 31 points to lead the Magic.

3/5 – Indiana 111, Orlando 98 - Leading by just one point (46-45) with three minutes left in the first half, the Pacers embarked on a 10-2 run sparked by the backcourt duo of Jamaal Tinsley and Kevin Ollie as they scored or assisted on all 10 points in the run to give the Pacers a nine-point lead at the end of the first half. The Magic would never get closer than six points the rest of the way. Indiana built a lead as large as 15 points in the third period, only to have Orlando shrink the lead back to six points with less than five minutes left in the game. The Pacers scored eight of the next 10 points to re-gain a double-digit lead and close out the victory. Jamaal Tinsley led the Pacers with 30 points and Jermaine O'Neal had a team-high 11 rebounds. Pat Garrity led the Magic with 18 points and Tracy McGrady added 13 points to go with 11 rebounds and seven assists.

3/29 – Orlando 114, Indiana 106 - Indiana hit just four of its first 20 shots from the floor in the third quarter and trailed by 24 points with two seconds left in the period, but Kevin Ollie capped the quarter with a 19-foot jump shot that sparked the Pacers to a 16-0 run that left them trailing by just eight points with nine minutes remaining in the game. Indiana closed to within five points with just over a minute left in the game, but the Pacers scored just two more points and missed their last two attempts from the floor. Tracy McGrady scored eight of his game-high 29 points in the game's final five minutes to help secure the win for Orlando. Brad Miller led the Pacers with 20 points and Austin Croshere came off the bench to post a double-double with 19 points and a game-high 13 boards.
